LOVE MARRIAGES VERSUS ARRANGED MARRIAGES

(By Muhandiram E. P. Rasiah, J. P.)

Love may be defined as the attraction of two comparative strangers of the opposite sex for each other. The male species form one broken piece and the female species another. And the two are constantly striving to fuse into one, and that is called the urge of love. Marriage could be described as a constructive task and a work of artistic creation on which two people are engaged.

Nowadays, the sanctity underlying marriages seem to be fading off and a matter of fact business-like view seems to prevail, whereby marriage is treated more or less like "a partnership concern between two co-equals. Cynics, however, describe "marriage to be a golden cage—those who are inside wish to get out, and those outside are anxious to rush in."

Love

Love is said to be an alarming and uncontrollable state of the mind which causes those afflicted to be suddenly lifted to the most astonishing heights of happiness, and in many cases, to be dropped with equal suddenness, deep down into the darkest well of despair and degradation. According to Ronald Dahl "yet a mass of young people, all over the world, wish constantly, fervently and desperately to achieve this state, and having achieved it, or believing that they have achieved it, they marry, and having married,

- (a) Some live together happily thereafter,
- (b) Some live together happily for a while and relapse into a state of mutual benign resignation,
- (c) Some live together happily for a while, and unhappily for the rest of their lives,
- (d) & some—and this section constitutes a very

large proportion—live together happily for a while and then separate and divorce and try again."

There are obviously two kinds of love. There is a distinguishable difference between the real kind—the rare one which causes people to marry and live happily ever after.—and the other one, which causes them to marry hastily and then divorce. There is on the surface, no ostensible difference between them. They both produce roughly the same symptoms on the sufferers. In both cases the victims are almost irrational and would swear that their love is the correct type.

The Ideal Love

First let us examine the ideal Love, the rare one, the maker of lasting marriages. The two main ingredients of this type of love appear to be about $\frac{3}{4}$ of profound affection and about $\frac{1}{4}$ of intense sex attraction. This is a rare combination to find in one of the lovers and rarer by far to find in both. As years roll on, the life of the two people passes through inevitably its various phases, moving on to normalcy. Thus, something that was an important ingredient of their original love for each other, slowly begins to disappear; yet, the marriage tie holds fast, because the diminishing and disappearing thing was not the most important part of their love. The major ingredient was affection, profound affection. This cannot diminish with time, nor will it stand still. It can only increase. And thus, slowly but smoothly, the original ingredients begin to alter their proportions. Affection increases and sex attraction decreases, as the latter disappears, the former takes its place, and affection grows en-

Manipay Hindu College Foundation Day

Speaking at the Foundation Day Celebrations of the Manipay Hindu College on Tuesday, the Chief Guest Gate Muddaliyar C. Thiagarajah while tracing the origin and growth of the College described the events leading to the laying of the foundation on the 4th of July 1910 by Sir Joseph Hutchinson in the presence of Mr. W. Sangarapillai himself the President of the founding body. He paid a glowing tribute to the Principal Mr. K. Muthuvetpillai and the staff for the vast progress made by the College in recent years. The co-operation that existed among the staffs and old students and the support given by the parents were worthy of emulation by other schools.

In concluding he said that the greatest danger Ceylon faces today was a social problem which, if not checked, will lead the Country to ruin. I refer particularly to the condition of present day young women who will be future mothers of this country. As an elder he felt it was his duty to offer certain remarks as one interested in the welfare of the country. The remarks were offered with good intentions and he hoped he would not be misunderstood in any way. He said "The present day young women's dress make up etc is something which every one interested in the welfare of Ceylon should co-operate to reform. Look at the way the modern young women dress. This dress is repugnant to our culture in every respect. Lipsticks are being used to polish their lips. How many of our women realise that lipstick is poisonous. It contains iron rust. Why do our women spoil their beautiful lips by making them rusty with lipsticks? Besides what is the necessity for polishing lips? The girls in some schools are compelled to

Promotion Of Tamil Language And Culture

(From the Annual Report of the Colombo Vivekananda Society)

One of the fundamental objects of the Vivekananda Society is the promotion of the Hindu Religion, culture and ideals. As we are aware, another important object of the Society is the promotion of the Tamil Language and culture. The Hindu religion and Tamil language have a close and intimate connection with each other. It has been so for milleniums from the dawn of history. It has been so recorded in our sacred books and we Hindus accept that position with full faith and reverence. The Vivekananda Society has consistently from its inception tried to promote the Tamil language, culture and ideals as a means of subserving Hindu religion, culture and ideals. The position of the Tamil language in the scheme of things in Ceylon at present merits the deepest consideration. The Council of Management appeals to all members of the Society and the general public of Ceylon to render all possible assistance for the promotion and preservation of the Tamil language and its being given an honourable place in the national life of Ceylon, realising the close connection between our religion and language. We would make a special appeal to the Government and Parliament of Ceylon, who represent the State to bring about the much desired consummation. It is inspiring to record that the Tamil language has been the instrument for service not only to the Hindu people but also to the Buddhists, Muslims and Christians to whose religious literature the Tamil language has made a remarkable contribution of permanent value. Some excellent works in Tamil literature relate to Buddhism, Islam and Christianity. It is also inspiring to record that the Hindu religion has always

stood for an all-embracing comprehensiveness and tolerance and the principle of co-existence. One of the other great religions of the world, Buddhism, whose adherents constitute a large majority of the population of Ceylon, is in some respect closely connected with Hinduism. In the ancient polity of Ceylon, Tamil was given an honoured place. In all these circumstance we humbly and fervently trust that there will be a re-thinking about the language problem and that Tamil will be accorded a respected status in our country. We wish, on behalf of the Hindu public, to submit that the Hindu community in Ceylon has collectively and through its leaders like Sri La Sri Arumuga Navalar, Sir Muthukumaraswamy, Sir Ponnambalam Ramanaathan, Dr. Ananda K. Coomaraswamy and Sir Ponnambalam Arunachalam, some of whom have been directly connected with the Vivekananda Society and assisted in its work during their life time, rendered valuable service to the political, cultural, religious and national regeneration of this country.

The importance attached to the Tamil language appears recorded in the Lalitha Vistara, a Sanskrit biography of Lord Buddha, translated into Chinese in the first century of the Christian era, wherein it is stated that the Buddha studied, among other languages, Dravida or Tamil.

It is heartening and instructive to refer to another incident in the life of Buddha who recognised no difference between race and language and treated all human beings alike. On being appealed to by two Brahmin monks that the doctrines be written in Sans-

The other kind, the common kind, intense sex-attraction - affection and respect practically negligible, the wrong one, the harbinger of divorces - this kind causes much mutual happiness, but is temporary. It is bound to be so, for, the foundation of it all is mere sex attraction which, with the passage of time, becomes less intense and ultimately vanishes.

We may, therefore, safely assume that somehow, somewhere, all is not well with this fashionable method of "Love at first sight" which in its accepted romantic sense cannot thrive in Jaffna, particularly because there is no free mixing of the sexes in daily life.

An eminent Judge, who has tried many divorce cases in Colombo is reported to have remarked "These so-called love marriages are failures from what I hear about them almost daily; children should marry with the consent of their parents and with their blessings."
