The Brahman or the Universal Self was to be found in every individual and in all things and the process of achieving unity or union was not merely ethical, but intellectual also. Complete merging of the individual self in the Universal Self is the highest point in religious devotion that the devotee can reach and this merging is possible only if Braman is regarded as God. that the students must be able to lunch at a convenient place instead of being compelled by circumstances to go in search of restaurants The canteen system may be introduced under the supervision of Students' Associations. This will save much time for the students and help them avoid the need to go out of the school premises. Similarly the provision of special transport may be arranged by the school authorities with the C. T. B. or any private transport organisation with the per mission of the Government. This steps become particularly necessary where the schools have attendance of over five hundred. The establishment of School Welfare Boards is, therefore, a very urgent need.
