glass of beer, wine and spirits at any time you like-is accepted because on the whole it benefits society. Totalitarian States do not trouble about this kind of restriction. On the other hand, while in any country bad farming must be corrected, if need be, by compulsion, in totalitarian countries the individual is driven into collective farms.

Above all things, the individual must resist every attempt of the State to fetter or discipline or regulate his mind. He must be free, so long as he refrains from grossly offensive forms of expression, to say what he likes to write what he likes, to read what he likes, to listen to other people saying what they like. The worst feature of totalitarian States is their denial of these freedom. The Press is not merely muzzled: that would be bad enough; it is dragooned. It is told what it must say, and the paper that rebels is suppressed.
