

Thirukonamalai And Its Temple Of Shiva

From the remotest past materials built the Fort Trinco or Thirukonamalai, has been held sacred to Siva as it is regarded as a part of Southern Kailasa, when Ravana had his capital at Lanka he is said to have worshipped Shiva at Coneswar Temple. A few miles from Coneswar lies Kanniya, named after Ravana's mother whose last rites were said to have been performed there by her son. This is said to be in the Threthayuga millions of years ago. During the latter Dwapara Yuga, Arjuna, one of the Pandava brothers of Mahabaratha fame is said to have visited Trincomalee on pilgrimage before his marriage with Alli, the queen who ruled at Kuthiramalai on the west coast of Ceylon. It may be recalled that Arjuna obtained the powerful weapon "Pasupathasstra" from Lord Siva after performing severe penance in the Himalayas. The purana of Thirukonamalai mentions that this shrine of Coneswar was in the hands of the Pasupathas who form one of the important six sects of Shaivism eg Vama, Vairava, Ahora, Pasupatha, Sathiosada and Isana. In the ancient historical times one Kulakottu Maharaja is said to have rebuilt the Coneswar Temple in the middle of the first millenium of Kaliyuga of which the current year is 5060. The Saiva Saint Thirugnana Sambanda of the 5th century of the Christian Era has sung ten Devarams to Coneswar of Trincomalee. Of these hymns only nine are extant and one is missing now. His description of the Temple and neighbourhood gives a vivid picture of the place. The great devotee of Skanda and author of Thirupugal, St. Arunagiri, (13th or 14th century A. D.) has sung two Thirupugals to the Lord Murugan enthroned at Conamamali. In the 16th century the Portuguese invaders of Ceylon described three temples (pagodas) on the hill at Trincomalee which they destroyed and with their

Fredrick which stands to this day. Their successors the Dutch improved the place. There is a stone column on the hill to indicate the place from which a Dutch damsel committed suicide by jumping into the sea when her lover who forsook her was passing the place in a boat by sea. The Danes and the French too had the place in their hands for short periods. But the British had it till recent times. Their liberal policy enabled the local Hindus to worship at the sites of the old Temples. The spot where the sacred pool stood cannot be fixed with certainty as the place has been filled & levelled. The Theertham was called Papanasasunai. Thus Trincomalee had its Moorthy Sthalam and Theertham and is worthy of being regarded as a hallowed spot on earth. An attempt was made to have it declared a sacred area but without success. All classes of people pay obeisance to the Lord here without distinction of race or religion. To stand on the cliff and gaze out to the sea gives one a sense of awe and reverence. The scenery from the hill top is very pleasant when looking towards the land side. With the discovery of some of the old images which were found buried under the earth an attempt is being made to rebuild the temple to rehabilitate them. The matter is in the hands of a Society and is progressing though not very fast. This noble venture deserves the sympathy and help of all well wishers and devotees of Shiva. The future well being of our people depends on the good deeds of the present generation which is passing through many tribulations. When the Portuguese laid low the old temple it was a very severe blow to our people who were able to stand it by the grace of Shiva Himself who appeared in a dream and asked the chief priest to

Principles & Advantages Of Co-operation

**Mr. V. Veerasingam's Presidential Address
At The Northern Co-op. Federation
Annual Sessions**

A new era is ahead of us. In our efforts towards democratic Socialism, we are trying to achieve in a few years what took centuries for other countries. It is true of the Co-operative Movement also. Democracy grew in other countries for centuries and the Co-operative Movement was able to build on that foundation and provided the necessary training for the inevitable Socialism. In Ceylon democracy is in its infancy in swaddle clothes of heavy Socialism. There is the danger of the infant democracy getting smothered. The Co-operative Movement in India and Ceylon was intended to train the people

Thanks to this Divine guidance the Iswara Temple there grew into a full fledged temple with the necessary appurtenances and endowments so much so that it is a self supporting institution today. To visit the place and to worship in this temple is to be drawn into a very peaceful and ancient atmosphere. But modern problems have not spared even this out of the way shrine. In the present context, with an unfavourable political climate peaceful existence will be a very real asset. May God Shiva grant it. The Raja gopura built recently is a very beautiful and imposing structure adding dignity and grace to the temple. Of what use are these temples if the people cannot make good use of them. If the temple lands and other properties are managed well and the income from them husbanded on proper lines the people living in the neighbourhood will benefit beyond expectations. May God Shiva grant them courage wisdom and ability to live the true lives of His devotees.

in democracy on socialistic lines. The new era in the Co-operative field is being ushered in by the Hon. Minister, creating new problems and new methods of achieving the objects of the Co-operative Movement. We have to co-operate with him and work hundred times harder to achieve democracy and Socialism. It is not an easy task. It is bristling with thorny problems. It is a pity that we had to decide to forgo the usual Conference part of our Convention in which we consider such problems and confine ourselves to the business aspect of the Annual General Meeting. I did not like to give up the Conference and thus fail to consider the various problems facing Co-operation, but I had to bow down to the sincere advice of our experienced men and agree not to discuss such problems under emergency rule for fear of inadvertently referring to prohibited politics, though as a rule, politics is taboo in Co-op. Conferences. For Co-operators, Co-operation is religion, Co-operation is Dharma. Co-operation is democracy but it certainly is not and will not stoop to the level of rabble rousing politics. Co-operators in conference should confine themselves to co-operation alone. It is a sad reflection on our inability to confine ourselves into Co-operative affairs that we had to forgo the Conference and its resolutions.

I am conservative by nature. I like to place before you the problems that confront us as I did in the past without transgressing on prohibited grounds. You have come from Mannar, Mullaitivu, out of your desire to co-operate for the common cause of the Co-op. Movement. I shall be failing in my duty if I do not prepare the ground along with you

for the gradual unfolding of the new Co-operative era. As was pointed out by me through the Co-operative Magazine 'Aikiatheepam', the new era in Ceylon has received its inspiration from India's Rural Credit Survey Report. Let us not be alarmed that the Multi-Purpose Co-op. Societies and the new Co-op. Bank as envisaged by the Minister will sweep out our Co-op. Societies. The various reforms introduced in India aim at strengthening the existing Co-op. Institutions. They cannot but do so. In Ceylon too the new policy has to strengthen the present societies and add more if anything practical and constructive has to be done. Ideology will not permit and Laws will not permit the compulsory liquidation of the present societies. Leaders of India and experts on Co-operation are firm in their affirmation of the ultimate independence of the Co-operative Movement though Government is pouring millions of Rupees into the Movement. Sri Nehru and responsible Ministers have declared often that the ideal of self-help should be emphasised in every Co-operative Society. Sri Nehru has not only regretted that the Government accepted without alteration the report of the Committee on Rural Credit Survey but has warned the officers that they should avoid "Bossism" and allow the members to decide for themselves the course of action in the best democratic manner. He wants the members to be trained by the officers in the democratic way of life.

Sir Malcolm, Co-operative Adviser of the Colombo Plan, has advised against big societies in which members cannot have personal touch very essential for a Co-operative Society. Sri Malavia, President of the All India Co-operative Federation has sounded a warning against the interference of Government with the independence of the Movement and has asked the officers not to make the mistake of thinking

WILDERNESS OF WORDS

In fair political weather or foul, the torrential shower of words is there. The common man who pays for the administration of the country has begun to feel that the return for his contribution is but the echo of empty words. The Premier despite his rich experience in legislative assemblies is himself placing too much emphasis on the eloquence of phraseology and the sting of invectives. The common man who legitimately and reasonably awaits for explanatory statements from Ministers, particularly from the Prime Minister, on the criticisms that are levelled against the Government on the Budget proposals is sadly disappointed to find that the speeches in defence of the Appropriation Bill merely dwell on the history and activities of previous administrations and the fluctuation of the political fortunes of the members of the Opposition.

Criticism of the Budget is in general a challenging demand for a forthright clarification of the economic policy of the Government. The challenge must be met, not by evading the issue and straying into a wilderness of words, but by making a simple and intelligible statement. Wild and withering words cannot develop a country.

The Late Mr. M. Thamocharampillai Chairman U. C. Trincomalee

There passed away on 5-8-58 in his 51st year Mr. Muttukumaru Thamocharampillai, at his residence 'Kalaban' Main Street, Trincomalee surrounded by his relations and friends. He was the Chairman of the Urban Council Trincomalee at the time of his death. By his death Ceylon has lost an ideal citizen and Trincomalee an able administrator who brought to bear his keen businesslike qualities into his civic duties. The Tamil community has lost in him a wise and able leader. During the recent island-wide inter-racial riots of May last it was entirely due to his powerful influence that Trincomalee was completely spared this curse of communal bickerings, so that not a single incident occurred here. He never discriminated between Tamil and Sinhalese, Hindu and Muslim, Christian and Gentile, but treated all alike and had friends among all communities, among his employees are found members of all communities, castes and creeds. He was the proprietor of several concerns among which is the Shyamala Hospital at Uppuveli Trincomalee, run on a utilitarian basis for the benefit of the community at large and not as a mere money making concern.

By profession a businessman, he did not forget his duties to the people of Trincomalee. He took a delight in attending to the comforts of the pilgrims who pass through Uppuveli annually on their way to and from Katarama on foot. Unlike professional politicians he never exploited racial, religious and caste prejudices of the people nor did he pander to their emotions.

He was a true gentleman, a devoted Hindu, an ideal husband, a loving father, a generous friend and always forgiving and considerate to his enemies.

The needy always found prompt response in him whenever they appealed to his generosity.

His loss is mourned by his aged mother, wife and children brothers, sisters, nephews, nieces and a host of relations and friends.

ing that their task is only to register Societies without educating the members in the technique of Co-operation. Hon. Mr. V. K. Menon, Minister of Defence has said that it is essential for the Co-operative Movement, if it is to retain its full value and importance, to encourage social values among members. He emphasises Co-operative Education and the extension of Co-operative principles in other spheres than the mere credit. The Indian Co-operative Movement is being shaped for independence, social value and democracy, the basic elements, without which the Co-operative Movement not function. India wants to evolve socialism through Co-operative institutions raised on the firm foundation of self-help, social morals and democratic ways.
