## Complete Unification For Preserving Human Race

### Dr. Radhakrishnan's Views

Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Vice President of India who was awarded this year's Peace Prize by the Association of West German Book Traders made the following observations at the function held at Frankfurt.

"The rapid unification of the world that is now taking place through modern methods of transport and communications is the most effective and far-reaching known to us so far.

Leaders of civilisations and prophets of religion dreamed of a single world, but their ideal was not capable of accomplishment in their days.

the human race are in contact with one another. If we are to live in peace, we cannot stop short of complete unification.

The matter has become urgent since we are making military weapons of nuclear power. Any nuclear war can only result in a wild orgy of destruction. We have to choose between the two alternatives of destroying ourselves or

## TREES A NATIONAL TREASURE

The economic development of a country depended on its natural resources and trees formed an important part of a nation's wealth, said Gate Mudaliyar C. Thiagarajah, President of the Rural Development Union, in inaugurating the Tree Planting Campaign for Valikamam West in Chankanai on Friday. Continuing he said "besides supplying us with food and fruit the wood is turned into many useful articles. In countries like Canada the entire economy depends on her wealth in trees. In Burma the income from trees is an important factor to be reckoned. India has started a tree planting campaign systematically and with success. In Ceylon instead of conserving our tree resources, we are chopping them down thinking that trees have only a nuisance value. Ceylon will be a dry desert only fit for camels in time to come if we do not stop the massacre of our trees. Trees have an effect on climatic and physical conditions. Cutting down of trees indiscriminately causes erosion of the soil and therefore lowers fertility of land, and this in

turn affects the productivity of crops. Ceylon is losing fertility of the soil by cutting down her trees. Ceylon's climate had changed a lot and this is due to the clearing of our jungles for colonisation purposes. Trees have an aesthetic value. The general environment affects our body and mind and therefore having trees around is greatly desired. We should really start botanical gardens on a regional basis and preserve the rich flora of our country. Trees are also valuable for health reasons. Certain trees if planted near dwelling places are considered very good for health. Again there is a wealth of trees and plants of medicinal value. Ceylon which can be self-sufficient in many ayurvedic medicines, imports large amounts from other countries. A national medicinal herbarium must be set up to cater to the needs of the local physicians. Therefore from every point of view trees are very important. To the extent we grow trees to that degree we will progress."

## Moksha Rani—Queen of Heaven

Every human being has to achieve Dharma, Artha and Kama in the world and Moksha in the world to come. For this purpose the Vedas, Agamas, Itihisas and Puranas have been bequeathed to us by the master-minds of Rishis of ancient India. Lord Buddha himself a master mind had interpreted the eternal religion (Sanatana Dharma) which the ancient Aryans of India had preserved as their own and made known to all irrespective of caste, colour or creed thus making it of universal application. For this he had established the Sanga to do missionary work for the good of the many and for the happiness of the many. But the contents of the Upanishads remained a closed book for centuries till the advent of Sri Ramakrishna and his disciple Vivekananda preached practical Vedanta to all. Indeed in the history of vedantic thought Vyasa, Sankara and Vivekananda are epoch making names. Sri Ramakrishna's approach for liberation or moksha is the ancient one of worshipping God as the Divine Mother, who as Uma, Parwathi, Parameswari, Saraswathi, Lakshmi, Durga, Kali etc. is but the manifestation of Parasakthi. Siva and Sakthi being inseparable worship of one is also worship of the other, Siva possessing Sakti is saktiman.

Moksha can be conferred by one who is above all impurities (mala) being not affected by likes and dislikes (Raga and dwesha) yet full of mercy Karuna for the souls being Lord of souls (Pasupati). By virtue of His Chit Sakthi He is aware of everything that happens in the three worlds and is bliss personified. Siva is Sat and Sakti is Chit and between them they give us Anandam which can be had after moksha or liberation. This is done

by Uma or Parasathi our Jeganmatha or Queen of Heaven. By meditation and worship (upasana) we gain the divine contact which makes us fit for the kingdom of God or moksha that confers liberation from samsara.

Uma is our divine mother. Among mantras she is AUM. Among mountains she is Himalaya among virtues she is Truth made manifest on earth as Parwathi, the spouse of Parameswara. This theme has inspired many a saint to pursue the path of perfection leading to moksha. Lord Shiva gave Darsan to the devas as Uma Maheswara and taught them the secret of Heaven through love and the divine way of life. Uma was born as the daughter of Dakshaprajapathi and was married to Shiva but in the end Daksha showed disrespect to Shiva at which his daughter Dakshayini wished to obliterate that name. Hence she died and was born as the daughter of Himavati or Parwathi on earth. Parwathi when she grew up did tapas to attain Shiva. When she grew up to be a maiden Shiva appeared as an old Brahmin and dissuaded her from her penance describing Shiva in most uncomplimentary terms. This made her angry and she declared she would not give up her sole aim in life of having Shiva as her Lord master and spouse. Later He showed her who He was and promised to make her His spouse on Palkun Uthiram day. In this holy wedding Kama, lust had no place as explained by the burning of Kama, nor did beauty of physical form of Kama determine the issue. It was only holy love of true devotion that brought about this sacred union of Parwathi with Parameshwaran. For Parwathi, her body mind and soul were surrendered to Shiva unconditionally and truly. ### U. N. — A LIVING ORGANISATION?

THE seventeenth anniversary of the United Nations Organisation, in view of the serious deterioration in the general political situation of the world, must necessarily compel the member States, now one hundred and one, to answer the challenge with which the august Assembly is faced. President Truman who opened the historic Conference in 1945 in San Francisco described the significance and scope of the U. N. Charter in the following words. "The Charter is a declaration of great faith by the nations of the earth-faith that war is not inevitable, faith that peace can be maintained. If we had had this Charter a few years ago-and above all the will to use it-millions now dead would be alive. If we should falter in the future in our will to use it, millions now living will surely die." How true these sentiments are in the context of the present situation where the threat of imminent war and the fear of wholesale destruction of mankind can be seen. That there has been a faltering in the will to use the Charter no one can deny, least of all the Big Powers who were instrumental in drawing up the Charter. But the world cannot afford to weaken the authority of the U.N. The effectiveness of this Organisation is mainly dependent on the responsiveness of its Members to the purposes and principles of the Charter.

Widespread alarm over the possible consequences of testing fifty-megaton super bombs has aggravated the gravity of the challenge to the continued existence of the U. N. as a security against the ques-

## Present System of Education Must Change

### Prominent Educationist's Views

Delivering the Prize-day address at the Karainagar Hindu College, Mr. T. Muttusamypillai, Bar-at-Law, General Manager of the J. H. C. and affiliated colleges, called for a change in the present system of education. In the course of his address he said:

The Education imparted to children at present in Ceylon was the English model of the Victorian Era. It served the imperial masters to find white collar workers for the administration of the Colony. With Independence achieved in 1947 changes were expected.

Some changes have in fact been introduced but they are utterly unsuited for the children of today. In the West, for example, Germany, education was compulsory for all children from the age of 6 to 14. At 15 after they passed out of the elementary school 85% of the lads and lasses were apprenticed to some trade or other. The rest went up for higher studies. Apprentices had to be sent by their employers for 2 days in every week to study the particular trade in which one was apprenticing and at 19 a certificate was issued by the trades school which entitled the holder of such certificate to find employment. Apprentices also were paid during the apprenticeship to help them contribute towards the family budget. Unemployment was unheard of in Germany. It was possible for those who attended Trade Schools of the Technical College to sit for the University Entrance Examination but only a few chose to do so.

In Britain more or less the same system was

tionable activities of aggressor-nations. That Soviet Russia one of the principal founder members of the U. N. should have chosen the seventeenth anniversary of that great organisation to blast the hopes of humanity by exploding the biggest H. Bomb in the teeth of persistent protests from the civilised world clearly indicates the frustration of the Communist Leadership in its subtle efforts to capture dominating influence in the U. N. There is, therefore, every reason why all those nations that value the common concerns of mankind should strenuously strive to keep the flag of U. N. flying in order to ensure the security of humanity against aggression.

followed. It was difficult to find a single English girl working as house maid or in hotels. It was all foreigners from Italy, Spain, Portugal, France or Germany who were working as domestic servants or housemaids because every English lass found more profitable employment. During Dutch rule very few Tamils appeared to have studied Dutch. A few were able to speak. Yet most of the people did not fail to obtain proficiency in their mother tongue by attending small schools. They continued to study even after they began to earn their livelihood.

In my view the system of education must change. Children must be educated at State expense by the State between the ages of 6 and 14. Opportunities should be afforded to them to learn some trade or skill between the ages of 15 and 19. Those eminently proficient in their academic studies should be given facilities for University Education. The policy of the present Government in making Sinhala the only Official Language in Ceylon will make it extremely difficult for the Tamil youth to find employment under Government. No Tamil should study Sinhala unless the rights of his language are recognised by the State. Till such time as the Tamils succeed in obtaining their language rights it is imperative that the Tamil youth should employ himself profitably in agriculture or some trade or vocation which would help him above want.

In conclusion Mr. Muttusamypillai said "Religion should not be neglected in the school. Eyes without sight, ears without hearing and the other organs of the body which cannot perform their respective functions are useless, and so is the head which does not stoop and lie down at the feet of Lord Shiva."

## Kataragama Madams

Sir,—According to a notification in the Daily News, Thinakaran and Dinamina of 6-10-61 by the Govt. Town Planner, the draft planning scheme for Kataragama along with a plan accompanying that scheme is being exhibited at all kacheheries for the public to file their objections, if any, within two months of that date. This is the scheme to shift all madams to the other bank of the Manik Ganga. Now is the time for all interested bodies and institutions to submit their objections. If there is united objections to the removal of the madams to the other side, Govt. have to yield to public opinion and abandon the idea of removal of the madams. So, it is up to you to bring this fact clearly to the notice of the various associations and temple committees in which you are a member, so that they may pass resolutions and forward copies to the Prime Minister and the Minister of Local Govt., stating the grounds of objection. Unless this is done promptly and effectively, we, Hindus, cannot complain of it later. I, as the only Hindu in the Kataragama Advisory Committee, objected to this move as vehemently as possible; but, this was not needed as the Basanayake Nilame and the Public Trustee were determined to shift all madams which are owned by Hindus outside the proposed sacred area. This is done deliberately to deprive the Hindus of their sacred right, which they enjoyed for over many centuries. The right to remain along the procession veethi and to offer pujas at the various madams and to have Mandahappadi as Lord Muruga passes the entrance is the inalienable right of every Hindu, which is exercised not only in this country but also in all countries where the Hindu God is taken in procession. Attempt to deprive us of these by removing the madams has to be resisted by all devout Hindus. I trust that you will promptly attend to this by getting the co-operation of all your Hindu friends, pass resolutions and forward them as indicated in the notification.

learning to live as members of a single family.

If the human race is to survive, we have to subordinate national pride to international feeling, "A nation has its place within an international order but if it puts its interests above those of the human community, it becomes dangerous."

It was essential that the strained relations between the U. S. and the Soviet Union should settle down not in passive, armed co-existence but in active co-operation so as to develop a human society based on a community of "ideals and purposes", "Persuasion and co-operation have become moral imperatives."

"If the present situation is not to end in disaster, we must strive to build a world far better than any that has existed before. It rests with us to choose. We should not believe that everything is determined by the mere physical chain of events."

"If we repudiate human freedom and believe that we are carried down the stream of events, the current, will sweep us into disaster. If we look at the follies, crimes and the massacres of history, we will find that they happened because people suppressed the voice of their conscience, took shelter under the law of the State."

People should cease to think of people of other nations as aliens and enemies, but treat them as human beings, their own kindred.

"We must find inspiration in a return to the principles of individual freedom and world fellowship."
