COMMUNISM CANNOT BE FOUGHT BY MERE SLOGANS

PREMIER'S SPEECH AT NEW YORK DINNER

The following is the full text of the address of Prime Minister Sir John Kotelawala at the dinner given in his honour by Mr. Robert Wagner, Mayor of the City of New York, on December 1.

"I am deeply appreciative of your kindness in having honored me tonight, despite the sudden change of my program which caused me to arrive in your great city almost three days later than I had intended to.

"The City of New York is not merely the gateway of America but holds a unique position in the industrial and commercial life of the world. Your markets influence ours, and your price fluctuations have a deep significance on the day-to-day trends of business in all parts of the world.

"The United Nations, which has its center here, provides a ray of hope for a world long embittered by the struggle for supremacy which is the inevitable result of the emergence of power blocs. Your city has, therefore, become a shining light in the world of international, business and industrial relations.

"My satisfaction, therefore, in being here with you tonight is not merely something which comes to me as the Prime Minister of Ceylon when he sets foot on the soil of your country. It gives me obvious pleasure to be able on this occasion to introduce Ceylon to your great industrialists and others who can substantially assist in our industrial development for which purpose we invite technical skill, and the financial and industrial resources of the world, according to the tenets of our own industrial policy,

"I would like you to

appreciate that we in Ceylon, in common with the people of other Asian lands which have recently become independent and sovereign countries, have a vast task ahead of us to combat poverty, landlessness and unemployment. The shortcomings I have referred to are providing in our countries the best breeding ground for the doctrine of Communism. In Ceylon and throughout Asia, I have raised my voice against Communism and its activities. Communism cannot, however, be fought by mere slogans. People have to be provided the wherewithall for a decent living, which in the context of Asian economy, can be provided by the two-fold means of fair prices for raw materials, and the policy of aid to under developed countries, provided it is in keeping with the self-respect and national policies of the independent nations that are to receive them.

"I expect on this visit to address the rubber manufacturers of your country on the problem of Asian rubber. I shall, therefore, reserve my remarks on this very important question for that occasion.

"The gathering here tonight is so fully representative of the vast interests that are concentrated in your country, that I must ask you to address your minds to the problems of Ceylon, which are a fair sample of the general problems of Asia. Our country, though small in size, occupies a position of vital strategy in Asia. We have too many problems on our

hands at home to have the desire or the inclination to be involved in other peoples' troubles. That is why we welcome external aid, but the welcome we give to such aid is a welcome of someone who is master of his house. That is the only manner in which we can ensure that the freedom and dignity of man which you understand so well as a result of democracy having flourished for generations in your land, can be maintained in Asia where Democracy is young. In fact, that is the one means of ensuring that Democracy will continue to flourish, and communism fail to find a platform in our part of the world.

"I must also address a few brief remarks here to the industrialists of America, for indeed there could be no better occasion than this for me to do so. When I opened the 10th session of ECAFE in Ceylon, I referred to the welcome Ceylon would give to foreign capital and enterprise so long as no political strings are attached. I repeat that invitation to you on this occasion. We shall freely permit remittance abroad of all profits and dividends realized on such capital, and place no impediment on the repatriation of the original capital and any appreciation which might have accrued thereto. We will not discriminate against foreign capital and shall be glad to discuss measures of fair production of industrial and other developmental projects that are to be established. Various measures of taxation relief already exist, while others are under active consideration. We recognize the importance of permitting foreign investors to have such foreign staff as are required for the effective control and management by them of their investments in Ceylon. We, of course, expect the training of Ceylonese to commence from the very start.

"This is only a brief statement on our indus-

THE HIGHWAY TO PEACE AND HAPPINESS

LORD Parameshwara continued: O Mother Divine! The idea "I am the body" and the resultant ego-sense spring from the wrong identification of oneself with the various Tatwas of the body, and of the world of senses, mind etc. But the Reality is Abhinna-whole and undivided. It is the Paripurna Jnana, Perfect Knowledge, which shines by itself as the pure, all-pervading Chit, that is quite distinct from all that is seen or known by the senses, mind or intellect.

Listen, my beloved Sati; The aforesaid Vastu or Substance exists as the One Formless Being, within and without, as the all-pervading Akasa or ether. Ah, the wonder of wonders: Those who merge themselves in that blissful Being, become its very Swarupa.

Just as a flame dies when there is no fuel, so also the mind dies when it has no object for its support or attachment. It becomes then desireless and peaceful.

Know that the several mental states of Moha or delusion, stupor, swooning, dreaming, and also the waking state are different from one another. These belong to the dark state of Ignorance, of Sushupti or deep sleep, which is also called Pralaya (deluge). All these states have to be transcended.

Know that the Chit is different from, and exists apart from, the subtle categories such as Prana, Chitta, Buddhi and the ego-sense or Jiva-bhava. He who meditates thus verily becomes the pure Chit alone.

The mind suffers misery because of ignorance, sleep and various thoughts which breed Aviveka or indiscrimination. Remaining alert and awakened, convince

your mind that it is most beneficial for it to remain in its own centre. By such eternal awareness and renunciation of all other thoughts, merge the mind in the ultimate source of its own Swarupa.

When the mind has become steady, it should not be made restless or disturbed for any reason whatever. Let it not think of anything else. Make it rest firmly in its own Source-the Atma.

Without allowing the mind to externalise itself and go towards the objects of the senses, keep it always in its own natural abode or centre-the heart. Do not allow it to get attached to external objects. Keep it steady, free from any oscillation.

All the material elements ultimately dissolve of their own accord. But know that the Swarupa-Jnana, like the all-pervading ether, is ever free from all blemish or taint of any elements. Meditate always on this.

The object of human birth and the study of all Scriptures is to discipline the mind which is restless like the wind. Meditate and practise that Sadhana by which the mind is ever kept steady.

For those who follow this direct path of Jnana, Dharana or concentration of the mind on the Shad-adharas (six Yogic centres in the body) anywhere, in the middle, below or above, is not necessary. Keep the mind always within, in its own Source, free from all thoughts and attachments.

HOW TO CHOOSE THE MAYOR?

The Jaffna Municipal Council Elections are over; even the shouting has subsided. But the scramble for personal power has begun.

It is human tendency for every member to aspire for the mayoralty. But human conscience will indicate in its own silent but sure way that it is not all who can efficiently guide the destinies of a Municipal Council. Hence the need for the subjugation of the ordinary human feeling to the superior human conscience in affairs that pertain to the welfare of the people.

The members returned to the Municipal Council at the elections held last week form a team of a good blend of old campaigners and new-comers belonging to various professions. The fact that as many as four sitting members were defeated at the polls indicates that the voters do not want their affairs to be entrusted to the same leader for all time. Candidates who had failed to win the support of the voters have succeeded in their persistent endeavours to represent their wards. This is another indication of the vigilance of the voters and their careful consideration of all aspects of democratic conception. In these circumstances the duty of choosing the Mayor cannot remain a task of stupendous exertion or effort.

DEATH OF SHRI R. KRISHNAMOORTHY

Well Known Journalist and Author

We regret to record the untimely death of Shri R. Krishnamoorthy, Editor of 'Kalki'. 'Kalki' as he was popularly known, Shri Krishnamoorthy was ailing for some time before he succumbed to a heart attack on December 5, at his residence in Adayar, Madras.

'Kalki' became a household word in the Tamil Journalist world from the time he was associated with *Ananda Vikatan*, a weekly magazine. Later Shri Krishnamoorthy established the 'Kalki' another weekly magazine and devoted his time and energy to the development of Tamil Journalism.

'Kalki' was a novelist of rare ability. He was also actively associated with the inauguration of the *Tamil Vila*.

Shri Krishnamoorthy counted several distinguished leaders among his numerous admirers one of whom is Shri C. Raiagopalachariar.

that he not merely possesses the capacity for work and capabilities but has supreme regard for integrity and honesty. The unanimous choice of one member as Mayor cannot mean that the remaining City Fathers do not possess the necessary requirements. But on the other hand it will show that fourteen members have thought alike in a matter of paramount importance to the well-being of the voters and that the existence of a large measure of common understanding will certainly auger well for a body that is entrusted with the great responsibility of managing the affairs of a big city. Let us, therefore, hope that the newly elected members will create a worthy precedent by eliminating the enthusiasm for personal glory and persuading themselves to arrive at a unanimous decision. If this healthy development in municipal affairs cannot be secured then the danger of a Mayor's party rearing its head to function in all matters will be there and personal rivalry and petty misunderstandings will tend to mark even routine work in the council with the result that the progress of the city will be seriously hampered. Let it not be so.

Railway Concession To Students

The concessions allowed by the Ceylon Government Railways to students travelling by third class is one and one fourth (1¼) single fare for double journey for a batch of ten (10) or more students, the tickets being valid for thirty days from the date of issue. The concession allowed for students by the Indian Railways is half-fare for single journey for a batch of four or more students. Shri Bhaskaran, President of the Union of Ceylon Students in India, has appealed to the General Manager of Ceylon Railways that the same concessions are allowed by the Indian Railways he granted by the C. G. R. to Ceylon Students in India.

Mr. Shri Bhaskaran summed up his contention thus: Ceylon students in India are under sixteen Indian Universities scattered all over India and therefore it is not always possible to find ten students to form a party to avail themselves of the concession. Besides the number of ten students will be too much for a company for long distance travel and this problem arises in case of students in North India who take five days to travel by train to Ceylon. Therefore we feel that the number be reduced to four as in India.

"We don't go to Ceylon for holidays that are less than a month in duration and so we cannot avail ourselves of this concession allowed by Ceylon Railways. Besides it is not always so that students always travel by train. They may have one trip by train and the other by plane. Therefore we will be at a great loss if we pay 1¼ fare for the double journey and if we don't return by train. Again if the students make the last trip by train they cannot enjoy the concessions.

"We enjoy the Indian Railways concession up to Talaimannar and beyond it, for travel in our homeland, we pay full fare. We appreciate the Ceylon Railways allowing this concession to the resident students for travel in Cey-

Ramdas has long since ceased to feel his existence as a separate individual. He has got that beautiful habit of always referring to himself in the third person. To the discerning eye, this is a fact of very deep significance. The little personal wave has lost itself in the vast Impersonal Ocean. As such, for him there can be no "I". To him the corporeal entity is just 'Ramdas'. His blissful unruffled life is now one of established consciousness of an absolute identity with

the Universal Supreme Self. Beholding such Saints, hearing about them, reading their lives, thinking of their lives and actions, all these fire your spirit with the aspiration to attain a similar state of Sainthood. It makes you want to emulate to the best of your ability, the elevating and inspiring example that their lives set before you. This is the glory of Saints like Ramdas. He is a beacon Light of Blissful Radiance.

sleep, rouse the mind and keep it alert. When it is disturbed by any thoughts or Sankalpas, discard them at once. Then remain in the Supreme Awareness which is free from both sleep and restlessness.

The consciousness that one is the Chit alone, bereft of any other support, ever pure, free from the blemish of any attachments, is called the desireless state of the mind. It is the mark of Jneya-Mukti.

Removing all supports, merge the mind in your heart and keep it steady there. While doing so, Knowledge or Awareness manifests there predominantly. Stick to that knowledge until it fructifies fully.

Know that those who meditate on the Shunya Void and remain steady in that practice will attain the glorious and birthless state of Mukti.

The bondage of Samsara springs from worship of Devas and Devis, commission of sinful and virtuous Karmas, enjoyment of their consequent fruits, and all objects which appear as supports to the Vishaya-Jnana relating thereto.

Know that all Asrayas or supports are dualities. When all dualities such as pain and joy, darkness and light, are renounced, one realises the Param-Vastu. He becomes a Mahayogi free from all bondage and attachments even while remaining in the body. When he finally shuffles off the mortal coil, he becomes a Videha-mukta.

Know, O Mother! that the wise do not renounce the body due to disgust or dispassion. When, however, the force of Prarabdha, which has caused the birth of the body, exhausts itself, the burden of the body is automatically removed.

21. I know (realize) Him, the Undecaying and Ancient (God) who pervades all souls and transcends everything—Him whom God-knowers (Brahma-Vadics) describe as the Destroyer of births. (whom God-knowers) describe as the Eternal.
