**M. P. For Jaffna Asks For
U. N. Observer
Or Commonwealth Mission****Senator Nadesan Suggests
Compensation Commission**

Even in normal times amendments are moved to the Address of Thanks. But the debate is not charged with emotion. This year the Amendments were discussed in an atmosphere of tense feeling and the speeches in both Houses reached a very high standard of eloquence and presentation.

Mr. G. G. Ponnambalam, M. P. for Jaffna in the course of his speech in the House of Representatives on the amendments to the Address of Thanks said:

"I ask you in the name of this country which all of us claim as our own, is it too late even now to have an impartial United Nations Observer to go into the facts and publish facts to the world? What do you stand to lose in conceding that?"

Am I asking too much in asking for a Neutral Observer? Very well, if you do not want a neutral observer from the United Nations, I suggest, you still remain a member of the Commonwealth of Nations - let us make it, shall we say a family affair, let us not bring the other nations into this. Cannot we get a Mission from the Commonwealth countries to come along and investigate the facts, to hold the scales evenly in order to ascertain the facts for all time.

"Mr. Speaker, I ask let not partisans sit in judgment about the number who have been displaced or killed, as to who the aggressors are and who the people who suffered are. Let us have a neutral Observer. Let the conscience of the world decide who is to blame for this sorry and unhappy episode in the history of this country.

NAGY'S EXECUTION****Indian Communist Leader
Mr. S. A. Dange's View**

"It would have been better if the execution of Imre Nagy and his three associates had been avoided.

"There can also be an opinion that the executions were not absolutely necessary at this stage.

Other Indian leaders continue to express their distress at the Hungarian executions. Professor Balraj Madhok the all India Secretary of the Hindu Political Party, Jana Sangh said in a press statement:

"The execution of Imre Nagy... is a grim reminder to democratic world that the Communist leopard, in spite of all its professions about co-existence and faith in peaceful means, has not changed its spots. The fact that these popular leaders of Hungary had been arrested by stratagem and deceit adds to the gravity of this crime which is in the worst tradition of stalinistic terrorism which Khrushchev had denounced in his famous speech at the twentieth conference of the Russian Communist Party. It is now clear that Khrushchev denounced the stalinistic methods only

to secure power for himself. Having obtained it he wants to maintain his hegemony over the communist empire through the same methods as Stalin had employed.

**Sri Swami
Sivananda**

Born on the 8th September, 1887, in the illustrious family of Sage Appayya Deekshita and several other renowned saints and savants, Sri Swami Sivananda had a natural flair for a life devoted to the study and practice of Vedanta. Added to this was an inborn eagerness to save all and innate feeling of unity with all mankind. Though born in an orthodox family, Swamiji was broadminded and catholic, pious and devout.

His passion for service drew him to the medical career; and soon he gravitated to those parts of the world which most needed his service. Malaya claimed him. He had also commenced editing a Health Journal and wrote extensively on health problems. He discovered that people needed right knowledge most of all dissemination of that knowledge he expounded as his own mission.

It was divine dispensation and the blessing of God upon mankind that the doctor of body and mind, renounced his career and took to a life of renunciation to qualify himself for ministering to the soul of man. He settled down at Rishikesh in 1924 practised intense austerities and shone as a great Yogi, saint, sage and Jeevanmukta.

In 1932 he started the Sivanandashram. In 1936 was born the Divine Life Society. In 1948 the Yoga Vedanta Forest University was organised. Dissemination of spiritual knowledge and training of people in Yoga and Vedanta were their aim and object. In 1950 he undertook a lightning tour of India.

In 1953 he convened the World Parliament of Religions. He is the author of over 200 volumes and has disciples all over the world, belonging to all nationalities religions and creeds. To read his works is to drink at the Fountain of Wisdom Supreme and grow spiritually to be immortal and eternally peaceful and blissful.

VAINGLORIOUSNESS

Stating the case for the Government in answer to the sharp and substantial criticism of the Members in the Opposition, during the course of the debate in the House of Representatives, on the Address of Thanks to the Speech from Throne, the Premier was able only to reiterate his oft-repeated assurance and give expression to a vainglorious feeling of self-satisfaction in laying claim to an achievement in that respect that his Government alone was best fitted to rule this country. Though earlier during the debate Mr. Leslie Gunawardene, M. P. for Panadura, had reminded the Head of the Government that the latter had a duty to speak for everybody in this country, yet Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike laboured at length to ridicule the part that was played by the late Sir Ponnambalam Arunachalam in the demand for self-government and to give his own interpretation of the efforts of the Minorities during the days of the Donoughmore Commission and the Soulbury Commission.

The free use of biting diatribes and bitter invectives cannot help the search for a satisfactory solution of the problem that is confronting the country. Nor can the vainglorious assertions of the capacity of the party in power to rule the country be of any fruitful assistance. Still less can the Governing Party's warning to the people that their interest in the affairs of the country must conform to the requirements of that Party, pave the way for better times. Where the Government of its own accord should have appointed a Commission

to enquire into the happenings during May and June 1958, it was regrettable to note that the Premier could not accept the proposal made by the M. P. for Jaffna, inviting a U. N. Observer or a Mission from the Commonwealth Nations. In the Upper House there was no response to Senator Nadesan's suggestion for the appointment of a 'Compensation Commission'. And the spirited debate on the Amendments to the Address of Thanks, however could not elicit any concrete assurance of hope for the future of this country.

The speeches in both Houses require to be studied and reviewed. The voting on the Amendments in the House of Representatives provides interesting statistics for students of politics. The maximum of 46 reached by the Government as against 16 for the Opposition with a large number of absentions, leaving alone absentees, cannot be ignored.

In the Upper House Senator Nadesan in the course of an exhaustive analysis of the happenings of May and June 1958 suggested the appointment of a Commission on Compensation to victims of the happenings.

GREATNESS OF HINDU PHILOSOPHY

Marvellous Insight Into The Mysteries Of The Universe

(Extracts from a speech delivered by Dr. Rajendra Prasad while inaugurating the Akhila Bharata Madhya Tatva Tiritiya Sammelana in Hyderabad.)

The unity of India was reflected in the growth and spread of Hindu Indian thought which had its roots in the Vedas. Behind the cavalcade of history, with all its vicissitudes and upheavals, flowed steadily this stream of thought as a sustaining force.

'I am so glad to be here to day to inaugurate this conference though I am not sure if my knowledge of Philosophy — particularly of the 'Dvaita Darshan' of Sri Madhavacharya, would entitle me to honour this I can only ascribe the invitation extended to me by the conveners to their large heartedness. For me, personally, it is not only a pleasure but a great privilege to be present here and to meet so many eminent scholars and acharyas.

"When I think of the great thinkers and philosophers that our country has produced, I often marvel at their erudition, intellectual prowess, sense of rectitude, and unshakable faith in what they considered to be right and true. To delve deep into the mysteries of the Universe, to probe into the innermost recesses of the cosmos and to theorize from a practical angle and often from empirical basis, are some of the attributes which we find in Indian thinkers beginning from the Vedic age down to comparatively recent times. As a layman interested in our past heritage and as a student desirous of acquainting myself with the evolution of human thought, whenever I have read an oft repeated verse from our Sastras or come across a pithy Sutra. I have invariably experienced a feeling of elation and nearness to real human nature and Truth. So deep was the insight of the sages of yore and so intense their knowledge of human psychology and man's innermost urges and aspirations that when we go through some of their works even to day, we often feel as if a modern were speaking to us. The reason, I believe, is that shorn of all its superfluities and superficial things, their thoughts grasped the fundamentals of human nature and universal Truth. That is why the

great fund of knowledge that has come down to us has proved in many respects, not only universal in character but an abiding source of inspiration to people generation after generation. Practically all our literature, our humanities and our sciences which have sustained us through all the trials and turmoils it has been our lot to undergo have their root in Vedic and post-Vedic literature.

'India is renowned for its Systems of Philosophy and its great Schools of Dialectical Reasoning. We can justly feel proud of them. When the West came in touch with this knowledge in the 18th and the 19th centuries, it created a great stir in Europe's scholastic circles. The great German philosopher, Schopenhauer, is said to have exclaimed, after going through a translation of an Upanishad, that he would willingly barter all the knowledge of the world he had with the contents of the Upanishads. He looked upon them as the solace of his life and aftermath. Many other renowned scholars and philosophers thought equally well of Indian Philosophy and the great thinkers who enunciated it.

"One of the greatest among these Indian thinkers was, undoubtedly, Sri Madhavacharya who flourished in the 14th century. He was an eminent scholar and great mystic who revitalised the Indian Philosophy and revolutionised the whole gamut of Indian beliefs. I am not a student of the philosophy of Madhavacharya, but no one can fail to be impressed with some of the outstanding features of his contribution which is sufficient to compel admiration from all true lovers of knowledge. His unshakable and undying faith in the existence of a Supreme Being whose children all human beings are and whose splendid creation this panorama of srishti of the Universe is, is enough to fill our hearts and heads with joy and abiding peace. Sri Madhavacharya has, indeed, a high place among the Indian philo-
