## FAITH, REASON AND RESEARCH

Some good men have failed to understand Einstein's mind in regard to religion. Einstein claimed that he was 'a deeply religious-minded man' but in the opinion of some religious-minded men his statements on the subject belie this claim of his. This criticism is not just.

Einstein was a deeply religious man. But he deprecated vain investigations and quackeries. 'I am satisfied', said he, 'with the mystery of the eternity of life and with the awareness and a glimpse of the marvellous structure of the existing world, together with the devoted striving to comprehend a

portion, be it ever so tiny, of the Reason that manifests itself in Nature.' This statement of his is enough to clear any doubts as to truly religious attitude.

We should not draw an adverse inference from the fact that the great philosopher and mathematician did not attach importance to the survival of personality after physical death, which thought is according to him mere wishful thinking, and a sign of feebleness and fear or absurd egoism. 'To enquire after the meaning or object of one's own existence or that of all creatures', says Einstein, 'has always seemed to me absurd from an objective point of view'. There is deep philosophy in this iron curtain that Einstein recommends for adoption; not only philosophy, but deep religion. There is no contradiction in it as some superficial critics have imagined.

The Vedantic conception of the Leela of God is just what Einstein refers to. We cannot explore into the Leela of God. We must accept it. Apart from the logic of the philosopher, there is wisdom in this pronouncement. Our

intelligent young men and women are not all as great as Sankara or Einstein. Their brains cannot bear the strain of exploration into the meaning or object of one's own existence or that of all living creatures. The danger of the strain is greater in the case of really earnest and intelligent boys and girls than in that of dull people; for the strain is self-induced and therefore the more earnest and intelligent one is, the greater the strain.

If men wish to explore the mystery of the universe, they should do so with the life-belt of Faith. Without Faith, it is not for lesser men to enter the sea which even Einstein looks upon as difficult. With Faith, the mystery is an uplifting element, without Faith self-confident intelligence leads to mental derangement. This is the reason why we have many cases of B.Sc.'s and Ph.D.'s going into mental hospitals. The safety belt of Faith is very necessary for ordinary people when they wish to go out voyaging in the waters of the origin and purpose of life and the meaning of the universe. These are things absolutely barred from human solution on the basis of Reason and without Faith.

Control of mind makes a direct appeal to thought-persons. Many attempt it in their own ways up to a certain stage. Then somehow their interest fades away. This may be because the method followed is dry and monotonous. Perhaps the exercises failed to tap and co-ordinate the tremendous energies which can be increasingly expressed through art, literature, hobbies or social service. Whatever may be the causes, the loss of interest is a fact. It can, however, be prevented. Nay, the interest can be progressively deepened by a little resourcefulness. For example, the aspirants can arrange to 'meet' informally as often as

At a banquet given at Delhi Rashtrapati Bhavan in honour of the Prime Minister, Mr. Nehru, the President Dr. Rajendra Prasad conferred the award of Bharat Ratna on the Prime Minister for his 'heroic endeavour in the cause of peace for mankind'.

I have been wondering how the people of this country can express their gratitude to him in a concrete form so that all might see how the entire nation is behind him in this great endeavour. His life-long services to our nation are written in letters of gold in every page of our recent history and this the latest phase in his great career as a heroic endeavour in the cause of peace for

mankind has served to embellish gold or as our proverb says, added more beauty and charm to it by giving it a sweet scent I have felt that I can do no better than conferring on him the award of Bharat Ratna which is the highest award of honour that we have. In doing so, for once, I may be said to be acting unconstitutionally as I am taking this step on my own initiative and without any recommendation or advice from my Prime Minister; but I know that my action will be endorsed most enthusiastically not only by my Cabinet and other Ministers but by the country as a whole.

I would request you all to join me in wishing him many happy years of health and vigour so that he may serve more his country and world at large.

### THE LATE PANDIT V. T. SAMBANDHAN

Tamilakam has sustained an irreparable loss in the sudden passing away of Pandit V. T. Sambandhan, former Editor of the *Inthusathanam* and retired teacher of the Jaffna Hindu College. The Pandit held the unique record of having sub-edited the *Inthusathanam* for eight years and edited it for more than three decades. On his relinquishing his editorial duties in December 1951, the Pandit continued to be in charge of the publication of books for the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabha, a work that was entrusted to him when he became associated with the *Inthusathanam*.

The Pandit has left behind a remarkable record of service—an achievement of which Tamilakam should be proud. Versatility was the keynote of this veteran journalist who while maintaining the glorious tradition of the Great Navalai created afresh a pleasing style of prose-writing.

Easy and elegant, the writings of the Pandit have always commanded the respect of both learned scholars and common readers. Tamil in his conception was *Santhamil*. Gracefulness and grammatical precision, fertility of thought and a fountain flow of words went into a captivating combination that created what is popularly known as the 'Sambandhan style'. The enlivening touch of entertaining humour that was a feature of the numerous short stories and dramatic dialogues that were written by the Pan-

dit was of the classical order. 'Ulakam Palayitham', a series of stories in lighter vein, gained literary recognition because of the fact that behind the highlight of choicest humour ran a continuous current of instructive ideas. As a playwright, the Pandit enhanced the reputation of the Jaffna Saraswathi Vilasa Sabbai.

Text-book writing was another branch in which the Pandit exhibited his talents. The Sabha publications have been more or less a one man production, a performance for which the Saiva public should never fail to be grateful to the Pandit.

An embodiment of Saiva culture, Pandit Sambandhan devoted himself up to the time of his sudden death on Wednesday to the responsible duty of propagating religious activities according to the well-established Navalai tradition. Exposition of paranic truths at padanam in temples and madams was another contribution made by the Pandit to the cause of Saiva propaganda.

We extremely regret to record the end of a scholar whose career in the cause of his religion and language had been both remarkable and useful. The Saiva public will certainly remember with feelings of pride and gratitude the departed Pandit. May Ishwara bless him.

### Visiting Professor in Geography - Geology

One of the foremost geographers of Southeast Asia, Dr. Karthigesapillai Kularatnam of the University of Ceylon, will offer "Regional Geography of Southern Asia" and "National and International Problems of South-east Asia" in the first summer term at the College of Liberal Arts in Australia. # PANDIT V. T. SAMBANDHAN PASSES AWAY

## JOURNALIST, TEACHER, AUTHOR AND PLAYWRIGHT

PANDIT V. T. SAMBANDHAN, former Editor of the "Inthusathanam" and Editor of the Saiva Paripalana Sabha Text Book publications, passed away peacefully at 7 a. m. on Wednesday July 20. The end was sudden and swift. The

Pandit was performing his morning prayers when he collapsed. The previous night he delivered a lecture at the Vannar-nonnai Sivan Temple.

Pandit Sambandhan was the eldest son of Pulavar M. K. Vetpillai of Madduvil, Author of *Ilamandala Chathakam* and commentator of *Thiruvathaurar Puranam*. His brother Pandit

Mahalingasivam, lecturer at the Government Tamil Training College Kopy, predeceased him. Proctor V. Manickavasagar, J. P., Mr. V. Kandasamy, Retired Teacher and Mr. V. Nadarajah, B. Sc., Karainagar Hindu College are his younger brothers. He has left behind him his wife, and Mr. Sanmugasundaram of the Marketing Department Kandy, and Mr. Vairavasundaram of the Radidrtones Jaffna, (sons), Mrs. Maheswari Sanmugasatnam, teacher Puloly Saiva Palika Vidyasalai, Miss. Manomany, B. A. of the Jaffna Hindu Ladies' College and Miss Rajeswary of the Holy Cross College Trichinopoly (daughter). Saiva Siddhanta Scholar S. Shivapadasundarampillai was a maternal uncle.

Shri Thirugnanasambandhapillai joined the Jaffna Hindu College as Tamil Pandit in 1913 and relinquished the post in 1946 owing to pressure of work in the *Inthusathanam*. In 1912 he was appointed Assistant Editor of the *Inthusathanam* of which he became the Editor in 1920 and continued to be so up to December 1951. He was in charge of the publication of books for the Sabha for more than 30 years and produced besides the well-known Palapadam and Kathapalapadam series Ayodhyakandam, Manickavachaka Charithiram, Senthamil Manchari, Kala Manchari, commentaries on Tirukkural with English Translation, Pushpavathiraicharukkam and several other works.

The funeral took place on Thursday. The remains were cremated at the Kumbayanmanal crematorium in the presence of a large gathering of friends and relations. Panditbha-Mani S. Kanapathipillai and Mr. M. Mailvaganam, Teacher, Jaffna Hindu College, delivered funeral orations.



as a basis for dealing with the external world in a rough and ready way. But it can be used for finer research, for more penetrating and efficient control and for getting illumination at higher levels. To do this, its parts have to be readjusted, some of its movements 'reversed' and sections not hitherto in use brought into contact and speeded up. It is all a question of careful observation, repeated experiments, an attitude of good humour in the face of failures, a slow and delicate handling to avoid damage to sensitive parts and an unshaken confidence that Nature is never an obstructor, but always a helper. When a religious man speaks of faith he does not put it in opposition to reasoning and experiment. He means by that term this very confidence.

### The All-Ceylon Hindu Federation

A meeting of the Council of the All-Ceylon Hindu Federation was held at the Colombo Hindu College Hall on the 17th instant.

Certain amendments to the constitution of the Federation were discussed and approved for submission to a General Meeting.

A Committee was appointed to study the Hindu Temporalities Bill now under consideration by Parliament and to submit its recommendations to the Council.

The report of the Committee appointed to consider ways and means for establishing a Theological School for Hindu Priests was discussed and the same Committee was authorized to pursue action to implement the proposal. It was also decided that until the establishment of such a school action should be taken to offer two scholarships every year to suitable students for their education in a Theological Institution in South India.

It was also proposed to establish a Hindu Scholarship Fund and a Committee was appointed to pursue the proposal.

The meeting considered the forthcoming Buddha Jayanthi celebrations and it was resolved that the Council was of the opinion that the Hindus of Ceylon should celebrate suitably
