SABHAI SELECTS SIDDHANTHA SCHOLAR

Proctor Nagalingam Becomes President

At a meeting of the Committee of Management of the Jaffna Saiva Paripalana Sabhai held at the Navalar Ashram Hall on Sunday October 20, Proctor V. Nagalingam of Vaddukodai was elected President in the vacancy caused by the untimely passing away of Sivaperiaval Mutusamipillai.

Mr. Nagalingam was one of the few Scholars from

Jaffna who enjoyed the honour of presiding over the Saiva Siddhantha Conference organized by the Saiva Siddhantha Sangam of South India. He was associated with the late Proctor M. Thiruvilangam in the editing of a commentary on 'Ivapragasam' Sivagnana Siddhar and other Siddhantha works.

There was no contest for the presidentship.

GANDHI CENTENARY OBSERVED IN WASHINGTON

The Mahatma Gandhi centenary celebrations were initiated at the Andrew Rankin Memorial Chapel of Howard University Wednesday, with several prominent speakers commemorating the event.

Indian Ambassador to the United States, Nawab Ali Yavar Jung, opened the commemoration ceremony and paid tribute to the Indian freedom leader "who had friends all over here in the United States". He explained that "actually this is the 89th birthday anniversary that begins October 2, 1968 and ends

with the centenary October 2, 1969."

Deputy Prime Minister of India, Shri Morarji Desai, in the principal address, said "the significance of this centenary celebration is, in my view, very great not merely for India, but for all of human society". He added:

"This is not an ordinary centenary which is being celebrated in connection with many incidents or persons, but it is a centenary of a person who lived and embodied in his life the requirements and also the fulfillment of human aspiration for the whole world."

Congressman James G. Fulton, Republican of Pennsylvania, who said he personally was deeply influenced by a family background of missionaries who travelled and lived in India and other Asian countries, told the audience of some 300 that "we are all disciples of Gandhi" and that "everyone of us has been influenced by him."

The Congressman described the Indian philosopher and disciple of peace and freedom as "an outstanding 20th century

He cautioned that life is much more than "success" in the world. "It is," he said, dedication to principle just as Gandhi dedicated himself."

KONESWARAM

It is not surprising that from the remotest period similar gods and goddesses were worshipped in South India and Ceylon. The early Tamils worshipped Murukan and Siva on the tops of hills and mountains. So we find Kalastri, Tiruvannamalai, Palani, Swami Malai, Tiruthany and Tirupparankuntram as ancient places of worship. In Ceylon too ancient places of Saiva worship are on the hills and mountains as Konamalai, Kathiramalai, Ugarthamalai, Kandaswamymalai, Keerimalai, Sivanolipadam and Kudiramalai (Asuvagiri). Of these Konamalai holds an esteemed position among the sacred places of Ceylon.

The traditions of Koneswaram are closely associated with the epic king Ravana. The great sage Agastya after performing penance at Vetharaniam in South India continued it at Tirukarasai on the banks of the Mahaveli Ganga where a temple was founded to Lord Parameswara. Later Agastya repaired to Koneswaram and after receiving the Lord's blessings proceeded to Thuvaddapuri to worship the Lord Ketheeswarar. One fact is clear from the story of Agastya that before his time Koneswaram and Tiruketheeswaram had already been in existence. The stories of Agastya are based on historical memories. These stories are the outcome of the large movements of the Aryanization of South India and Ceylon. It is the opinion of some historians that Aryanization of South India began about 1000 B. C and reached its completion before the fourth century B. C. These facts help us to form a correct perspective of the founding of the temples.

A Tamil inscription that was found in the Koneswaram Temple before it was destroyed by Constantine de Sa in 1624

gives the story of the founding of the temple. It was translated by the most learned native and certified by an Ouviador (Magistrate of Ceylon) and sent to His Majesty the King of Portugal. The translation reads as follows: "Manica Raja Bau, Emperor of this Lancasue erected this Pagoda to the God Vidiam-Manda in the year... (according to reckoning it comes to be 1300 years before the coming of Christ). There will come a nation called the Franks who will destroy it and there will be no King in this island to rebuild it once more". This translation was found in Codex 51 VIII-40 in the Ajuda Library of Lisbon (Journal of the Ceylon Branch Royal Asiatic Society Vol. XXX No. 80, p. 449). There is no God as Vidiam-Manda. The Tamil words must be Vedium Matthalium Mandapum - premises edifices and halls the builder dedicated unto the Lord. As the French were well known in Syria, the people of the East called all Europeans with some corruption of Franguis. The Portuguese themselves were impressed by this prophecy.

Writing of events in the fourth century the author of the Mahavamsa says: "The King (Mahasena) built also the Manihira - vihara and founded three viharas destroying temples of the Brahmanical gods: the Gokanna Vihara and another vihara Erakavilla and a third in the village of the Brahman Kalanda". (Mv. Geiger Chap. 37 V. 41). All these places were in the Eastern Coasts.

The author of the Yalpana Vaipava Malai who had no knowledge of the Mahavamsa and the chronology of the rulers of Anuradhapura says, that during the reign of King Pandu in the Saka era 358 (436 A. C.) Kulakodan, a Chola Prince repaired to Trincomalee and (Continued on page 2)

REBUFF TO RELIGIOUS STUDIES

To the already confused state of indecision and erroneous conclusions of those who have been entrusted with the educational progress of this country the slap in the face of those students who had earlier been selected for admission to the Universities merely because they had the strength of mind to study and offer 'Hinduism' or 'Islam' for the entrance examination adds ridicule. All the year round political leaders shout from house tops that religious studies should enjoy pride of place. But these pseudo-patriots all the time know that there is a Minister of Education who can be depended upon to do the damage without anyone suggesting it to him.

The National Council of Higher Education which is but a creation of the ever-erring Minister has no effective voice in matters vitally concerning the educational progress of the nation. Subjects like Hinduism and Islam have been recognized for instruction in the universities but when it comes to the all important question of eligibility for Higher Education the rough hand of irresponsible leadership puts the brake on those who have the courage of their conviction to list those who have secured sufficiency on the basis of the earlier recognition as fit for admission to the universities.

Our concern for the recognition of Hinduism and Islam for Higher Education is not because that we are in duty bound to propagate religious studies but because we believe that true education requires a deep knowledge of religion. The philosophy of religion is greater in its content than any other subject. No true educationist can dare discredit the study of religion at the university level. We are certainly conscious of the fact that

in our country education is being treated with utter indifference. To the ablest and the most academically qualified Member of Parliament should be assigned this all-important subject of education. The Premier who has done very well in inspiring his colleagues in the Cabinet with appropriate advice should pay greater attention to the course of education in order that the economic regeneration might have high educational efficiency for its background. To achieve this the selection of admissions to the Universities should be properly supervised and the approved syllabus of studies should be respected.

TIRUMALA-TIRUPATI DEVASTHANAMS: TIRUPATI

We publish below the copy of a letter which was addressed to Dr. S. Rajaratnam of Kockuvil re miracle of a snake at the Thirupathi Temple.

"There are some false rumours being spread through pamphlets in Telugu, Tamil, Kannada, and other languages in South India that a Snake entered into the Garbhagriha of Sri Venkateswara swami vari temple at Tirumala (Tirupati) transformed itself into an old man, spoke to the employees and other persons present there, and then again transformed itself into a snake and disappeared. The devotees of Lord Venkateswara are hereby informed that there is no truth whatsoever in these rumours and they are requested not to be misled by them".

restored the temple. The Pandu Kings ruled at Anuradhapura from 433 to 460 A. C. The building of the temple by Kulakodan is supported by the lithic record that is now at the entrance to Fort Frederick.

Daksina Kailasa Manmiam which is a section of the great Skanda Puranam (Sanskrit) of the fifth century gives a general survey of Hinduism in Ceylon. It says that from very ancient times nine sacred shrines were famous for the Hindus; of these seven are in India and two in Ceylon namely Koneswaram and Tiruketiswaram.

In the seventh century St. Sambandar, one of the four Saiva Saints had sung the praises of this temple. The Pallavas also seem to have taken great interest in the temple for some of the Sanskrit inscriptions unearthed in the Trincomalee District are in the Pallava Grantha script. From the pillars and decorated stones that were found in the fort area we have to infer that the temple might have been rebuilt by the Pallavas.

Vira Pandyan invaded Ceylon about 1263 and after his victory, he left his ensign the double fish at the main entrance of the sacred building. This can still be seen at the entrance to the fort. (University History of Ceylon Vol. I Part II page 625).

Later the Arya Chakravarties of Jaffna took some special interest in the temple. One of the kings caused the Daksina Kailasa Puranam (Tamil) to be composed in praise of Lord Koneswaram. According to Konesar Kalveddu one king Gaja Babu made endowments to the temple. It was under the direct management of the Vanniya Chieftains of Trincomalee until the advent of the Portuguese. These Chieftains were under the suzerainty of the Kings of Jaffna and sometimes independent. (Yalpana Vaipira Malai page 11).

The Vanniya Chieftains of the North gave each a portion of their revenue to the temple. (Yalpana Vaipira Malai page 12).

The books which deal with the story of the temple are Daksina Kailasa Puranam, Tirukonasa Anthathy etc., Arunagiri Swamigal of the fifteenth century has sung the praises of this holy shrine. Kathiramalai Pallu says about it and

Paralai Venayagar Pallu also refers to it. References have been made of the shrine in many other works.

Most of the Tamil works call Koneswaram as Daksina (South) Kailayam. Mt. Kailas is known as Uttara (North) Kailayam. One is in the Mountain and one is in the sea. It is interesting to note that Mt. Kailas and Trincomalee are in the same meridian. The Buddhists of Tibet used to go on pilgrimage to Mt. Kailas as the Hindus.

De Queyros an eminent Portuguese historian says that the temple was the 'Rome of the Orient' and was more frequented by pilgrims than Rameswaram or Jaganath in Puri (De Queyros Book II page 236).

About this great shrine the same book says: 'Over that large harbour (Trincomalee) there juts out from the land into the sea a rock on which the Kings of Ceylon erected three pagodas two at the extremities of the hill overhanging the sea and one in the middle and the highest point which was the principal one and one of the most venerated in India' (De Queyros Book I - page 66).

Constantine De Sa in 1624 demolished the temple of a 'Thousand Columns' in order to employ its material for the building of the fort. It would have been a venerable relic of Hindu antiquity in this Island had not the Portuguese destroyed it. Some of the images of this sacred edifice were taken to Thambalagamam where later a temple was erected by Rajasinha II. (Konasala Puranam).

Our thanks are to Mike Wilson and Rodney Jonkias two great underwater explorers who discovered the ruined temple below the sea. The stone column that was salvaged by them might be the 'Lingam' of the old Koneswaram temple. From 1944 many images of this ancient Shrine have been unearthed from different parts of the fort area. In 1950 three images of Siva Parvati and Chandrasegaram came to light just in time to satisfy the long felt yearning of Ceylon Saivites to rebuild the historic temple. So far no images of Skanda have been unearthed in the precincts of the temple. This in brief is the story of the temple.
