THE ESSENCE OF THE GITA

(By A STUDENT OF HINDU PHILOSOPHY)

Brotherhood of Man

The Bhagavad Gita (the Song of the Lord) contains the quintessence of the Vedas. Within its compass of eighteen chapters, it embodies some of the noblest truths ever revealed to man by God. *Two of the highest truths which the Gita as well as the Christian Gospels teach are the indwelling of God in man and the complete identity and oneness of all races.* "The Immediate, the Unremate, the Brahman, which is the Self: is within all", says the Brihadaranyake Upanishad. "The Kingdom of God is within you" says Christ. At first sight it might seem that the Gita supports war and the killing of one's enemies as the advice of Krishna to Arjuna may indicate, but the cultivation of equanimity, universal benevolence, charity, wisdom and devotion to the Supreme God which many verses emphasize, negatives that assumption. As Christ wanted His Teachings to be applied not only to the Jews but to all mankind the author of the Gita recognizes no boundaries of class or creed, no distinctions of caste or community. There is of course some stress laid by him on the division of Hindu Society into castes and the social danger of caste corruption, but the institution of caste itself is regarded as an obstacle to the acquisition of spiritual wisdom. "In a Brahmana endued with wisdom and humility, in a cow, in an elephant, as also in a dog and in a chandala, the wise see the same" (Chapter 5 San-yasa Yoga verse 18). It is worthy of note in this connection that the Buddha whose knowledge of Vedantism was deep taught that no man was superior by race, birth, or profession. He recognized only a moral or intellectual superiority. Mankind then is one. They are brothers to whatever nation they may belong

and God is the father of their heads to meet the same fate.

Now in these days of international tension when the nations of the West are engaged in a war of nerves, when intimidation is resorted to in the name of peace, and threats of destruction are hurled at each other by rival groups of states, it behoves us to consider how all this dissension has arisen and how the threatened conflict may be averted. The world has still not profited by the lesson the last war taught. Religion again seems to have no weight at international conferences. States as well as individuals are still bent on increasing their wealth and power by any means at their command and the result of this unholy competition is that the greedy capitalist and the godless communist are at each other's throat. The grip is deadly and may well end fatally for both. The struggle for supremacy between the two factions is so keen that darkness has enveloped the world and it is in imminent danger of destruction. There is a prophecy in chapter 6 of the Christian Book of Revelations warning mankind of a catastrophe which is to overtake the earth when the time is ripe. This prophecy may now be on the verge of being fulfilled. But its fulfilment can be put off indefinitely if man only ceases to be inhuman to his fellow-man. It is said that international conflicts are the instruments which the Divine Being uses to scourge or reform his sinful creatures. There is some truth in his saying as whenever the world has turned away from the path of Religion wars have broken out destroying the civilisation it has taken ages to build. Then the world again turns to Religion in its despair, and when once more prosperity blinds it, racialism and a narrow nationalism raise

The history of the last one hundred and fifty years has had its pages darkened by three great wars. Each was the fruit of racial pride and the desire for dominion. The

Kataragama Madams

The Madams at Kataragama were put up by pious devotees of Murugan for the convenience of the pilgrims who go there not only to pay their vows, if any, but also for the purpose of spiritual retreat which involves various acts of penance or Thapas with mortification of the flesh to gain the grace of the Lord and attain Moksha.

Madams form part of Hindu religious life, their importance being second only to that of temples, and many a saint's tomb will be found in them. Indeed madams form a part of temple schemes in India where the temple authorities (Devasthanams) themselves put up Madams for the convenience of the pilgrims. It should be noted that the Basanayake Nilames in the past although they did not put up madams themselves out of their temple funds, they encouraged pious philanthropists to put up these madams at Kataragama along the Veethees through which the Lord is taken in procession to and from Valli Amma Devale so that the devotees may greet their Living God with their customary offerings and perform their religious obligations. The present move to have these Madams removed is very unfortunate in the present political climate that now prevails in Ceylon as it will easily be

Protest Against Removal of Kadiragama Madams

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabhai held on the 5th inst. at the Sabhai Navalar Ashram Hall presided over by the President, Mr. T. Muthusamypillai, the following resolution was passed unanimously protesting against the removal of the Madams at Kadiragama and erecting them on the other side of the Manik Ganga.

The resolution is as follows:-

"The ancient temple of Kadiragama dedicated to Lord Subramaniya in the Island of Ceylon is held in high veneration by the Hindus of Ceylon and India from time immemorial. Thousands of Hindu devotees visit this temple for worship annually. To serve the needs and comforts of these devotees madams were erected ad-

attributed to discrimination against certain section of the worshippers who have enjoyed the freedom to worship the Lord in the way they had been doing for centuries past.

Since the opening of the road for motor traffic from Tissu to Kataragama there is an ever increasing number of pilgrims who go to this ancient shrine that the present Madams are not sufficient to accommodate them. May the Lord of Kataragama to whom all are alike irrespective of race, religion, colour, caste and language guide those now in power along the correct path so that they will have the welfare of the pilgrims at heart and allow the present Madams to continue to render the useful service they are doing as at present. Indeed it would be best if more Madams are put by Buddhist authorities bear the sacred Kiri Vihare for the convenience of Buddhist pilgrims who are now coming there in large numbers for worship.

I am writing this after having worshipped in this holy shrine regularly for forty-two years for which I am grateful to the Lord of Kataragama.

joining the court-yard of the temple by benefactors. Each madam has a shrine room where daily poojas are performed. During the Maha Festival Season when Lord Muruga is taken in procession around the temple court-yard the owners of the Madams and the Hindu devotees offer their prayer with votive offerings in front of each Madam. These Madams accommodate all devotees irrespective of casts, creed or language. These madams and the Holy Temple in their set-up should be considered as one unit. The removal of these madams and the shrine rooms thereof will be tantamount to dismemberment of the limbs of the holy temple of Kadiragama. The Madams have successfully maintained the age-old religious traditions and ideals of the people of Ceylon. Hence any interference with these Madams will be sacrilegious. The removal will greatly wound the religious feelings of devotees of the different faiths congregating at Kadiragama and in particular, the Hindus. The Holy Temple and the Madams in their present set-up promote among the people of Ceylon communal and religious harmony which will be endangered by the proposed removal of the Madams.

Further, the proposed removal is contrary to law and will result in injury to the religious rights of all the people including the Hindus. Considering these facts the Sabhai strongly protests against the removal of these Madams and fervently appeals to the Government of Ceylon to allow the madams to remain where they are at present."

EDUCATION COMMISSION'S RECOMMENDATIONS

In its interim report to the Governor-General the National Education Commission has made several recommendations that require the closest scrutiny of educationists (other than those who are sitting on the Commission). The system of education that is obtaining at present certainly requires to be remodelled and recast. But the responsibility for planning a system that is acceptable to the aspirations of a young nation with a heterogeneous population must be shared by the Government with the people. True it is that the accepted procedure is for a Commission to hold several sittings, hear the views of the public and submit their recommendations. However the future of a growing nation in any sphere and more particularly in that of education must be decided upon after deep deliberation by competent educationists. Hence it is of the utmost importance that the interim report including the material placed before the Commission by those who chose to give evidence should be made available to the people.

The recommendations on such subjects as the Official Language, the teaching of English and the zoning of schools are by themselves controversial and must therefore be freely and fully discussed by the public. It, therefore, becomes necessary that Parent-teacher Associations, Teachers' Unions and Educational Societies should immediately set about to study the recommendations in their full implications and publish

PULL TOGETHER OR WE PERISH

Premier Nehru's Peace Plan

Speaking at the U. N. General Assembly Premier Nehru made a fervent appeal for solving the problem of world conflicts. In the course of his inspiring address he said:—

It was impossible for colonists to continue without posing the danger of major conflicts in the world. But the world was facing even graver problems—problems of survival and of war and peace. Unless these were handled wisely, the future staring at them was a painful one.

They lived under terror—the terror of catastrophe with the future of the world's survival being imperilled. It was an odd circumstance that the full realisation of this basic fact should not be appreciated by many Governments. The choice was one that had never faced the world before—it was a choice of extinction or of survival.

People talked of saving themselves from nuclear disaster by borrowing like rats in a hole. Surely it was a strange commentary to be driven to that conclusion instead of diverting all their energies to prevent a catastrophe.

There could be no normal existence until this terror was removed.

The various problems including that of Berlin and Germany were capable of solution because he was convinced that no country desired war and that all peoples were passionately in favour of peace.

Why then were they unable to solve these problems? The alternative to not solving them was infinitely worse. No country, great or small, could easily agree to something that wounded its honour and self-respect. No solution could be found that was based on wounding the honour or self-respect of a country.

Talks on this question were often an attempt to put some other party in the wrong rather than to achieve

their opinions, inferences and suggestions with a view to placing before Parliament the necessary data for a proper decision to be arrived at.

even some result. The modern world could not continue for long without full disarmament, because these problems would come up again and again.

The material advance that had taken place in the world—and this was magnificent—had gone far ahead of the development of human minds, which lagged behind. The mind still thought in the narrow terms of 100 or 200 years ago. Emotionally, people still did not understand fully the dangers of nuclear war, or

there would not be these deadlocks and impasses.

Under modern conditions war had to be ruled out or humanity had to submit to the ending of all it had laboured for over thousands of years. It was important and urgent that they should approach the question with speed, deliberation and a determination to solve it, rather than show that the other party was wrong.

The great nations had all committed themselves to general and complete disarmament. In broad outline there was a good deal of "commonness" about the American and Soviet proposals. Therefore, why should they not take up this agreement and divert all the great energies of peoples to the world's advancement.

They were quite unable to get out of old ways of thinking, not realising

that to-day there was no victory for any country in a major war—only defeat and extermination for all. If that was so, surely this major and outstanding question of—disarmament—must be dealt with speed.

The great powers should turn themselves to the question with a determination not to separate until they had reached agreement. It was better for a few countries to deal with this problem, rather than, to begin with, for a large body to take up the question.

In India they were not in a major theatre of a possible war, but he felt that everything for which man had striven over the past thousands of years was at stake to-day. For all he felt about colonial matters, the biggest question to-day was the question of war and peace, and disarmament. The whole

long Napoleonic War which was rooted in a desire to dominate the world ended in the destruction of France and its Empire. The first World War of the present century crushed German ambitions to dominate the world and advanced the interest of two other empires—the British and the French. The second World War ended in the complete destruction of Germany and the victors too suffered by the loss of some parts of their dominions as a result of their cupidity. For the third time, the German problem once again seems to be "casus belli". The Western Powers want the unification of Germany worked out on a capitalist pattern while Russia insists on a communist pattern. What the future will hold remains to be seen. In all probability, there may neither be capitalism nor communism. It is a curious feature of the First and Second World Wars that both sides prayed for victory to "the God of battles". There may be no room left in the future for such prayers, for in some mysterious way, unforeseen by man, the Divine Being will manifest Himself. *"Whenever there is a decay of religion, Bharata, and an ascendancy of irreligion, then I manifest Myself For the protection of the good, for the destruction of evildoers, for the firm establishment of religion, I am born in every age."* (Chapter 4 Jnana Yoga, verses 7 and 8.)

atmosphere of the world would change if disarmament came in.

He himself possessed no greater wisdom than each one of those here. Only, in some matters some might feel a little more deeply about problems. But they wanted a common wisdom that should come to everyone.

The fear of war was obvious. The fear that gripped mankind was obvious. How could they get on dealing with secondary questions when the basic problems eluded them?

The Assembly had recently passed resolutions. It was a great misfortune, that after a period of abstinence from nuclear tests there had been a resumption. There could be no doubt that this turned the attention of the world in the wrong direction, apart from the harm it might do. The possibilities of war became more evident.

A great disservice was being done to the world by "not putting an end to this business of nuclear tests, and putting an end to it by treaty as early as possible." No one imagined that a voluntary moratorium was going to solve the question. There must be stricter controls by treaty and otherwise. That should be worked for as early as possible, but in the meantime, the door should not be open for tests to go on.
