We too have our due share of thoughtless readers as the West has, and in seeking to disprove everything Miss Mayo has written, we shall make the reading public believe that we are a race of perfect human beings, against whom nothing can be said, no one can dare say one word. The agitation against the book is in danger of being overdone. There is no cause for fury I close the review with a paraphrase of a beautiful couplet from Tulsidas: -

"Everything created by God, animate or inanimate, has its good side bad alone "
