### A STUDY OF

## THE SYETASVATARA UPANISHAD

(By A Science Graduate)

(Continued from our issue of 1-7-55)

Sixth Adhyayam (Contd.)

It is this Siroviratam of the Mundaka Sruti that is referred to as Attyasramam in our present Upanishad and in the Kaivalya Upanishad and elsewhere. The "Godly Secret" for Swe, is said to speak of it as the Chelliah Gnanasundram of Treasure of the Atharva Siras, where it is called Pasupata Vratham and de-cribed as follows:

Root out all desire. Weigh well with your dis criminative faculty (Buddhi) the root cause of all bondage. Fix your mind on the Lord Rudran. Identify yourself with Him. Grasp Him by means of Tapas,-Him who is the Ancient One, the eternal, the Giver of food and strength. Take the sacred ash (in the hand) and consecrate it by the Mantiram "Agni is Bhasmam (Fire is ash). Vayu is Bhasmam, Water is Bhasmam, Earth is Bhasmam, Akas is Bhasmam, all this is Bhasmam". (Then) besmear yourself with it all over the body, touching the various limbs thereof. This is the Pasupata Vratam prescribed for releasing the souls from their bondage. (V. 71 to 74).
