Turn Failures Into Success

AT a time when examination results are out, just a word of consolation to those who fret over their failures, may seem appropriate. Some of the greatest men in history, we find, were dunces at school and could not clear the examination hurdle. Many, however, proved to be brilliant men in later life.

Napoleon was No. 42 in order of intelligence in his class, yet not one of the other 41 is known to the world.

Lord Clive was a dunce at school, if not a reprobate. He became the despair of his tutors. He then migrated to India and managed to bring India under the British flag and became the first Governor-General of India.

Sir Isaac Newton was the last boy but one in his class and consistently failed in Geometry. Later, we know, he rose to be the world's greatest Natural Philosopher and Pope paid a fitting tribute when he said

'Nature & Nature's Laws lay hid in night
God said 'Let newton be'
and all was light.'

Shakespeare, who had very poor schooling, knew "little Latin and less Greek". Having got involved in a deer-stealing incident, he ran away from his village, seeking refuge in London. And we know what he became later.

Goldsmith, the clumsy, wayward child never took to his books seriously. Walpole used to dub him as an "inspired idiot". Goldsmith however composed small verses and sold them to street beggars for a few coppers. In his later days, he became an outstanding literary genius, who according to Garrick "wrote like an angel."

Swift, one of the greatest writers in English could not pass his examination in the Dublin University. Poet Shelley proved a failure at school. Etonians of his day took delight in pelting him with mud. He was nicknamed "mad Shelley" and was later expelled from Oxford and became a problem to his parents.

Scott was of a mediocre

type that his teacher in an angry moment remarked 'Dunce he was and dunce he would remain' yet, we know, Scott's literary works were the product of an imaginative mind.

Sheridan was dismissed from school by his teachers as an incorrigible dunce. In later years, Fox referring to this Sheridan's oratory has said "Eloquent indeed it was, so much so that all he had ever heard, all he had ever read, dwindled into nothing and vanished like vapour before the sun."

George Eliot, in spite of the predictions of her teacher that "she would not only be a very dull woman but fitted only for the cruder forms of house-work" became one of the finest writers in her days.

Emerson who was very poor in Mathematics, like many other literary men, had moments of absent-mindedness. Speaking at the funeral of Longfellow, his life-long friend, Emerson delivered a moving funeral oration and ended, "The Gentleman whom we have been burying was an excellent man—I forget, I forget his name."

James Watt, the inventor of the steam Engine proved to be the butt of his class. His indolence worried his parents. Once his old aunt reproved him. "James" said the worthy dame "I never saw such an idle boy as you are.....for the last hour you have not spoken one word, but taken the lid of that kettle and put it on again, holding now a cup, then a spoon over the steam and merely watching how it rises from the spout catching and counting the drops that fall into them." Little did the old lady then know, that the foundations of the Steam-Engine were being laid in that silly experiment.

Thomas Alva Edison, the Wizard, was always at the foot of his class. His teachers treated him as "addled" and doctors thought he would go in for brain trouble. Once he is said to have forgotten even his own name. Later he developed such a remarkable memory for scientific data

Einstein was also reputed to be a dunce at school. Today he is an outstanding intellectual giant. His theory of Relativity is, it is said, understood by only 12 people in the world although 900 books have been produced to explain it.

And in what direction might mankind turn its faltering footsteps and look for light and hope even under the most exacting conditions? In the words of J. T. Sunderland:

'There is no direction but one; in all the world's ten thousand years of search for help in her experiences of mightiest need, no at all adequate resource but one has ever been discovered. What is that? I need tell no one of you who has observed, no one of you who has read history, no one of you who has a human heart

Men do not sufficiently realize that their future is in their own hands. Theirs is the task of determining first of all whether they want to go on living or not. Theirs the responsibility, then, for deciding if they want merely to live or intend to
