Appreciation — Problems Of Poverty And Mahabaratha

Sir,
Permit me to express sincere appreciation of the two well written articles viz: Problems of Poverty and Mahabaratha — Battle of Life which appeared in the last issue of your journal. Here I wish to set down certain thoughts of mine caused by reading of these.

I would define poverty as the inability to enjoy the so called comforts of life to the extent one would wish to. In its mental aspect it is the inability to satisfy fully one's aspirations in the social and professional spheres. Thus poverty becomes an all-embracing and highly relative concept. The strug-

gle for existence is really a mental attitude — an effort to distinguish oneself from others so as to win recognition and acclamation from them. If men instead of spurning free gifts of nature and scorning simple ways of living, live and let live in the true Hindu way, the feeling of being poor can be greatly diminished. The physical need for food is really hunger. It is the feeling that others have more to eat and similar mental concepts that constitutes poverty. Herein comes the importance of spiritual upliftment of the common man and organised private charity. To Hindus the

nobleness of charity has been evident all along, yet something is lacking today that they are not giving full practical expression to the genuine sympathy for these less fortunate than themselves — a feeling which all normal human beings possess by virtue of their inborn social instinct. Alterations in eating habits (Diversification of food stuffs, reduction in quantity and frequency of meals) and the like may help to combat the food shortage. Collectively, science at international level may come to man's rescue should the struggle for life become a struggle for food. In short all of us have a role to play in easing the burden of poverty in this Island paradise of ours.

The article on the Maha Bharata is what is wanted as this juncture in our lives when all around darkened faces betray hidden worries. Dr. Ramanathan has shown, clearly the spiritual concepts behind the Bharata — a work which can be read for its literary value as well. I earnestly pray that more of your readers would give up looking upon religion as an ideal topic for philosophical discussion but treat and adopt it as a noble way of life and a great search for divine Truth and Bliss.

I am forced to stop here. However in conclusion let me thank Muhandram Rasiah and Dr. Ramana than for their enlightening articles and add that contributions of this kind are very welcome in these days of cheap journalism where much of what is printed and read need be neither printed nor read.

THE TERROR OF T. B.

THE alarming state of the incidence of Tuberculosis in Jaffna can be gauged from the statistics that were quoted by the M. O. H. of Jaffna, in the course of his speech at a public meeting in connection with the Flag-day Campaign of the Ceylon National Association for the Prevention of Tuberculosis. It is a miserable plight for Jaffna that the mortality due to T. B. has reached the menacing average of one thousand for twelve months. If despite the greatest benefits that medical science has produced upon mankind, Jaffna is unable to check the spread of T. B., the situation must be considered to be very grave.

The warning that was sounded by the Government Agent and the medical Officers at the meeting of the C. N. A. P. T., we are confident, will make the people realise their perilous plight. The fight against T. B. essentially may be a matter for medical practitioners. But it must be understood that it forms an important and urgent part of social service. There is no village in the Jaffna District that has neither a Community Centre nor a Rural Development Society having as its object the promotion of the welfare of the people. These Community Centres

and Rural Development Centres obtain grants from the Government. Cannot these associations work for the checking of the spread of T. B. in their areas by assisting the medical authorities in the preventive work? The propaganda for the prevention of T. B. must be undertaken by every society that comes under the category of social service. Financial aid to T. B. patients also requires the assistance of the public.

Rural development cannot be achieved in villages if the people are abandoned to their fate in fighting T. B. themselves. Of what avail can social service and welfare work be if dreadful diseases are allowed to spread in the villages?

The Association for the Prevention of T. B. and Medical Officers of Health will do well to call upon Community Centres and Rural Development Societies to render assistance in the fight for saving Jaffna District from the terror of T. B.

'Sinhala in Rio'

Sir, An Evening Paper, under the caption "They speak 'Sinhalese' down in Rio", informs us of the surprise that overtook Mr. P. G. Ariyadasa and his fellow delegates at hearing certain words which they considered Sinhalese, spoken in Rio de Janeiro.

If the delegates had stepped into Jaffna or been in a Tamil home nearer, they would have heard the same words in slightly different guise,

1. Kalisanak (S) is Kalisan in (T).
2. Kopayak (S) is Kopay in (T)
3. Sapathu (S) is Sapathu in (T)
4. Peerisyak (S) is Peelish in (T)
5. Thay (S) is Thay in (T)

The first four pairs of

words are the Sinhalese and Tamilised forms respectively of the Portuguese terms for 'Trousers', 'Cup', 'Shoe' and 'Saucer', while 'THAY' is the ceylonised term used for the English word 'Tea'.

Incidentally, the Portuguese were in Rei de Janeiro earlier than in Ceylon. S. J. G.

Dr. C. Amirthalingam's Departure To U. K.

Sir, Dr. C. Amirthalingam was Principal of Rabula Vidyalaya, Matara, for a brief period before he entered Public Service as Asst. Marine Biologist and later became Director of Fisheries. It was, in fact, he who laid the foundation for the future greatness of this flourishing Buddhist educational institution of to-day.

As the Head of a neighbouring School which looked upon Rabula Vidyalaya as a rival Institution, I would well remember, how, many of us admired as well as envied, the relentless energy and devotion with which he transformed a hitherto unknown School into the most progressive Buddhist educational centre in the District.

Dr. Amirthalingam was, at the same time, the Head of the tha Vidyalaya.

With that disarming wit and sunny laughter of 'Amir', and his sincerity of purpose, he won over every one interested in Education in Matara, and the rivalry of the 'big Schools' in the area became one of healthy emulation.

I should add that it was not wholly voluntarily that he bade goodbye to Rabula, for what some might imagine, 'a more lucrative and safe job'. His resignation was characteristic of his sturdy independence of mind which is incapable of tolerating any allegiance, political or communal, interfering with his personal judgment.

By the departure of Dr. & Mrs. Amirthalingam and their children to U. K. for good, Ceylon will be losing another live cell which would have, certainly, contributed to the vitality of this country.

One sometimes wonders whether we who are left behind by such as these are merely 'the select' many who are fit to survive in this breezy isle to build its future!
