Sixth Adhyayam (Contd.)

As we did in the case of the word 'Nirguna', we have introduced the word 'material' and explained the word 'Nishkala' as having no material hodies. God's body is made up of Divine stuff. Thus we read in our Tamil Shastras:

Where will the Agamas be? Where the six forms of religion? Where will the Yogas be? And where true knowledge? (Thy will all be non-existent if God did not bestow Grace on us with the Lady His Half of Grace. None can fathom His Immeasurable Form.

20. When man is able to role up the sky and wear it as leather (cloth), then will misery end without knowing (worshipping and realizing) Sivam, [Both are impossible].

This is the crowning Mantiram with which the teachings of our Upanishad come to an end. It is couched in the most plain-spoken language, and the less we comment on it the better. We contest ourselves with quoting a parallel verse from the Tamil based on this Mantiram. In our Kanda Puranam (Upadesa Kandam) we read;

To say that the multitudinous souls would get rid of their ills and attain salvation without knowing Parama Sivan is something like saying that one can peal the skin of the formless sky and wear it as cloth. So says the great Vedam. What other evidence is there (required to be produced)?

There are three more verses in our Upanishad. But they are of the nature of a postscript or epilogue. The first two of these give the name of the Risk in whose clan the Upanishad was harded down to posterity and taken the qualifications and disqualifications of those to whom it should not be taught. They read as follows:
