SIVAN TEMPLE

RATNASABAPATHY WIJAYA INDRA

One of the chief contributory causes of the present tragic downfall of the Tamils in general and the Hindus in particular in the North, is due to the callous and wanton neglect and indifference of the Hindus of Jaffna and in the North of their Premier, Ancient and one-time venerated Vannarponnai Sivan Temple which has been mismanaged in the past for many decades and allowed to go into rack and ruin. In spite of the well-known fact that this Sivan Temple is one of the richest and well-endowed Temples in the North with widespread properties and madama buildings and paddy lands endowed, gifted and bequeathed to the Temple, not only in Ceylon but in India and Chidambaram as well, the temple's management in the long past was said to have been notorious in their wanton wastage of temple properties, and living a life unworthy of the founder of the temple thereby neglecting and failing to maintain, rebuild and renovate temple buildings which required prompt attention. The Gopuram was demolished about 21 years ago under the pretext of building a new one which has still not been done. This sad and depressing spectacle of our ancient Sivan Temple at Vannarponnai without its Gopuram, in the Heart of Jaffna (Yalpanam), which is the Central Seat and Headquarters of the Tamils in Ceylon, has been very demoralising to all the Tamils of Jaffna and to the Hindu youth of Jaffna who daily pass the temple with bowed-heads in sorrow and humiliation at the sight of their Ancestral Sivan Temple standing there, headless as it looks, without its Gopuram. This is undoubtedly a very sad, depressing and humiliating sight, to every Hindu and to every genuine thorough-bred Jaffna Tamil who knows the truth and the undisputable and unchallengeable fact that every Tamil was originally a Hindu and worshipped the Lord God Siva as his one and only God, Creator and Protector and Ultimate Refuge.

It is therefore my humble submission, that until and unless the Hindus and Tamils of Jaffna realise this Vital and Fundamental Fact and rise as a united body to force the management to take immediate steps to rebuild, renovate, resuscitate and revive this ancient Sivan Temple at Vannarponnai, with a new and magnificent Gopuram of which every Hindu and Tamil will be proud, the Tamils are doomed and they will never be able to raise their heads again and fight for their lost freedoms from their oppressors and tormentors, who are slowly but surely encroaching on and denying them their Fundamental and Language rights even in the Tamilian North and East of Ceylon.

The Tamils and Hindus of Jaffna should not only take steps to have this ancient Sivan Temple restored to its former glory but also get the Vannarponnai Sivan Temple area declared a sacred area, and get the whole adjoining and surrounding areas cleaned-up and purified, and thereafter arrange for all the ancient and religious, Hindu sacred poojabs, and religious practices to be systematically and scrupulously observed and conducted. Then and then only will the blessings of our Lord God Siva be showered on the Hindus and on the Tamils, and we will be able to raise our heads and rise as a United and Respected Tamil Nation in Ceylon

RAJAJI'S COMMENTS

(FROM THE SWARAJYA)

Medical opinion has to some extent been effective in Western countries and British and American cigarette smokers are going down in number. But in India there is a steady increase in the number of people indulging in this habit. The Surgeon-General of the U. S. A. has recently, expressed his opinion that the warning on cigarette packets printed as ordered by Government is not good enough. Cigarette smoking is hazardous to health according to him, and the warning that it may be hazardous to health is not in accordance with up-to-date medical opinion. One of the contributory causes for early deaths is according to him the cigarette habit. Everyone in India knows that the drink habit is a contributory cause for premature deaths, and that moderate drinking easily grows into heavy drinking without the victim realizing it. But the cigarette smoking people in India have not realized what their addiction can lead to. Parents should realize that they cannot indulge in the habit and keep their boys and girls out of the evil, which is hazardous to health according to the Surgeon-General of America. We have large communities in India who have inherited the priceless inheritance of aversion for fleshy food, alcoholic drinks and smoking. This abstinence and aversion should be maintained made to cover more and more people instead of being undermined by the infection of drinkers, smokers and non-vegetarians. The policy of social reform which our ancestors believed in was example at the higher levels and lifting up the lower level individuals to follow that example and acquire a higher status in public estimation. LANKA AYURVEDA MEDICAL COLLEGE

Sir,—I am directed by the North Ceylon Board of Indigenous Medicine, Jaffna to request you to kindly publish the under-noted in your esteemed journal:-

The Lanka Ayurvedic Medical College, Jaffna founded in 1925 is the oldest teaching Institution in the Island. This was given recognition by Government in 1951 but later this was withdrawn. For the past two years, correspondence — to once again recognise our Ayurvedic College—passed between us and the Commissioner of Ayurveda without any satisfactory results.

As soon as Mr. Nawagamuwa assumed duties as Commissioner of Ayurveda, he suggested that a deputation from Jaffna should meet the Ayurvedic Medical Council in Colombo and discuss the matter. Accordingly a deputation headed by Muhandiram E. P. Rasiah, (the Hon'y Secretary) met the Ayurvedic Medical Council and placed their case before them. After a few more meetings, where Muhandiram Rasiah addressed the members in Sinhalese, he was able to convince the Council that Jaffna's request was fair and reasonable.

The Commissioner of Ayurveda, by his letter No. 309 of 9th October, has communicated the decisions of the Medical Council. It contains certain solutions which are quite acceptable to the North Ceylon Board of Indigenous Medicine.

We offer our thanks publicly to the Commissioner of Ayurveda and through him to the Ayurvedic Medical Council for solving this long-standing knotty problem in a fair and just manner.

Registration of Passed Out Students of the Lanka Ayurvedic College-Jaffna

Reference representations made by the North Ceylon Board of Indigenous Medicine, Jaffna on the above subject.

The Ayurvedic Medical Council interviewed a deputation of the North Ceylon Board of Indigenous Medicine regarding this matter at its meeting held on 29-6-1968 and it appointed a sub-committee to study this matter and make its recommendations. Muhandiram E. P. Rasiah who led this deputation too, was appointed a member of this sub-committee. The Ayurvedic Medical Council at its meeting held on 30-9-68 considered the report submitted by this sub-committee and confirmed the following recommendations in respect of the registration of graduates of the Lanka Ayurveda College, Jaffna:-

- (1) As the Lanka Ayurveda College is the oldest Institution of its kind which enjoyed govt. recognition for a long time and the Gampaha Siddha Ayurveda College has also been recognised for the purpose of registration of its graduates, the students who pass the Final examination of the Lanka Ayurveda College, Jaffna shall be registered as practitioners of Ayurveda after an oral examination conducted by the Ayurvedic Medical Council for the purpose till such time the proposed Siddha College in Jaffna is established.
- (2) Age limit enforced in respect of registration of physicians shall not apply to graduates of the Lanka Ayurveda College.
- (3) Registrar of the Govt. College of Ayurveda shall go to Jaffna and

THE MUNICIPAL MARCH PAST!

After an inflicted break of more than two years, the Jaffna Municipal Council is on the eve of being restored to activity. The first step has been taken with the nomination of candidates to the enlarged Municipal Council. Though the Municipal Area remains the same wards have been increased to twenty three by carving out additional seats in a scheme of re-distribution and readjustment.

It was not surprising to see over-exhibited enthusiasm in the Urban voters presenting nomination papers. The element of astonishment lay in the fact that the political parties which jointly and severally take pride in asserting representative character could not find sufficient supporters who were prepared to show the courage of their conviction by standing for election as party candidates. On the other hand the inevitable group of independents has emerged as the numerically superior brand of would be City Fathers. The exercise of extra precaution to put up contests in every ward, however, appeared to have been out-manoeuvred with the result that two wards were able to return uncontested City Fathers.

In any event the elections cannot mean anything substantial to the rate-payer unless the new set up will be competent and capable enough to create a new outlook of Municipal administration. Enlargement of the Council by itself cannot help cleansing the Augean Stables; not even a fuller representation of all interests can do so. The City must justify the pride of place it occupies in the statistical estimate of priority. Spacious streets, luminous lighting, clean conservancy—these are what the Urban citizens urge for and legitimately should enjoy. Equally urgent is the

Sir,—

Regarding the request by a reader in the press for information on the origin and definition of the land measure termed the "Kuli", I would refer to Volume 2, of Lands, Maps and Surveys published by Government and the transactions of the Engineering Association of 1936.

According to Lands, Maps and Surveys, mentioned above, "The unit of lineal measure was the hasta or cubit, i.e. one span or 9 inches; two hastas making one bamba. or mullam (Tamil) i.e., the average length from tip of finger to elbow. In the ancient system prevailing in S. I., the unit was the royal feet (Sri-Pada). These units were nevertheless identical since a human span and human feet were generally taken to be equal, averaging about 9 inches. The Indian surface measure based on the lineal unit, when measured by a rod of 16 spans at right angles, constituted a kuli or about 144 square feet of land.

A hundred kulies made one Ma, and 20 Mas constituted what was called a Veli. This measure has largely influenced the system persisting down to the present times in the Tamil Districts of Ceylon. (Hindu Administration in South India—Survey and Settlement by Rao Bahadur K. Iyengar)."

Lineal measure of the ancient Tamils:—

- 8 Anu (atom) = 1 Therthugal (dustparticle), sic .000045 in.
8 Therthugal = 1 Immi (seed of a kind of grass)
8 Immi = 1 Ellu (ginger seed)
8 Ellu = 1 Nellu (paddy seed)
4 Nellu = 1 Viral (finger)
4 Viral = 1 Pidi (closed fist)
6 Pidi = 1 Karam (hand)
2 Karam = 1 Siru Kole (small pole)
2 Sirukole = 1 Thanu (bow length)
2 Thanu = 1 Kole or Thandam (pole)
2000 Thandam = 1 Kurosam
4 Kurosam = 1 Yosana

Accepting 'akaram' as about 18 inches in length, a kole is 12 feet in length, which is approximately the usual unit for land measure (1 kuli = 1 sq 'kole' or 'thandam

Evidence of the use of this system of measure in the 13th and 14th Century is found in a Tamil inscription of that period, on a stone pillar in the compound of a Sivan Temple at Kankuveli village in the Kottiyar Pattu, Trincomalee District. It registers a grant of one Veli of land".

According to the transactions of the Engineering Association of 1936.

"In the Tamil Districts of Ceylon too, i.e. the Northern and Eastern Provinces, the system of land measurement would seem to have been in sowing extents and this system still prevails except in Jaffna, where in addition to the sowing measures, a surface measure termed the "Kuli" appears to have been in use from ancient times. This measure, the 'Kuli', is the extent of and contained within a square, of side equal to a 'Kole' or pole, in length approximately equal to 12 feet". According to Tamil Lexicon (Fabricius) a "Kuli" is a square of 12 feet in land measure.

The Kankuveli inscription mentioned above, is the inscription which refers to the Temple at Trincomalee, referred to in my article "Konesvara Kovil" which appeared in the press recently.

The publications mentioned above may be consulted for any further information and clarifications on this and other ancient measures.
