This strange development in the educational affairs of this country may have been due to continued foreign domination. But now that alien shackles have been removed and Sri Lanka is again on its own legs, the educational denominational demands should be examined and reorganised to enable all religious establishments to cater for their children in their way of imparting instruction. To make such a re arrangement possible it needs no super human effort. It is the elementary principle of civic consciousness that freedom of faith should not be tampered with even indirectly. Hence it is a matter for all religious denominations in this Island to make a concerted effort to impress on the Government the need for re-adjustment in the educational arrangements, in order that except in State Schools the students may attend schools of their denomination. In this con nection it must be accepted that there is another incongruous situation in the matter of training schools. For a proper spiritual background to be provided for the educational development of this country it is imperative that there should be deno minational training schools sufficient to meet the requirements of ordinary schools. But the present position in this Island is entirely unsatisfactory.
