Principal's Report

WELCOME

Let me first of all extend a cordial welcome to each and everyone of you present here this morning. Fr. Soundranayagam let me say how happy we are to have you as chairman at our function. As one whose family was closely associated for generations with our school, and whose mother and grandmother count themselves past-pupils, it gives us pride and joy to confer this honour on you. As Professor at the Seminary, you too belong to the world of education. More over you are the ever chivalrous knight to us in our school's religious and cultural activities. We couldn't have found a worthier person to chair our prize-giving. We welcome you whole-heartedly and express our gratitude for accepting our invitation.

A very special welcome to our Chief Guest Sr. Mary Slaven, Superior General of the Holy Family Association, who has accepted our invitation to grace our function under such difficult circumstances. Sr. Mary Slaven, we greet you with warm and sincere affection. You are no stranger to us as you have visited our school in the past, the last occasion being our school's 125th Anniversary celebrations in 1988.

It is but right that you are Chief Guest today as you are intimately connected with education having begun your career as a teacher. The Holy Family Association too began its apostolic

mission in the field of teaching. Your excellence as a linguist, adept at French, Italian, Spanish and English, your wide knowledge and global travel, your administrative experience as General Councillor for 6 years and Superior General for 12 years, as executive member in the organisation representing the Superior Generals of all religious orders, and as Auditor at the Synod of European Bishops gives you a singular lustre. The formation of youth has figured largely in your services. Your visit to Jaffna proves your faith in Divine Providence at a time when such a visit to a war-torn land demands a spirit of daring and heroic courage. It also proves your solidarity with the suffering masses. We thank you Sr. Mary Slaven for inspiring and encouraging us with your presence here today.

Sr. Josephine Mendis, we are indeed happy to welcome you to our function today. As a Former Principal of Holy Family Convent, Bambalapitia, and now General Councillor, you are one with us in our educational ideals and aspirations. We are bound together by familial traditions and loyalties and it gives us great pleasure to honour you as one of our distinguished guests today.

We extend a most cordial welcome to the officials of the Education Department, Mr. R. Suntheralingam. As Regional Director of Education, Jaffna you shoulder a herculean task at a time such as this. We appreciate the interest you and Deputy Director Jaffna Division Mr.S.Velayutham evince in our school and its activities. We take this opportunity to tell you how grateful we are to you, and to all the officials of the department who spare no trouble in smoothening the course of educational administration in our peninsula. Our school benefited immensely by the Management Seminars conducted for Sectional Heads and Subjects Co-ordinators by the Management Unit of the Department.

REPORT

I take great pleasure in presenting the report for 1991-1992. We regret that we could not make Prize-day an annual event due to unforeseen circumstances. We thank God for making it possible this year.

1991 was a comparatively less turbulent year after the holocaust of 1990. It was primarily a period of rehabilitation. Displacement of teachers and pupils, damage to class-room buildings and furniture, was our first concern. One of our chief problems was the depletion of the Primary school staff. Many were displaced, and others opted to retire under the 44/90 government circular. Thereby we also lost many of our collegiate staff. To fill the 'vacuum' in the Primary Staff we decided to take in volunteer teachers. Pre-service seminars were organised for training them and it has proved a worthwhile project.

I wish to express my gratitude here for the help and co-operation we received from the parents of the primary school children, and officials of the Education Department. The parents gallantly came forward with constructive proposals and co-operated whole heartedly with us in our volunteer teacher recruitment project even contributing monthly towards the payment of the volunteers

The officials generously offered us their time and services to conduct special pre-service training seminars for the recruits. Their refresher 'Crash Course' has paid dividends and I'm happy to say that the volunteers are doing good work.

Our pupils like every body else had to cope with considerable stress. Many went through the trials of refugee existence. Fear and insecurity stalked them at every turn. Lack of fuel, electricity and transport disrupted study. Yet it heartens us to see the young facing and overcoming obstacles. It reinforces our faith in the resilience and adaptability of youth.

ADMINISTRATION

Our Administration pivots on the help and co-operation given to me by the administrative staff - viz. the Deputy Principal, and sectional heads. In the academic sphere the subject Co-ordinators stream-line the teaching of each subject.

Each teacher is allotted a specific extra-curricular duty. We have introduced an internal system of teacher-supervision, whereby a supervising team consisting of senior members of the staff, periodically supervises class-room teaching and evaluates a teacher's performance,

This system was very much appreciated by the Administrative Staff of other schools in the Peninsula who visited our school to personally acquaint themselves with this method, on the direction of the management unit of the Department. Another new feature is Staff-evaluation. The Principal and Staff as a body, evaluate major school activities each term for future reference and improvement.

The Board of discipline helps to maintain order and discipline. The prefect body consisting of 25 prefects help in this task under the supervision of the Prefects' Moderator. The Prefect body meets regularly to discuss relevant issues. It also attends leadership seminars periodically to discharge its duties better.

The Function Committee composed of nominated teachers sees to the organisation of all school functions. The Examination Committee conducts term exams. I wish to thank all concerned for making my task pleasant, and my burden light.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

We have always held fast to the familial ideals of education for our girls. Our vision envisages the total development of the pupil which cannot be measured with the yardstick of examination success alone. Yet we cannot ignore the fact that success at examinations is the only valid criterion of student-learning.

CURRICULUM :

TAMIL

As our Mother Tongue, Tamil Language and culture hold pride of place. Contests in Tamil oratory, recitation, speech, composition and short story writing were held at school level. Our school won many trophies at the Cluster and district level Contests. In addition our pupils won 1st place at the 'Vipulananda Day' Essay Contests at Cluster Level, at the General Knowledge Quiz in Tamil, on the same occasion, and at the 'Annai Poopathy General Knowledge Quiz. We participated in verse recitation at the 'Bharathy Festival' at Kanagaratnam Vidyalayam. Tamil Day was celebrated this year on 18.03.1992 with Jeyaraj of Kampani Kalaham fame as Chief Guest.

ENGLISH

As always English is given its due place as a link - language and tool of International communication. We celebrated English Day on 19.11.91 with Mr. Thurai Thiagarajah, Deputy Director of Education as Chief Guest. Items of song, poetry and drama were featured, and a play, 'The Happy Man' produced by Mrs. Kailathan won much applause. It was the culmination of several school level contests in the various language skills. This year we celebrated English Day on 28.05.92 with Dr. Suresh Canagarajah Head of the English Language Teaching Centre of the University, and Mrs. Nanthini Canagarajah as Chief Guests. The whole programme was commended by the Chief Guest, who complimented the staff on the excellent presentation.

RELIGION

Believing that the total development of the pupil is impossible without a sound knowledge of religion we put religious knowledge at the apex of our curriculum. Christianity (R.C) and (Non R.C) and Hinduism are taught. The members of the Catholic Students Federation follow retreats and leadership seminars. Many of our pupils are members of the Association - "The children

of the Holy Family." We try to instil the ideals of our Founder in the young through regular meeting, dissemination of literature and entertainment programmes. Holy Mass is offered in the Chapel on First Fridays for A/L pupils. A Mass for Holy Souls is annually offered; and attended by the whole school. Carol service is another annual event. The Hindus observe 'Saraswathy Pooja' by visiting the temple for religious observances. Hindu pupils sit the Hinduism examination conducted by the Saiva Paripalana Sabai.

SCIENCE

The Science Union meets periodically for discussions, Quiz contests and speeches by guest Speakers. Members participate in inter-school contests. Field work and outdoor activities had to be dropped during the period due to unsettled conditions.

AESTHETICS

Great emphasis is placed on the teaching of music, (vocal - oriental and western) Dancing (Oriental) and Art and Craft. Our pupils participate in singing dancing, and art contests organised by the Department as well as by other cultural bodies. We are proud to say that our pupils topped the list in the Departmental Art Contests and won prizes at the Divisional and District level, thanks to Mrs. Ambalavanar, our Art Teacher. In March 1991 we had a school Art and Craft Exhibition declared open by the Chief Guest Mr. T. Thambichurai, C. E. O. (Art) who congratulated the school for organising an Exhibition in a comparatively neglected field of studies.

TECHNICAL SUBJECTS

Co-operative Education was introduced to our school for the first time in a practical form by the establishment of a Co-operative Stationery Shop. It was formally registered in 1991. It has a membership of 460, and capital to the value of 6,280/- It provides stationery at fixed rates and it is a boon to the pupils at a time when school stationery is inavailable or high-priced. It has proved

a profitable venture as well as instructive medium of instilling the benefits of co-operation in the minds of the young. Tamil Typewriting was another subject that was introduced for the first time in our school in 1992.

COMMERCE

Many of our pupils opt to do Commerce at Advanced Level. The A/L Commerce Union celebrated 'Vanika Thinam' (Commerce Day) in September 91. Mr. A. Soosairatnam Lecturer, Technical College Jaffna was Chief Guest. Certificates of Merit were awarded to Essay Contest winners. The Union meets once a month, invites guest-speakers and publishes a Yearly Magazine 'Vanika Thalir' under the able guidance of Mrs. L. Pararajasingham.

SPORTS

Our P. T. Instructress Miss Lourdes Dominic left us in early 1991. Since then we have managed without a qualified P. T. Teacher. However, we were able to celebrate sports Day on 23rd March 91. Mrs. A. Amirthanayagam, a former Deputy Principal and long standing member of the Staff was the Chief Guest. Athletic competitions and House Matches took place. Clare House emerged Champions while Visitation House were runners up. The March-past winners were Martinn House. This year the Director of Education Mr. R. Sunderalingam graced our Sports Day as Chief Guest. Other distinguished guests included Mr. S. Velayutham Deputy Director and Deputy Director of Sports Mr. T. Arunagirirajah. Josephine House were winners while Clare House were runners up. Regular 'Keep-Fit' sessions, P. T. Classes, Inter-school Contests continue in spite of the absence of a P. T. instructress. Our pupils won notable awards at the Cluster Level Contests held at Jaffna Central College in '91 and '92 in the various athletic events and also at the Divisional Level, thus qualifying for participation at District level,

EXTRA - CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

COLLEGE DAY

We celebrated 'College day' on the 29-06-92 commemorating 'Founder's Day.' Holy Mass was offered and a picture of P. B. Noailles was unveiled by our Provincial, Sr. Marie Joseph. Highlight of the entertainment programme was a tamil drama depicting his life.

TEACHERS' WEEK

Teachers' week was celebrated with much enthusiasm in the first week of October. This was the first time in the history of education that such a celebration took place. On Principal's Day, the school honoured the Principal with an address and group song. On teacher's day pupils honoured their teachers by garlanding each teacher on stage and paid tribute in speech and song. The Presentation by the S. D. S. ended the proceedings. Teachers also took part in a variety entertainment in which dance, drama and songs featured.

GUIDES

Our Guides are forging ahead under the able management of the Guider - in - charge Mrs. S. Pathmanesan, and Troop - Leader Miss Veena Manoharan. The Guides did yeomen service in 1991 rehabilitating refugees, providing them with relief food and clothes, and nursing and attending to the injured. Baden Powell Day was celebrated by our Guides participating at functions in various schools to commemorate the occasion. Our Guides also attended a Scouts Jamboree at J/ Central College to mark the 75th Jubilee Celebrations of the Scout Movement.

THE INTER-ACT CLUB

Our Inter-act Club affiliated to the Rotary Club functions under Mrs. C. G. Jeyakularajah. It was formally presented with

a Charter in March '91, at a well attended function. Among the guests were Professor A. Arumugam, Head of the Faculty of Education University of Jaffna, and Rotary President Mr. V. T. Sivalingam. The high-light of the day was the presentation of a wheel-chair (Tricycle) to a handicapped child - a gift from our club.

In keeping with the Motto of the Club "Service above Self" the club rendered invaluable service tending the sick during the period of unrest and tension. The girls also collected and distributed clothes and food parcels to displaced refugees, donated white material to the value of 20,000/-, and hosted the refugees at breakfast in Colambogam

At the Golden Jubilee celebrations of the Rotary Club our pupils Shirani Saverimuthu and Anne Pamela won 2nd place in English Elocution and a Merit Certificate for Tamil Essay Writing respectively.

THE ADVANCED LEVEL UNION

The Advanced Level Union met regularly although its activities had to be curtailed in keeping with times. The Annual 'get-together' in 1991 took the form of an evening social at which Mr. S. V. Mahesavelu Deputy Director, Education Department, was Chief Guest. This year, the Government Agent of Jaffna Mr. K. Manikavasagar and Mrs. Manikavasagar graced the Advanced Level Union Social on 19.03.1992. Monthly discussions and Quiz contests feature among the activities of the Union.

SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY

The S. D. S. met regularly to review its work in the prevalent situation. Among its rehabilitation services were repairs and replacement of damaged school furniture, renovation of damaged school buildings, repair of water tank, provision of chairs for the staff room, provision of water pump and the appointment of new teachers paid from S. D. S. Funds. The society also honoured the teachers during Teachers' week by presenting each teacher with a silver gift token. The S. D. S. continues to give support and strength in all our undertakings.

TEACHERS' GUILD

The teachers' guild renders invaluable ^{service} in seeing to the social welfare of the staff. It helps to build up staff solidarity, organises culturally, enriching activities, such ^{as} discussions and talks by Guest speakers, in addition to social functions

The Teachers' Guild had a busy time in 1991 organising Farewell functions for the retirees.

OGA

Our O. G. A. is too vast and sprawling a body to keep under bounds. Many of the past pupils are abroad, and time and distance have been disrupting agents. Nevertheless, past pupils held a General Meeting on 02-08-92. Miss V. Emmanuel was chosen President for 1992 and new office bearers were elected. A Programme for the year was drawn up, the first item being a Felicitation Mass to honour the new Provincial, Sr. Marie, an old Girl.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion I wish to say a word to the parents. You play an equally important, if not greater role in your childrens' education as the school. I hope you will consider it a privilege and a responsibility and treat it as such. Thank you.

While thanking you all for giving my report a patient hearing, I say a sincere "thank you" to all the guests who have turned up in such large numbers to be with us today. Your presence encourages and cheers us on to carry out our tasks. My gratitude to the parents, and well-wishers and prize-donors who have made this occasion possible. Finally my thanks to the staff, both tutorial and clerical for helping me at all times.
