Cause Of Our Present Suffering

Desire For Prestige And Position Of Strength

All suffering is essentially mental. It may be objected that pain is suffering on the biological level and must be distinguished from mental suffering. The injury to the tissue is certainly biological, but the nervous impulse that travels to the brain is felt as pain in the mind. In fact all sensations are functions of the mind. In Indian Psychology mind is considered as the sixth sense.

It is well known that Yogis can eliminate pain by withdrawing their consciousness from the seat of the injury. Sri Aurobindo went through a most painful operation without the use of anaesthetics, by withdrawing his mind into a high state of Yoga. Swami Ramdas has described how he was conscious of the pain of an abscess in the foot of an ecstatic experience hardly distinguishable from bliss. It is fairly well established that pain is very largely a mental phenomenon. Even without the Yogic experience, one can be aware of a fact that pain can be greatly reduced by disregarding it. When one is concentrated in one's work one can completely disregard the suffering of the body. During the influenza epidemic of 1918, Mrs. Besant had high fever during her long journeys, but she travelled to Calcutta, Darjeeling, Patna and back to Madras. When we questioned her about her illness and doubted the wisdom of travelling under such conditions, she merely smiled and said: "I was not ill, only my body was ill." Such withdrawal from body consciousness is not only possible, but may be usefully attempted and practised by all. This is only a very rough explanation of the phenomenon of pain. I do not pretend that it is complete. Eminent biologists are still not clear about the evolutionary purpose of pain. But that there is a

psychological element in pain is obvious. Both by anticipation and memory the sensation of pain can be prolonged. Letting it pass through our system without thinking of it is perhaps the wisest way of dealing with it.

I propose to deal with the problem of human suffering on the mental level. What is the nature and content of suffering? According to the Buddhist teaching, the cause of suffering is the craving for individual life. According to the Vedantist, suffering is the result of a fundamental ignorance, of a division of the human psyche from the all-embracing totality. The Bhakta will regard all suffering as a separation from God. Hell is a state of complete isolation from God, and Satan or the Devil is the will to separate oneself from God. In Milton's 'Paradise Lost' the fallen archangel exhibits many moral virtues, but is the embodiment of the principle of separation, of pride. The root of all wrong or false thinking is this idea of separateness. We are not isolated, independent individuals with the right to do or be what we like. We are organically related to God, Nature and people like ourselves. We have no existence even as an individual apart from that Totality to which we give the name 'God'. My thumb cut off from my hand is no longer a thumb; it is only a piece of flesh soon disintegrates. Its 'thumbness' derives entirely from its relationship to the body. It loses its significance the moment it cuts itself off from the whole.

Ignorance of this truth, of this relationship of the individual to the Totality — to God — is responsible for all the suffering of the world today, both at the individual as well as the national level. Independence is a myth, a pernicious myth. The law which governs our being is the

law of inter dependence not of independence. We see that the disasters that threaten world security today are the result of this wrong thinking. The desire for prestige, for a position of strength, are all symptoms of a fatal disease. If my thumb became conscious of its importance and wanted to grow taller and taller, we would consider it a disease. Cancer is such a disease. The growth of America and Russia, in superiority of nuclear weapons spells the ultimate destruction of the world. It is a fatal social disease. Why do we not see it? Why do the leaders of Nations not see it? They are intelligent people, quite capable of seeing it. It is 'Fear', distrust of one another. Fear does not permit us to realise that so long as there is this distrust there can be no security.

The problem is not seen so clearly at the individual level. It is possible to shut our eyes to the Truth that we are part of an indivisible whole, that we cannot be happy at the expense of another; that in order to be happy at all we must surrender this illusion of a separate self. This was realised by a few isolated seers of the past scattered all over the world. Today its realisation on a large world-wide scale is the very condition for our continued existence.

How is it that we have brought about this form of isolated thinking. Are we aware of the disintegration that is taking place on a revolutionary scale in our domestic and social life? We are struggling in a competitive world for the right to exist. We see in our own society the breaking down of all social and moral values, because of this concern for our individual happiness and security. We are under the rule of a Law which is as rigid in the world of men, as it is in the world of things—the law of Love, of unity, of oneness. It is called by many names according to the level on which it operates. And we are breaking this Law, the Law of Harmony.

The individual today is living in a state of isolation. He has built up a prison in which he has

Hindu View Of Vegetarianism

Ethical And Spiritual Development Its Keynote

The most important reason for which the vegetarian diet is advocated and non-vegetarian diet disfavoured by the orthodox Hindus is because of their respective effects upon the ethical and spiritual development of the human being. The consideration is not so much of merely physical and mental or intellectual development of the man. Man is more than just body and mind. He is essentially an ever-perfect, ever-pure and ever-free Spirit in his true inner nature.

Human birth is given as an opportunity and a means to attain this sublime knowledge of man's inner spiritual nature and to regain his divinity. In this process, all grossness and animalistic tendencies have to be totally eliminated from the human personality. Non-vegetarian diet, which is gross and animal by its very nature, no doubt exerts a thwarting influence to this process. Pure Sattvic diet helps in the refinement of the human nature. Vegetarian diet is a great factor in this. Ethical idealism and spiritual aspiration find place and flourish more easily in a Sattvic mind. Diet influences the mind. No doubt, vegetarianism by itself is of no avail in the control of the mind or the refinement of the human nature but it is of considerable help when there is a determined effort at self-perfection.

People thoughtlessly wax eloquent in their advocacy of animal diet.

enclosed himself. He calls it his 'self'. If the self-enclosing process is complete and he shuts himself voluntarily from all communion with the real world, then it is Hell. Hell is a state of mind which is completely impervious to the entrance of Love. This is the essence of sorrow and suffering.

They do not care about the important fact that man's nature is influenced by the diet that he takes. All foods are divided into three categories—Sattvic, Rajasic and Tamasic. Animal diet belongs to the Rajasic and mostly to the Tamasic category. Sattvic diet or wholesome, nutritious, non-irritant, non-exciting food, is essential in the process of the ethical and spiritual culture. Vegetarian and fruit diet is mostly Sattvic. (Vegetarian diet, of course, includes cereals.) The subtle part of the food material goes to make up the mind. Tamasic diet produces Tamasic tendencies. Onion and garlic are extremely Tamasic. They are as bad as meat.

No doubt animal diet gives a strong physique, strong muscles, and helps in strengthening the fighting qualities of a soldier. But, in the Hindu view of life, the real value is placed upon the moral and spiritual worth of man. Moreover, flesh-eating involves the exercises of cruelty, however indirect, which is not an elevating virtue. It is an indirect support to the perpetration of killing animals. Thus slaughter of animals or the taking of innocent lives, which flesh-eating entails, makes it abhorrent to all sensitive, religious-minded Hindus. Besides, animal food exercises a strong exciting influence over the lower passions, which the spiritually inclined man tries to overcome. Non-vegetarian diet alone does not ensure the necessary calories for the growth and maintenance of the body. Vegetarian diet also can very well meet the needs if properly balanced.

PEAKS THAT RUN PARALLEL

THE chief champions of peace, campaigning as they are on parallel paths, cannot hope to meet on common ground. The situation though appearing to be a stalemate yet is capable of providing opportunity for preparations of war. The attempt to assassinate the Prime Minister of Lebanon indicates the gravity of the situation in the Middle East. But those who indulge in tall talk are employing every available means of manoeuvre to plant the 'peak' at a point of vantage.

Apparently there is an apprehension on all sides that the climate in the countries that claim leadership of the world is not congenial to the holding of conferences that aim at co-operation and conciliation. It is very unfortunate that the 'Cold War' has taken a dangerous turn where even the nerves of the Big Powers are becoming charged with trepidation.

Whether the Big Powers meet or not the situation in the Middle East has to be met for the safety of smaller nations to be ensured. The recent happenings in Iraq and Lebanon constitute the severe warning to small states that there is a planned plot to set afoot mischief everywhere by the method of merciless massacre of political leaders with a view to making the world good only for bloody revolutions. Who can stop this plague and how? That is the question that is engaging the minds of the people of the small states of Asia. If the U. N. cannot undertake this responsibility then it must own its incompetence and im-

Letter to the Editor

The Tamil Language Bill

It is superfluous to state that the Bill relating to the Tamil Language now before Parliament does not and cannot in the very nature of things satisfy Tamil requirements and opinion. The Language of the Tamil people could with good grace be accorded a place of honour with untrammelled opportunity for national service in the body politic of Ceylon. This place is denied by the proposed bill and the earlier legislation, which contains the seeds of national disunity.

It is wastage of time and energy in the prevailing circumstances, to think of improving the Bill, since the very foundation of the Bill is not acceptable.

It would be the part of wisdom for the Tamil Community to refrain from entering into any controversy over the Bill at the present juncture as the time, conditions and atmosphere are most inopportune for dispassionate consideration of the Language problem and many other similar problems.

It would be prudent to wait for favourable circumstances to consider this issue and work for a practical and flexible scheme whereby Sinhalese Tamil and English would all occupy their due place in our national affairs and national unity be consolidated. Moreover controversy would only add to existing bitterness without achieving any benefit.

This opinion is not applicable to due participation by Tamil members of Parliament in the forthcoming debate. Such of the members as are under detention ought to be given the opportunity to exercise their parliamentary functions on this important occasion. Denial of such right would be a negation of democracy and would be a further step on the road to national disruption

U. S.-Ceylon Commodity Sales Agreement

A commodity sales agreement providing funds for lending in Ceylon by the Export-Import Bank of Washington has been completed by the United States and Ceylon.

Under U. S. Public Law 480 known as the Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act, the rupee equivalent \$1,500,000 to be derived from sales under the commodity sales agreement with Ceylon will be made available to the Export-Import Bank for loans in Ceylon

Under the terms of the agreement the above amount is available by loans from the Export-Import Bank to American or Ceylonese firms to establish facilities in Ceylon for increasing the consumption of the markets for, United States agricultural products. The Export-Import Bank is also prepared to make loans out of this amount to American business firms or branches, subsidiaries or affiliates of such firms in Ceylon for business development and trade expansion in Ceylon

Loans will be made in rupees and repayments may be in rupees. Loans must be approved by the Government of Ceylon and the Export-Import Bank.
