Importance Of The Study Of Sanscrit

Speaking at a Prize Distribution Function at the Madras Centre of Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan Shri K. M. Munshi appealed to the Government of India to provide more facilities for the study of Sanscrit. He added.

It was unfortunate that after the attainment of freedom Sanskrit study had been receding particularly on account of the neglect of the Governments, Central and States. While efforts were being taken by private agencies to popularise it, as far as the Governments were concerned, they had been entirely indifferent. In this country, we were talking of national disintegration and growth

THREE-PRONGED TAXATION

WHEN the first Budget of the Srimavo Bandaranaike Administration was introduced in 1960 it was discernible what the trend of taxation would be in the following year. The taxes that have been introduced by the Finance Minister this year with a view to bridging the big gap between revenue and expenditure do not, therefore, come as a surprise. The only astonishment is that the method of taxation does not on the face of it reveal what its impact will mean.

The National Development Tax and the Self-employment Tax are two of the instances that will concurrently operate on those who are already taxpayers. What little is left after the requirements of Income Tax allow has to be set aside for the demands under these two new taxes. A category of persons has been denied the privilege of being entitled to subsidised rice merely because persons of that category happen to enjoy the honour of paying income tax. And that is not all. These persons are being called upon to bear in addition the burden of a special tax called the National Development Tax. And these of this category who happen to belong to the dignified

denomination of self-employed persons will have to go one step further and pay a registration tax. And these 'marked' persons along with the rest will have to pay more for their flour, sugar, matches and certain other articles. Every conceivable way of tax-levying has been comprehensively incorporated into the Finance Minister's new system of taxation. All and sundry will be hit and at every turn. With the cost-of-living soaring up, the common man will be equally hit.

In the stupendous task of making both ends of the Budget meet, the people have been compelled to make sacrifices beyond their capacity. The time has arrived for a realistic approach to be made to the problem of budgeting. A careful curb on expenditure is as necessary as a search for new sources of revenue. We are confident that during the debate on the Second Reading of the Budget it will be made sufficiently clear to the Finance Minister that his proposals require reconsideration.

Successful Operation

Mr. S. J. V. Chelvanayagam M. P. underwent a successful surgical operation at the Edinburgh Hospital on August 1. It is understood that it will take about two months for him to attend to his work.

Case Against Mr. K. M. P. Rajaratna

As Mr. K. M. P. Rajaratna was not present in the Badulla District Court yesterday the date fixed for his attendance, the District Judge has ordered that the I. G. P. should produce or cause to be produced Mr. Rajaratna on August 23.

Eight others who were accused in this case were according to the judgment sent to jail for a term of one and a half years.

PRESIDENT PRASAD RETURNS TO RASHTRAPATHI BHAVAN

Dr. Rajendra Prasad, the President of the Union of India who was seriously ill during the third week of July 1961 has fully recovered from his illness. He returned to Rashtrapathi Bhavan on Tuesday last. Large crowds of people who lined up along the streets leading to the President's residence cheered Dr. Prasad.

KATARAGAMA (KATHIRKAMAM)

Sir,
In a contribution to the Ceylon Daily News of 13-7-61 entitled 'Kataragama Festival Opens' one Mr. D. S. A. Gunaratne, appears to have unearthed new Sinhalese traditions to connect Kataragama (Kathirgamam) with Buddhism and the Sinhalese people.

A comprehensive account of the shrine and the traditions associated with it is found in Vol. I, No. 7—July 1931, of the Ceylon Literary Registrar—an article contributed by Mudaliyar H. E. Amerasekere, M. R. A. S.

It will be noticed that all the deities associated with the shrine are of Tamil origin. Kumara or Kumaran, (கும்பகர்) i. e. the son of Siva known as Murugan, and Valliammah and Theivanai. There was another temple built for the Kataragama deity by Dappula Swanu referred to in the Mahavamsa as Kadiroli Vihara. In pre-Buddhistic times the entire South Western portion of Ceylon known as Ruhuna seems to have been dedicated to Siva. In Ptolemy's map the area is referred to as 'Sacred to the Moon, a literal translation of 'He who wears the Moon on his crown' i. e. Siva. The Vaipava Malai refers to the deity at Dondra Temple as 'Sandrasekarar' (சந்திரசேகரர்) Kadir-oli and Kathir gama are both from the same Tamil root Kathir (கதிர்) meaning 'the rays of the Sun' while 'oli' is light and is the same as the Sinhalese 'Eli'. Gama is the Tamil Kamam (காமம்) i. e. village.

Siva and Muruga have always been associated with the Sun and its light. There is a vast volume of literature in Tamil associated with the worship of the Kataragama deity i. e. Murugan, dating back to the Sangam Age, and evidences of his worship in the Tamil country anterior to this period are supported by Archaeology. All Murugan's shrines are found South of the Vindhyas and none in North India.

Those not familiar with Tamil could refer to the chapter on 'Kataragam' by Sir P. Arunachalam in his 'Studies and Translations'. Rajanayagam Mudaliyar's Brochure on Kathirgamam, is another scholarly contribution. I am not aware of any early

Pali or Sinhalese poem or song composed in honour of the Kataragama Deity.

Therefore, unless the popular opinion asserted itself, there was no hope of the Govt. doing anything in the nature of help to us to retain the unifying force we had in Sanskrit.

The very fact that a private agency like the Vidya Bhavan was able to make rapid strides showed that there was "hunger" for the study of the language or the moral fibre of the nation was being destroyed by various negative pressures which counteracted the positive moral pressure in the society. Firstly, the large amount of money pumped into the economy had broken the tradition of honesty and austerity among the people. Secondly, there was the cinema which seemed to specialise in crime and sex. It was necessary to arrest the moral decay. It was for those who believed in the moral values of truth, love and beauty in *sathya* and *dharma* to do whatever they could by dedicating themselves to the moral uplift of the people.
