WISE INVESTMENTS AND CAREFUL LENDING

Mark Steady Progress Of Co-op. Bank

(Statement by the President, Mr. A. Arulampalam J. P., at the Annual Meeting of the Jaffna Co-operative Provincial Bank, held on 2-8-58).

I am glad to state that 63 new Societies joined the Bank as members during the year and that as on 30-4-58 there were 1135 Societies and 23 individual members. The turnover of the Bank too increased during the year and we reached the record figure of nearly 135 million rupees.

Marketing loans which were earlier granted by the Director of Food Production are now given by our Bank to the various C. A. P. & S. Societies. The amount given on this account for 3 months is nearly five millions.

The Bank opened a paying office at Paranthan in March 1958 in order to facilitate the monetary operations of Co-operative Societies in the Karachchi area.

The net profits for the year is Rs. 50,639/- and this amount is not high enough from a commercial point of view when we reckon the record turnover of 135 million rupees. But the object of a Co-operative Bank as ours is service and not profits

The introduction of the Debit Tax has had hit many Co-operative Societies and it would not be an over-statement to say that it had somewhat retarded Banking practices.

Our Bank largely depends on the deposits made by our clients for its business. Wise investments and careful lending has made it possible for us to expand our business.

There is plenty of idle money in the country. If Rural Co-op. Societies can attract deposits it will go

a long way to improve their finances and reduce their borrowing from our Bank. In turn we should be able to lend to the many new Multi-Purpose Societies which are fast coming into existence. We urge the elder Societies to build up their own capital and reserves. If a Society is well managed it should be able to conduct its business without outside aid in ten to fifteen years. We commend the ideals of self help, thrift and mutual help to our member societies and impress on them the necessity of reducing the overdue-loans.

On an occasion as this we look back on the service rendered by our past office-bearers. The late Rev. A. A. Ward, Gate Mudlr. V. Ponnampalam, the late Mr. Chellappa of Tholpuram and others helped much to establish and promote this Bank. The late Adigar A. Nagathar was one of our founder members and the first Managing Director of this Bank. His sound common sense and the rich experience which he gained in the National Bank, Kandy stood in good stead in promoting this Co-operative Banking venture in the North. He was our patron during the latter years of his life and gave unstinted practical advice at all times.

The late Mr. Lewis Subramaniam, retired from the Indian Audit Service, and served our Bank as Honorary Manager with great acceptance for nearly ten years. We salute the memory of these two gentlemen. As decided by the Board of Directors we are unveiling the portraits so that their pictures may always inspire us with high ideals for continued

service in the future. I request Mr. K. Alvapillai, Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Food and Agriculture to unveil the portrait of the late Adigar Nagathar and call upon Mr. V. Veerasingham to unveil the portrait of the late Mr. Lewis Subramaniam.

IN THE TEETH OF OPPOSITION

Passing through the most unfortunate period of its history, this country is witnessing strange happenings in all spheres of activities. The chaotic situation in political affairs that was created with the passing of the 'Sinhala only' Act reached a climax when the Prime Minister introduced the Tamil Language (Special Provisions) Bill in cynically strange circumstances. What volume of vehement protest this unusual procedure had provoked could be inferred from the emphatic expression of disgust and disapproval of the entire Opposition in the House of Representatives on August 5. That the Premier who so very feelingly professes to be the custodian of the dignity of democratic institutions should have chosen to introduce a Bill that is both provocative and purposeless, and that at the most inopportune time, confirms the suspicion that with the taste of power of office he has blossomed, perhaps unwittingly, into an uncompromising dictator. This is crudely in conflict with his theoretical passion for human values. Can it be said with any respect for conscience that the Sinhala Only Act read with the Tamil Lan-

Longest Stay With Greatest Acceptance

Farewell To Mr. V. M. Coomarasamy

To-day being the last day when your Honour will be functioning as Permanent Magistrate of our Court, I have been requested by my brother members of the Bar to voice their sentiments on your sudden departure from Point Pedro.

You assumed duties in our Courts about five years ago at a time when it was thought that Point Pedro was a difficult area for any Judicial Officer. Many a Judicial Officer had come to Point Pedro with diffidence but when they returned, they left the place with great satisfaction. In your case you have stayed with us for more than five years which is the largest period a Magistrate has served in our Courts since the establishment of this Court in 1870 save Mr. Kasi Chetty who had functioned for a longer period during the 19th century. It is a unique record that you are the only one who has served for the largest period with the greatest acceptance during the 20th century.

Whenever litigants came to this Court, everyone of them left this Court with the satisfaction that justice was done as right and common sense prevailed in your judgements. You have been a gentleman of great calibre on this Bench. The Lawyers always had the indulgence and courtesy of your Honour. One great factor that it is very

language (Special Provisions) Bill would go even a hair's breadth to redress the grievances of the Tamil speaking people on the issue of Official Language. It is unnecessary for us to recapitulate our views on this subject here as we had, on several occasions, unequivocally stated that only parity of status for Tamil would solve the intriguing problem of racial oppression. However we commend to the leaders of all political parties the proposal of a Round Table Conference, even at this late hour, wherein the entire question may be discussed at length in a spirit of reasonableness and fair-play, provided such a gesture is forthcoming from the Government. A sure and agreeable remedy can then be found for the ills of distrust and discontent.

C. and Mr. C. Sundaralingam made statements to this effect and walked out when the Premier began to speak on the Bill. Earlier the Leader of the C. P. made a similar statement and walked out.

Mr. C. R. Beligammana, Parliamentary Secretary to the Ministry of Cultural Affairs voted against the Bill along with Mrs. K. M. P. Rajaratna and Mr. S. D. Bandaranayaka.
