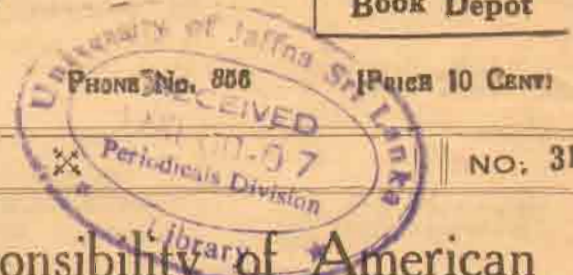

## MAHATMA GANDHI CENTENARY

It is a very happy thought that has prompted the International Islamic Institute to organise and hold a function in connection with Mahatma Gandhi Birthday Centenary celebrations as is being done in many countries of the world. It is most apposite that an organization based on the religion of Islam celebrates the Centenary of a noble personality who was one of the greatest friends of Muslims in addition to his being one of the noblest figures the world has ever seen. Many will remember that from his earliest attempts to render service to mankind commencing from his career in South Africa, Mahatma Gandhi was very closely associated with Muslims. Not only was he closely associated with Muslims in South Africa, but also he had their ardent support. The passive resistance movement which he started in South Africa and the movement to ameliorate generally the condition of Indians there had the combined support of Muslims, Christians and Hindus who constituted the Indian Community in that country. Thereafter on his return to India, he worked with great Muslim leaders like Quaid - E - Azam Jinnah, Badurdeen Tyabjee, the Ali Brothers (Moulana Shaikat Ali and Moulana Mohamed Ali) Hakim Ajmal Khan, Dr. Kitchilu, Dr. Ansari, Khan Abdul Gaffar Khan who is happily still with us, Dr. Khan Sahib and the present President of the Indian Republic, Dr. Zakir Hussain and other Muslim leaders. He espoused the cause of the Muslims both in internal and external affairs and made their cause his own. He brought about Muslim-Hindu Unity in a special manner and the unity of all religious communities in India. By his thoughts, words,

speeches, writings, prayers and fasts, unique in the history of the world, he promoted the unity of the Muslim and the Hindu Communities, for which a great Muslim Statesman like Emperor Akbar had worked centuries ago in India with uncommon foresight.

It is inspiring to remember that he died a Martyr to the cause of Hindu-Muslim Unity. A section of the Hindu Community thought that he was partial to the Muslim Community and brought about the Mahatma's Martyrdom. It is one of the most painful tragedies of life that a peace maker is at times misunderstood by the very contending parties between whom he seeks to bring about peace; the Mahatma's life and career are a striking instance of such sorrowful experience.

It is gratifying that the Centenary of such a sublime personality is being celebrated under the auspices of an Islamic Organisation. Praise be unto Allah for this happy event.

It is illuminating and instructive to recall that the joint efforts of leaders like Mahatma Gandhi and Quaid-E-Azam Jinnah and other eminent leaders resulted in the independence of the Indian sub-continent which

includes both India and Pakistan and also contributed considerably towards the independence of several Eastern countries including our own Sri Lanka.

It may also be proper to recall that the National Independence movement in India which had the support of leaders of all religious denominations, Muslim, Christian, Buddhist, Zoroastrian and Hindu accelerated the Independence of countries in the continent of Africa.

Mahatma Gandhi's life and career raised the status of Asiatics and Africans in all parts of the world in the material sphere. It further inspired them to greater standards of cultural, intellectual, political, social and religious attainments, all of which virtues have been emphasised by the Holy Prophet of Islam, Mohamed Nabi and the leaders of other great religions.

Our country, Sri Lanka, has in its own way been trying to practise the ideals of Mahatma Gandhi and a fairly satisfactory standard of religious and racial harmony, co-operation and amity have been reached, though much more remains to be done. Gandhi's historic visit to Ceylon in 1927, gave us the people of Ceylon a high degree of inspiration.

The Muslim Community in Ceylon is in a special position to further promote communal unity between the various races in Ceylon, and also in a way between Ceylon, India and Pakistan. This position of vantage has yet to be fully realized and service rendered in that context. May God's Grace in his infinite bounty guide the Community accordingly.

## Responsibility of American Affairs in Republican Hands

### Mr. Richard Nixon Makes Up For Former Failures

Both in the popular voting and in the electoral voting the Republican nominee Mr. Richard Nixon was well ahead of his Democratic opponent when he secured the Presidential seat in a very exciting election campaign where nobody until the results were known could predict the outcome. It was even feared that a constitutional crisis would be precipitated as a deadlock could occur, neither party gaining the necessary 270 electoral votes.

In the popular voting 287 votes were won by Mr. Nixon with Mr. Humphrey annexing 193 and Mr. Wallace obtaining 45. Mr. Nixon will assume office on January 20, 1969.

## BUDDHAGOSA

Sir, — Reference the letter from a reader in the press pertaining to B. C. Law and Geiger, I would point out that B. C. Law in an article on "South India as a Centre of Pali Buddhism" says "Nagarjuni Konda - inscriptions prove that there was a mahavihara for Buddhist recluses coming from different countries among which Damila is mentioned. These Buddhists were Theravadins. Gandhava-masa says that Kanchipura was one of the main centres of Pali Buddhism of Theravada. Madurai also (Madhurasatta pattana) is mentioned as the place where Buddhagosa and Buddhmitta lived for sometime, before the former repaired to Kanchipura. Buddhagosa was a native of Tirunelveli region. Uruga pura (modern Uraiyar in the Tiruchinapalli District) was the birthplace of Buddhagosa who lived in the village of Bhutamangala near the flourishing inland port of Kaveripattana. Buddhagosa and Baddhadatta were contemporaries and they flourished in the 5th century A. D. South India continued to be the centre of Pali Buddhism as late

as the 12th century A. D., a date to which Anuruddha (a Buddhist teacher of South India, according to the Talaing records) the celebrated author of the Abhidhammattha is assigned."

Geiger in his works "Ceylon in mediæval Times" says "During the reign of Mahanama in the 5th century A. C. Buddhagosa came from India to Ceylon, and studied in the Mahavihara in Anuradhapura the Sinhalese commentaries under the guidance of the Thera Sanghapala. He composed the Visuddhimagga and translated some of the Elu commentaries under the guidance of the Thera Sanghapala. He composed the Visuddhimagga and translated some of the Elu commentaries into Pali. The extensive post-canonical Pali literature originates with his activity.

According to the chronicle Buddhagosa was born in Bihar, It has been pointed out, however, that this information is wrong and that he was a South Indian from the Andhra Country. The Cola coun-

WITH NIXON WHAT NEXT?

When General Dwight D. Eisenhower routed the Democrats who held power for twenty years continuously it was felt that the personal prestige of the War hero had been the deciding factor for the rehabilitation of the Republican Party. In this triumphant turn in the tide of affairs of the Republican Party there emerged a clever lawyer Mr. Richard Nixon as second in command. By virtue of experience of two terms in office, Mr. Nixon was able to acquire for himself a fund of people's confidence. The Democratic Party with the dramatic decision of President Johnson on the bombing of Vietnam had hoped to retain power but the Republican candidate romped home in a rousing finish that must certainly give credit to the vigilance of the voters of America confirming the old belief that the Republicans national policy was for peace outside and amity at home. That the Democrats still retain control of the House of Representatives and the Senate is a phase in the new development which we hope will bring about unity inside America and make this Big Power more useful for the advancement of universal goodwill.

It is encouraging to note that Mr. Nixon has decided to visit Vietnam before assuming office in January 1969 for the purpose of restoring peace in South East Asia. Equally urgent is the racial problem which is threatening to disrupt the internal peace of America. The whole world is watching the next step of the new President of America.

TOWARDS TOTAL TEMPERANCE

Speaking at the Annual Meeting of the Total Abstinence Central Association in Colombo, Mr. H. W. Amarasuriya, the President of the All Ceylon

Buddhist Congress called upon the Government to extend support for the success of the prohibition campaign and added that a Buddhist country like Lanka should not collect revenue from the sale of alcohol which amounted annually to fifty million rupees. Mr. Amarasuriya need not be reminded of the fact that this country is inhabited by Buddhists, Moslems and Christians and that the non-Buddhist religions have prohibited the habit of drinking. We are hopeful that Mr. Amarasuriya's sharp rebuke to the Government would have the necessary reaction at least among the Buddhist leaders who now share the responsibility of administration along with the Premier.

It may be useful to recall in this context the activities of the past leaders of the Temperance Movement during 1914 when the British Government suspected a political background that was planning anti-British agitation. In fact the movement for Constitutional Reforms was undertaken by the very leaders who dominated the Temperance Campaign along with Sir P. Ramanathan and Sir P. Arunachalam. The present Premier should take pride in the fact that his illustrious father was a great temperance worker. In this age of scientific advancement and astonishing discoveries certainly the product of the palm that yields the raw material for the manufacture of liquor can be utilized for the production of items of food that cannot come into conflict with the requirements of religion and the moral code. The loss that is sustained by the nation every hour by the evil effects of liquor is much more than the income of revenue from the sale of liquor. What does it profit a man if he wins all the world but loses his soul?
