

## Some Thoughts Re Ceylon's Immediate Future

It is patent that Ceylon is passing through a critical period in her history. While the situation in the recent past and present has been unfortunate, we have to be thankful that things are not worse. It would be the duty of all Ceylonese to do their best to bring about an improvement in the situation. It will however be difficult to bring about any change for the better unless fundamentals are kept in mind and acted upon.

1. Peace and inter communal co-operation are indispensable for the internal stability of the country and its freedom from external aggression. They are also necessary for the welfare of every single community.

2. The Independence that Ceylon regained has to be retained and all communities should strive for this ideal.

3. There are at present great differences of opinion on communal, linguistic, and economic and other matters. All these have to be solved through peaceful, constitutional and democratic methods. The use of force will have to be ruled out. Civil disobedience, boycott, hartals and non-co-operation are best normally avoided in view of the prevailing political, social and economic conditions and possible repercussions, apart from their inherent infirmities. These methods generally tend to the creation and accentuation of ill will. Ill will is subversive of goodwill and peace, without goodwill and peace no country or community can exist.

4. The method of peaceful and friendly persuasion even if it takes some time is very much to be preferred to any other method for the solution of Ceylon's political problems. Results achieved through peaceful persuasion and not through the exercise of pressure except the appeal to reason will bring permanent and wholesome results to our country with its heterogeneous population.

5. The present constitu-

tion of Ceylon requires radical changes if Ceylon is to be a united, prosperous and happy country. But even these constitutional changes will have to be achieved by the method of peaceful persuasion and not through

the methods of civil disobedience, boycott and non co-operation.

6. Divergence of opinion regarding the position of the Tamil language in the scheme of things in Ceylon exists. There is also divergence of opinion relating to the use of English and Sinhalese. A flexible and constructive scheme whereby all three languages could be enabled to contribute their best towards national welfare should be gradually evolved. The matter of language is a vexed problem in Ceylon, though it need not have assumed the serious proportions it has been allowed to assume.

7. Ceylon is in a period of transition in all spheres of life—religious, intellectual, social, linguistic, industrial, agricultural, educational and political. Things are changing. Values are changing. The world itself is changing. Ceylon cannot expect to be an exception. Changes suitable to the genius and requirements of our people have to be found.

8. Changes could be achieved only through the method of evolution and not through revolution. The method of trial and error is unavoidable in the circumstances. Patience and balanced judgment are necessary.

9. The ideal of co-existence has also to be practised fully if the country is to develop into any degree of contentment and stability.

10. Propaganda is urgently necessary for removing the very dense clouds of misunderstanding that exist among the people particularly the Tamil people and the Sinhalese people. Steps have

to be taken to carry on this propaganda through the press, suitable publications, conferences, study circles goodwill missions and similar mediums. In this connection the following extract from an ancient religious book is very apposite:—

"The Teaching to fellow beings of what is beneficial must be done in a non-violent manner. He who desires Dharma, should employ his words sweetly and finely"

Manu-Smriti;

11. The aftermath of the recent civil commotion has to be got over. A change in the attitude of a considerable number of our people of all communities is the sine qua non for the happiness and prosperity of the country.

1. An opportunity for co-operation between the various communities will present itself in connection with the work of the Reform of the Constitution to report on which subject a Joint Parliament Committee has been appointed—This is perhaps the most important event in constitutional affairs since the inauguration of the Soulbury Constitution and the present Constitution. It is trusted that all sections of the people will bend their energies, in a spirit of co-operation and make possible certain progressive and helpful changes in the Constitution of the Country—at least lay the foundations for a better state of affairs, since the Constitution of a country is one of its greatest assets.

13. A re-orientation of policy on the part of Ceylon's political organizations, parties, politicians and publicists is urgently required. This orientation will have to be gradual in the nature of things, as Power and Prestige are proud and slow to make room for Wisdom and Goodness. It is vital to remember that the labours of our political parties and have brought the country and all its communities to the brink of a very serious catastrophe. A re-orientation is sorely

## Katragama And Skanda

From time immemorial pilgrims flock to Katragama during the Esala season and for the Ilmaha or Karthikai festival. The Esala festival lasts over a fortnight beginning with the new moon and ending with the Theertham or Dya Kepeima on the day after the full moon of the month of Eshala or Adi when the sun is in the zodiacal sign of Kataka or Cancer. Often rains come on the Theertham day to signify the blessing of the gods. This festival is called Adivel by the Tamils who hold Skanda, the God of Katragama, in great veneration as He is their patron God and Teacher. On Wesak day The "Kap" tree is planted in the sacred shrine of Skanda at Katragama and the pilgrims from the north of Ceylon gather at Wattapalai in the Mullaitivu District at the temple dedicated to Pathini Devi or Kannagai Amman in whose honour a great Pongal ceremony is held on the previous night. From here the pilgrims, young and old, male and female, rich and poor high and low all trek on foot southwards in batches. They cross Kokilai and keep to the coast halting at Kovils and Madams for the night on their way. The inhabitants of the towns and villages through which these pilgrims pass vie with one another in feeding these pilgrims as an act of great merit. Pilgrims from these areas also join to swell their numbers. Kuchaveli, Nilaveli, Uppuveli, Trincomalee, Verugal Valaichenai, Karaitivu, Kathankudy, Akkaraipattu, Pottuvil, Thirukovil, Panama and Uhande are some of the places where these devout pilgrims halt. In all these places there are temples dedicated to God Skanda where festivals are held. The feeling of fellowship among the pilgrims is genuine. From Ukande they proceed to Kumune then on to Yala, Katragama and on to Katragama which they often reach before the beginning of the festival.

After the festivals are over they retrace their steps back to their homes through the same route. Many a pilgrim falls a prey to malaria and other illness; a few die but the survivors always long to repeat the pilgrimage as their physical, mental and spiritual experiences are inestimable. For the Tamil Saivite Skanda is the most tangible manifestation of the Divine and is Siva Himself. To worship Him is to worship the Supreme Lord (Parameswara) Himself. He illumines our minds, showers spiritual grace and saves us from perdition. A master Gnani full of affection and love to His devotees one has only to shout out Muruka once and He is there to succour His devotee an unfailing living God who though formless (Arupa) assumes form (Rupa) to save the devotee. Many a devotee will recount many an instance where the Lord rendered service to His devotee. True to His nature He does not discriminate as to race, religion, colour or caste. It may be recalled that during the Esala period the people of Ruhuna clean their houses, give up eating meat, light lamps to the God calling the period as Sudda Poya in the clean purva paksha full moon etc. At Katragama, Tamil and Sinhalese, Hindu and Buddhist, all join in worship and adoration of the Lord in His universal aspect. The atheist Buddhist worships him as a superhuman being capable of granting favours. Vows are made and paid. The Hindu worships Him as the Son of Siva, the Saviour of Gods and men, the illuminator of the mind, the great physician who can cure the ills of the body, mind and soul and conferrer of Divine Bliss. His Sakthis are Valli (Icha) Thevasena (Kirya) and Vel (Gnana). He is a perpetual Virgin youth (Sanat Kumara) and as an example of true wedded life, He has ever been true to Valli and never forsook Her for a moment. What Valli is to us human

### WHAT IS NATIONAL UNITY?

RENT asunder as the world is, there is a desperate attempt to bring about unity. Similarly in countries that are disrupted by the eruption of communal feelings, well-meaning leaders strive to work for national unity. The exact significance of national unity was explained by Mr. V. K. Krishna Menon, Minister for Defence in the Union of India, while delivering the Convocation Address of the University of Madras on Tuesday. The occasion was very appropriate as the call to the people to preserve national unity was made at an assembly of University graduates. Inviting the young graduates to examine the problem quietly and scientifically, Mr. Menon answered the question 'what is it that makes the nation' thus:

"It is not the similarity of the clothes that we wear. It is not our food habits. It is certainly not the language and not even the religion. It is only a sense of belonging to this country that is the basis of our nationalism. (italics are ours.) It is this living sense of national unity that will enable us to survive as a people in dignity."

National Unity is an ideal that can be achieved only by true patriotic feelings. Patriotism is zealotness for one's country's freedom or rights. No nation can be said to have full freedom unless all the people forming that nation have in them the spontaneous feeling of their belonging to the country fully.

If the leaders of the different political parties

will only endeavour to be patriotic in the strictest sense in all their activities, the canker of communalism can be easily rooted out. And it will be easy for the common man to emulate truly patriotic leaders and work for the preservation of National Unity

needed if Ceylon is to survive.

14. A changed mentality is indispensable. Without such a change, changes in the material plane be they political or economic or inter-communal cannot be expected. For such changes to germinate and flower unilateral efforts are of the essence of the situation. Let us not look for reciprocal results. If we look for reciprocal results, no good can result and we will reap further harvests of sorrow.

15. An appeal to the religious instinct of the people of Ceylon belonging to all creeds is one sure foundation on which the future edifice of Ceylon's prosperity could be built. The message has come to us through the ages.

"Hatred does not cease by hatred, hatred only ceases by love, so have the ancient sages said."

It is interesting and useful to note that Lord Buddha from the text of the saying repeats an idea which was "handed from the "ancient sages"—Hindu sages.

beings Theva Sena is to the devas (God) or celestial beings. He is the teacher of Pranava, the sacred word. He combines the power of His Mother, Parvathi, with the Gnana of His Father, Siva and with them forms the Somaskanda Murhurta. The Skanda purana gives a good description of Him and Kumara Tantra lays down rules and directions for His worship. He is Subramania of the Brahmans and Murugan of the Tamils. Although each temple has its own fast and feast days it would be well for all devotees of Skanda to celebrate His festivals in Adi and in Thai ending with the full moon in each occasion viz. Adi Vel and Thai Poosam. Those that cannot attend Kataragama temple can observe their vows, fasts and devotions, in their local temples in Ceylon and India. As the Lord of Kali-Yuga He is worthy of worship, prayer and penance. He prefers the simple unsophisticated Veddah's puja to our elaborate rituals. It is the heart that counts and not anything else.
