MODERATION

Moderation is an important virtue which is to be cultivated by a student of ethics or an aspirant. Moderation is freedom from excess in anything. Moderation is calmness of mind. Moderation is equanimity. Moderation is skill in Yoga. Without moderation no success is possible in Yoga, and pursuits also. All the luminaries of the world of the past had observed moderation.

You should be moderate in eating, drinking, sleeping, reading, laughing, copulation, talking, exercise etc. Lord Krishna says: "Verily Yoga is not for him who eats too much nor who abstains to excess, nor who is too much addicted to sleep, nor ever to wakefulness. Yoga kills all pains in him who is regulated in eating and amusement, regulated in sleeping and waking." If you eat too much you will get too much sleep; various diseases of stomach, intestines and liver will develop. All the internal organs will be overtaxed. Too much sleep will make you dull and tamasic. Too much copulation will drain your energy and cause weakness, low vitality and various diseases. Too much talking will disturb peace of mind.

Lord Buddha plunged into extreme austerity in the beginning of his spiritual practices. He gave up food entirely. He did rigorous tapas. He suffered very much, his body became emaciated. He did not make spiritual progress. Then he adhered to the golden medium. He began to take food in moderation. He regulated his spiritual practices. Only then he attained illumination. He always taught disciples to stick to the middle path only. He learnt lessons from experience.

Some aspirants give up their food and try to live on leaves for 40 days. This is foolish tapas. They

fall sick, become weak, and are not able to do any sadhana. Lord Krishna condemns thus 'the men who perform severe austerities unenjoined by the scripture, wedded to vanity and egoism, impelled by the force of their desires and passions, unintelligent, tormenting the aggregate elements forming the body and Me who is seated in the inner body, know these to be demoniacal in their resolves'. Do not spoil your health in the name of tapascharya. Do not go to extreme in anything. Sadhana also must be well regulated. The period of meditation must be gradually increased. The period of Sirshasan must be gradual. When sadhana is done by fits and starts there will be no spiritual progress. Some people make friendship quickly with others love them intensely for some time and break it quickly on account of some trivial causes. They are extreme in their manifestations of emotions. They love either intensely or hate intensely. The emotions also must be well-controlled. Do not move too much with anybody. Be moderated in this direction also. You can keep lasting friendship with everybody.

Be moderate in your making expenditure. Regulate your expenses. Some are imprudent. They thoughtlessly spend in one month too much and borrow in the next month. Be moderate in thinking. Kill all irrelevant, nonsensical, loose thoughts. Do not overwork. Overwork is cause for many diseases. If you overwork you cannot meditate.

He who is perfectly moderate in everything is a real Yogi. He enjoys happiness here and in the next world also. He moves about happily and is always cheerful. He keeps up perfect health and a higher standard in vigour, vim and vitality. He attains longevity and

Deepavali As Devotional Day

Redemption from evil is the significant lesson that Deepavali reminds us of. The duel between virtue and evil has always been the experience of the world. The emergence of virtue as the victor in this duel has been described in detail in the Puranas and other religious literature of the Saivaites and the events connected with the triumph have been narrated in significant style. The essence of all the teachings is the might of prayer in the elimination of evil,

Accounts of the many adventures of Asuras or evil against Devas or virtue reveal the one truth that Divine Grace is absolutely necessary for the achievement of redemption by mortals. The personification of evil and virtue has been the most telling method of presenting religious truths by vividly narrating the events in the context of worldly happenings.

In the modern world there had been personifications of evil in the political sphere — Mussolini, Hitler, Stalin, to name a few. But there is a sharp distinction between the Asuras of Puranic mention and the dictators of the modern age. The Asuras performed Tapas to acquire power and in the enjoyment of that power lost themselves and arrogantly endeavoured to become the Almighty. In the course of their aggressive intentions and activities they found out their utter incapacity and

of the supreme power that was beyond them. In the modern age the dictators who by passage of time acquired power succumbed to that very power and were destroyed, unsung, unwept and unhonoured. The thought of the Almighty never strayed into their minds and they all sank into darkness. The Asuras were believers in God and therefore sought their escape and saw the Light of Truth.

The historical and religious significance of festivals must create in mankind a new urge to reconquer all the cultural greatness that has been lost owing to a surfeit of materialism. The different versions of the origin Deepavali need not confuse the research student about the real derivation of the significance of this festival for all accounts point to the same basic truth.

HATE IN HUMAN HEARTS

Premier Nehru was precisely correct when he diagnosed the chief threat to world peace as "the lack of development of the human mind". Explaining further his conclusion, Shri Nehru added "There is too much hate in our hearts. That is a bad thing. It upsets the mind if you hate too much". This subtle diagnosis of the weakness of the human race as constituting its own danger is particularly true at the present time. There is not merely hate in the human heart but a continuous boiling of that feeling tending to wicked deeds.

So long as there is hate preventing the heart from doing its normal human function of feeling for the fellow-being, the world has to remain strife-stricken. In political affairs the tendency of 'hate' plays a more pernicious part and often sets the stage for open war. Hate in turn creates fear and induces the recourse to the use of force. For peace to be established, freedom from fear must be assured. If all peoples must prosper and enjoy peace, hate must be driven out of the human mind. To achieve this lofty ideal, the statesmen who rush in to lead the people must themselves be men of peace and goodwill. Every word uttered by them should be such as to inspire the people with an abiding faith in peace to 'develop friendly relations among nations based on respect for the principle of equal rights and self-determination of peoples.' Only such statesmen can help to reaffirm faith in fundamental rights in the dignity and worth of the human person. We be-

Sabhai Protests Against Steps To Remove Madams At Kataragama

Schools Admission Scheme

Press communique issued by the Ministry of Education and Broadcasting:—

"To make the position clear, the scheme is as follows:—

"1. In regard to Primary Schools the admission will be of children living nearest to the school without any admission test as indicated in the notice of the Director of Education published in the Ceylon Daily News of 6th November.

"2. In regard to Post-Primary Schools, admissions for January 1962, will be as hithertofore. Admissions for the year 1963, however, will be in accordance with the scheme already announced by the Department of Education.

Basis of distance

"For the benefit of the parents seeking admission for their children the following explanatory note is given:—

"Admission of children to any given Primary School will be continued on the basis of distance from the school until the accommodation available is filled. Thus it is possible that in an urban area the accommodation might be filled by children living within a few hundred yards of the school whilst in rural areas this distance may extend to several miles.

"Instructions have been given to the Regional and Sub Offices of the Department of Education as to the manner in which the problems of any children who find difficulties in gaining admission to any Primary School are to be solved. Parents needing any further clarification are requested to contact the Education Office within their area if they are unable to get adequate clarification from the Head of the nearest school."
