Then he requested God Siva that he should grant that all people who take the bath in the tank should be similarly cured Many illustrious persons like Brahma, Undothara, Dharmaputhea and Karkotaka obtained cures by bathing here. Since the disease of Indra was cured by worshipping the God, the God is called Vaitnesswara or Vaithyanatoa.

Vaitheeswaran K il. This temple is situated in Shirgali taluq in Fanjore district. This place is supposed to cure all diseases especially. mental and skin diseases. The name of the Lord tself is Vaithees vara i. e. Lord tor cures. There is a place called jatayu-kundam in this temple, the ashes of which are said to cure all skin diseases.
