Commonwealth

No Longer A Club But A Cause

Viscount Boyd of Mer ton, chairman of the Royal Commonwealth Society, says in a message issued today for this year's Commonwealth Day-May 24. that the Commonwealth is "no longer a c'ub but a cause !.

Viscount Boyd, former Colonial Secretary, says in his message, Often in the past we, in the Commonwealth, have moken of ourselves as a family.

"We have thought of the relationship between us as family ties-some of them inherited at birth, some of them almost instinctive, some of them slawly maturing growth.

"Now South Africa has gone (also, for quite different and rather special reasons, British Somaliland and the Trust Territory of the Southern Cameroons), and suddenly we see that the Commonwealth is no longer something one is born into, without choice.

"From being a family it has become a faith-a faith we can either accept or reject, develop or neglect. And what we believe it to be, it may well become.

Dr. S. Radhakrishnan was present at a function in which copies of the translation by Mr. V. Kaildae of Shri C. Rajagopalachari's Ramayanam and Mahabaratha
