## Soviet Obsession With Veto

### And Stalemate In The Geneva Talks

The intimation that the the chances of world dis-  
current stalemate in the aster.

Geneva nuclear test talks  
will get special attention  
at the Kennedy Khrush-  
chev Vienna meeting on  
June 3 and 4 focuses  
attention on this con-  
ference, in which no  
progress has been made  
since the resumed session  
began on March 21.

For over two and a half  
years Britain and the  
United States have been  
trying to negotiate here  
with Russia a treaty which  
will ban nuclear weapons  
tests in all environments  
for ever. This would mean  
no more atmospheric pollu-  
tion, no more radioactive  
fallout with its genetic  
dangers, and no further  
experiments in the perfec-  
tion of nuclear destructive  
forces.

It could also mark the  
beginning of a genuine  
move towards controlled  
world disarmament and  
and thus underwrite the  
security of the nations and  
peace of mind for their  
peoples.

If agreement can be  
reached among the three  
Powers on a weapon test  
ban under effective inter-  
national control, then it is  
almost a foregone conclu-  
sion that all other nations  
would adhere to the  
provisions of such a treaty.

The world is coming to  
realise, however, that if  
agreement is not reached  
between the West and  
Russia and the neg-  
otiations, now far advanced  
into their third year,  
continue to drag on, then  
other technically advanced  
countries may well be  
forced to think of their  
own national security in  
this nuclear age.

Some dozen countries  
are believed to be techni-  
cally capable of nuclear  
production and reluctant  
ly but from necessity, if  
not now then over the  
years, they may turn to  
devising their own deter-  
rent. Such a development  
could not fail to increase

Therefore the problem  
is urgent now and the  
longer its solution is  
delayed the more acute  
becomes the danger. The  
obvious question is: "Why  
the delay at Geneva?"

The answer is that time  
and again hope of agree-  
ment on important parts  
of the treaty have been  
held up because of the  
Soviet veto demands  
which would render con-  
trol ineffective. The West  
has spent the best part of  
two years in getting the  
Russians to moderate  
these demands in return  
for substantial Western  
guarantees.

Throughout the negoti-  
ations the Russians have  
been insistent on two  
issues. The first is over  
the control commission,  
the policy-making body  
where they have always  
wanted parity between the  
Communist and Western  
Governments.

Secondly, they have  
wanted the original three  
signatories of the treaty  
to have veto powers over  
everything, even over the  
form of control and in-  
spection. It is largely  
these two Russian de-  
mands which have been  
the subject in one form  
or another of the lengthy  
discussions of the past.

On March 21 this year  
the West made a new  
approach with certain  
concessions whereby a  
number of veto powers  
were agreed, parity with  
the Communists on the  
control commission was  
accepted, and the Russians  
were also met on a number  
of other points.

But on one point the  
West remained adamant.  
It would not concede that  
there should be any veto  
where the question of  
actual control operations  
is concerned, for such a  
veto would nullify the  
effectiveness of the agree-

### ADULT EDUCATION

In his memorandum to the National Education Commission, the Co-ordinating Officer of the Education Department has deplored the lack of progress of the Adult Education movement in this country and has suggested new methods for re-organising this aspect of the educational system. That the country has not been benefitted by the Adult Education movement is obviously true particularly when it is observed that there has been an increase of crime, tragic accidents and suicides.

National Education must naturally and necessarily include in its purview the education that is needed by the adult. In other words the education of the masses is a responsibility of those who plan the National Education of this country. Persons who have come of age but have not had the good fortune of an all-round educational instruction at school must be provided with some facilities for acquiring the minimum understanding of life's problems. This is one aspect of Adult Education.

Where National Education is planned for the first time it becomes absolutely necessary for the Scheme to be basic and broad-based. Such a scheme of education will mould a future generation of adults who will not need any further instruction in the art of living and eliminate the uneducated class.

The progress of a country is gauged by the incidence of crime, poverty

and violent deaths. Any scheme of education that aims to be a national Education must help to produce cultured citizens who can create a nation where there is no crime, no poverty, no violent deaths. It is to be hoped that the National Education Commission will formulate a scheme of Adult Education when planning 'National Education' as a whole.

### Curfew Hours Curtailed

#### Total Lift In Vavuniya

According to an announcement in the House of Representatives by Mr. F. D. Bandaranaike, Minister of Finance and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Defence and External Affairs, the Curfew was lifted in the Vavuniya District from Wednesday May 24.

In the Eastern Province and the Jaffna and Mannar Districts the curfew hours were reduced from 10 hours to 6. The curfew hours according to the announcement are from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m.

ment and make the treaty a sham.

At this stage the Russians took a giant stride backward. In the first few months of the conference they had agreed that under the control commission there would be a single administrator who would be bound to carry out, without obstruction from any outside Power, the orders of the commission.

But on March 21, the very day that the West made their concessions, the Soviet delegate, Mr. Tesrapkin, blandly announced that Russia wanted to introduce a "troika" system. Instead of a single administrator with an impartial international civil service under him, they wanted a three-man council consisting of a representative from the West, a representative of their own, and a neutral.

These council members would not be responsible to the control commission. They would represent the views of their own governments and so, they took would give to be by unanimous agreement.

In other words, the Russians wanted to slip a veto right into the heart of the control system. They wanted the international control machinery to have a built-in national veto affecting every act of control; and this, of course, would mean absolutely no security for anyone.

There are other outstanding differences between East and West which need to be resolved before a treaty can be signed.

There are difficulties

over the meritorious. There is the question of the size of the annual quota of inspections of suspicious underground events which might be either earthquakes or nuclear explosions.

And there are the knotty problems of control posts and inspection teams, with the Russians still wanting what would be virtually a system of self-inspection.

There are problems which can be overcome if only the Russians will demonstrate willingness on their side, a quality which has been noticeably lacking recently, for in the last 100 meetings or more of the conference they have not made a single constructive proposal.

The West, on the other hand, has already put forward on April 18 the completed draft of a treaty. This contains the 17 articles and two annexes already agreed, plus the remaining articles and an annex substantially based on concessions made to the Russians on March 21, which cover outstanding points.

And the West has to Russia that they believe the treaty offers no guarantee to regular Soviet national interest and that they are prepared to sign it "tomorrow."

But the Russian "troika" scheme has introduced the greatest difficulty yet into the conference. If persisted in by the Soviet Union, it would probably nullify all the work of the conference and thus deprive the world of perhaps its one remaining chance to stifle the nuclear menace before it gets out of control.
