## Gandhiji Centenary Memorial Articles

No. 21

Diary of some events during Gandhiji's visit to Ceylon in the year 1927 (November 13 to November 29) with some quotations from some of his speeches delivered in Ceylon-

Continuation of Article No 18

1927 November 16. Presentation of address and purse for Khadi fund by the Ceylon Labour Union and reply by Gandhiji.

(1) "I have called myself a labourer in addressing you as fellow labourers and I have done so for the simple reason that since 1904 I have been endeavouring to live to the best of my ability as a labourer myself. But long before that date, I began to understand and appreciate the dignity of labour and it was long before that date I realized at that same time that labour was not receiving its due. And out of His infinite Grace, God so fashioned my life that I began to be drawn closer and closer to labour and its service."

(2) "The use made by you in your address of the expression "Mother India" has touched me to my deepest recesses. The use of that expression, in my opinion, derives great significance, because I know all of you are not Indians."

(3) "Let me briefly tell you what in my opinion you should do to come to your own. Combination amongst yourselves in the form of unions is undoubtedly the first... Each and every one of you should consider himself to be a trustee for the welfare of the rest of his fellow labourers and not be self seeking. You must be and remain non-violent under circumstances however grave and provoking. If you will be mean and realize your dignity you

must give up drink in its entirety if you are given to that cursed habit".

(4) I would advise you to use your union as much for internal reformation as for defence against assaults from without and remember that while it is quite proper to insist upon your rights and privileges it is imperative that you should recognize the obligation that every right carries with it. Whilst therefore you will insist upon adequate wages, proper humane treatment from your employees and proper and good sanitary lodgings, you will also recognize that you should treat the business of your employers as if it were your own business and give it your honest and undivided attention".

(5) "You must on no account neglect your children but should give them a decent education and properly so that they may be able when they grow up, to play their part on the human stage nobly and well".

After spending four days in Colombo, Gandhiji motored along the coast north up to Chilaw, and then went to Kurunegalla and thereafter reached Kandy, visiting numerous places on the way. Gandhiji said that in the hill districts of Ceylon he passed through some of the finest bits of scenery he ever witnessed in his life.

At Kandy among other places he visited the Dalada Maligawa, Trinity College, Dharmarajah College, and was also received by the Municipal Council.

The following are some extracts from some of his speeches in Kandy:—

(1) "As I said in Colombo, I am a lover of Municipal life. I do be-

## University In The North

### Minister Evades The Issue

## Medical Studies in the Mother Tongue

The results of G. C. E. Advanced Level Examination in the subject medicine reveal a very intriguing situation as far as the studies in the Mother Tongue are concerned. We always take pride in the fact that our literature in Tamil is both ancient and developed. In fact we speak of Tamil as a world language. The deliberations of the World Tamil Conference at Singapore and Madras confirmed this view point. But unaccountably the proficiency in the study of medicine in the mother-tongue has been proved by results of a recognized examination to be not commensurate with the claim that has been consistently established for the sufficiency of Tamil vocabulary to meet the requirements for courses in Medicine, Law Engineering and Accountancy in that language.

Six out of one hundred and eight two candidates were the privileged few to support the feasibility of professional studies in the mother-tongue while two hundred and thirty nine could obtain success in the English medium out

AGROUND AT ANCIENT TRINCOMALEE?

The ship of state, the National Government, which has been sailing stormy seas all these three years has at last gone aground beneath the sacred Rock where the ancient Saiva Shrine of Thirukoneswaram is situated. Declaring precincts of hallowed tradition as sacred areas has been the policy of both the S. L. F. P. and the U. P. Anuradhapura Sacred City came into being at the mere whisper. In doing so it displaced several Tamil commercial establishments and even a Saiva temple of great recognition. But the Tamil people of Anuradhapura who were adversely affected by the creation of a very large area as a sacred city took the decision in the true spirit of National Unity. At Kataragama a still greater scheme that will eventually eliminate the Hindus is in the process of being put into execution. Yet the National Government having agreed to treat Thirukoneswaram on the same footing has now thrown a thunder-bolt and fooled the Tamil people.

In Parliament the crude Communalist, Mr. R. G. Senanayake, challenged the Premier to make a statement about Thirukoneswaram and succeeded in compelling Mr Dudley Senanayake to express in implied terms that the Tamils deserved no recognition in any sphere. The nightmare has been created that the Tamils are enjoying sufficient power to deprive the Sinhalese of their authority. The Premier who is most concerned about the question of entry of Harijans into Hindu Temples has conveniently hidden his conscience and denied the irrefutable right of the Tamils to the complete restoration of Thirukones-

waram to its pristine glory and rightful place. In the matter of the campaign for throwing open Hindu Temples to Harijans not only has the Premier taken a prominent part but also has encouraged all Government officials to participate in that campaign. Yet Thirukoneswaram of Puranic repute and historical holiness has become a very ordinary place not worthy of recognition by a Government that not infrequently lays claim to be the sponsor of national unity and communal collaboration!

Our Island is well-known for its ruins excavations, ancient monuments and relics preservation of which being a national duty. Hence the importance of Thirukoneswaram which has a historical past and religious significance. No Sinhalese Leader can deny this fact for the history of the Sinhala people refers to incidents connected with this sacred shrine. Apart from this the Thirukoneswaram Temple occupies a site that must necessarily be sacred. No other town has this natural setting so well executed with a natural harbour of rare beauty and utility flanked by a majestic rock whose formation indicates its spiritual worth. All these add to the greatness of the country that is Lanka. It is an irony of fate that the very National Government that was formed by more than two parties should have decided to break its own structure dashing its promises and principles on the sacred Rock of Thirukoneswaram.

It is estimated that there are at present over 8000 graduates unemployed in the country and it is gratifying to note that the Department of Education is contemplating to employ more 3000 of the graduates before the end of 1969. It is also proposed to employ about 200 Science graduates to teach science in that rural areas.
