MR. ARUNACHALAM CHELLAPAH AN APPRECIATION

The removal of Mr. Arunachalam Chellappah at the ripe age of 88 has deprived the Hindu Community in Ceylon of a remarkable and outstanding personality. He lived the latter part of his life in retirement so much so that many of the younger generation do not have the privilege of knowing him and his worth. His services rendered to the people and to our sacred religion were varied and great. Simplicity, modesty, efficiency and good nature were some of the characteristics displayed by him. His services and personal qualities were concealed beneath the cloak of modesty and self-effacement. To the Vivekananda Society, Colombo, of which he was a founder member, he gave a good portion of his life, perhaps the best portion. He belonged to the original group of pious and enthusiastic Hindus who were instrumental in founding our institution. He held various offices in our Society, including that of Vice-President. He was one of those conducting the religious classes at the Society, along with the late President S. Candiahpillai, another of our Honorary Members. He was one of the pioneers in the cause of Hindu revival in the cosmopolitan metropolis of Ceylon. He was also one of those who were responsible for the acquisition of the premises now occupied by the Society at Vivekananda Hill (formerly Hill Street), Colombo. He was for several years more or less the keeper of the conscience of the Society. In recognition of his valuable services he was unanimously elected one of the Honorary Members of the Society decades ago. He along with his younger brothers Messrs Visvanathan, scholar, devotee and retired Civil Servant and Kandiah formed a trio of brothers who consistently rendered significant services to the Society. His nephew, the late Pandit

tion and self-effacement. Such was the pre-eminently Hindu background in which Mr. Chellappa was fortunately placed. He belonged to an older generation which is almost disappearing and which included persons like Mudaliyar Kailasapillai, Mudaliyar Rasanayakam and Messrs Hallock Thiru-



who held office at the Vivekananda Society and who served the Society, the Thiruketheeswaram Temple Restoration Society and several other religious and cultural undertakings with rare devo-

vilangam and C. Perumal pillai. The purity of his life and his fervent adherence to Hindu principles were themselves a service and served as an example to other Hindus.

The contents of this Sutram form the subject matter of the second and third chapters of Tiru. Kovaiyar entitled Pankatkooddam பாங்கற்கூட்டம் or the friend's confluence and Idanthalaippadu இடந்தலைப் பாடு or arrival at the spot, subdivided into 31 themes (beginning with பாங்கனை நினைத்தல், invocation of the friend, and ending with பொழிவிடைச் சேறல், entering the grove) and detailed in verses 19 to 49 thereof.

We propose to stop here for the present. We have studied three Sutas only, but we believe we have given a fairly clear indication of the ideas and trend of thought permeating these Sutas as a whole. The reader may now proceed to study them and form his own conclusions regarding them. But the one essential point that should not be lost sight of is the similarity of the relationships between man and wife in the temporal plane in its highest aspect and between God and man in the spiritual plane. We conclude with a quotation from St. Thayumanavar, which will help to make the position clear. RURAL RE-CONSTRUCTION

While much time is spent in the Houses of Parliament legislating for the country, the maintenance of rural areas by the Village Councils is lagging behind both in quality and volume. These councils are called upon to maintain the villages out of the meagre resources they have at their command. With the phenomenal increase in the population of the country the up-keep of the rural areas requires greater revenue. But unfortunately the Local Bodies are unable to find the necessary funds for this purpose as the source of revenue remains the same.


It is a well-known fact that the main activity of the Village Council is to maintain the high lanes and minor roads within its area. But the availability of funds is so poor that not even one single road in its entirety can be maintained. Motor-traffic has increased several-fold in the rural areas with the result that roads and lanes require frequent repairs.

The main source of revenue for a Village Council is its market and the earnings out of the supply of electric current. But in the course of budgeting, the authorities always find it difficult to find the necessary amount of revenue for the maintenance and up-keep of roads as items of expenditure on establishment are also correspondingly heavy. Thus the Central Government must revise its system of grant to Village Councils and make larger amounts available as grants and supplement these by loans. The real purpose of Village Council administration cannot be served unless these Local Bodies are adequately assisted by the Central Government.

CO-OPERATIVE MOVEMENT LOSES ITS CHIEF WORKER

Death of Mr. A. Arulambalam

We deeply regret to record the death of Mr. A. Arulambalam J. P. Proctor. He was ailing for some time and his condition grew worse yesterday. He passed away at his residence at Neeraviady.



Mr. Arulambalam was one of the stalwarts of the Co-operative movement in North Ceylon. He was almost a symbol of the co-operative spirit. Every organization under the auspices of this movement was his planning. As Member of the Board of Directors of the Co-operative Dept., President of the Co-operative Bank Jaffna, the Chief of the Northern Federation and in all similar capacities he rendered yeoman service. He was a guest of the British Council in England and later went to Japan as a co-op. representative. He edited the Co-op. Journal in Tamil and published a book on 'Co-operation.'

If his devotion to the Co-operative movement was great, it was equally so in the affairs of the Hindu College and its affiliated Colleges and the Jaffna Saiva Paripala

Sabhai of which establishments he was Secretary for many years.

His untimely death is a blow to Jaffna particularly to the Co-op movement.

He leaves behind his wife Valliammai and three sons—Ambalavanar, Senathirajah and Gnanasambanthan and one daughter Mrs. Tilagavathy Yoganathan—wife of Dr. V. Yoganathan D.M.A. Vavuniya.

The funeral takes place at 38 College Road Neeraviady today. The cortege leaves his residence at 11 a.m. the body will be cremated at Kombaiyan Manal Cemetery according to Hindu rites.

produce even a bit of sleep after some days. Drugs produce depressions. Try to get sleep by natural methods. Give up over-loading the stomach. Let your diet be light and easily digestible. Indigestion is another cause for sleeplessness. Finish your evening meal at 5 p.m. Let it be some milk and fruits only. Do not take anything at night. You will have good sleep.

Relax your body and mind completely. Sleep is bound to come to you. Give up heated debates and unnecessary arguments and discussions, keep your temper under control. Abandon tea and coffee entirely. They unnecessarily stimulate the cells of the brain and the nerves.

Do not read novels, ghost stories, thrillers, murder yarns and sensational literature. They will excite your nerves. Do not take stimulants of any kind. Give up liquors, ganjah, opium etc.

Do not do any intense brain work before retiring bed. Avoid mental hurry or agitation; Try remain calm always. Control the emotions, Control anger.

Do not take exciting foodstuffs, hot curries, chutnies, too much chilies & tamarind. Let your food be bland and quite simple. Take more of milk and fruits. Take oil bath just before retiring to bed or hot mustard foot bath.

If you wake up do not bother to find out what the time is. To look at the watch will be to make you anxious. Do not keep any light in the room. If you cannot sleep without light, then use a green chimney.

Apply a little Brahmi-amloka oil on the head just before retiring to bed. Take a cup of hot horlick's malted milk just before retiring to bed. Do a little Japa, prayer and meditation just before going to bed. Study some elevating sacred books like Gita, Yoga Vasistha, Bhagavat, Koran, Bible, etc.

Reduce your wants. Annihilate all desires and cravings. Talk a little. Do not mix much. Do not fatigue yourself through over work. Sleep alone. Have a brisk walk in the evening.

If your nerves and

brain are weak strengthen and energise them through practice of mild Pranayama with Om Japa. Take a beverage made up of almonds, brahmi leaves, sugar-candy & powdered black pepper in the early morning. Take Brhmi ghrita (ghee) or Huxley's Nervigour Syrup.

Lie down quietly, relaxed in mind and body. This will give you as much recuperation as sleep itself. A little silent meditation also will give you perfect rest.

Put two teaspoonful of mustard powder in a basin of hot water. Sit on a chair or stool. Keep the legs in the water for 15 or 20 minutes. Then take the feet out of the water. Wipe this with a dry towel and put on stockings. This will give you sound sleep. This is useful in head-ache, vertigo, rheumatism fever etc. This is used for the feet to check colds.

Mr. Chellappah belonged to a remarkable Hindu family to whose members service to the Hindu religion and adherence to Hindu principles came in instinctively. If Mr. Chellappah was one of the founder members of the Vivekananda Society, Colombo, his elder brother, Mr. A. Thillaiampalam who predeceased him about two years ago was one of those associated with the foundation of the Saiva Paripalana Sabhai and the Hindu College, Jaffna. Even as Mr. Chellappah was one of the Honorary Members of the Vivekananda Society and served it for decades, his elder brother served the Saiva Paripalana Sabhai, Jaffna as one of its Presidents and was associated with important Hindu movements in the Jaffna peninsula. By contributing to the foundation, continued activity and growth of the Vivekananda Society and his adherence to the devoted application of Hindu ideals in the conduct of the affairs of the Society and generally in Hindu circles, Mr. Chellappah created an atmosphere which facilitated the labours of a subsequent generation and was like a lamp unto their feet.
