#### CURRICULUM

#### RELIGIOUS KNOWLEDGE

Religion and Religious knowledge are given top priority in the Curriculum. Christianity and Hinduism are taught regularly. We try to instil in the minds of the young that Religion cannot be separated from life and day-to-day living. Prayers. Hymns, Thevarams and Bakthi Geethas form part of the morning assemblies and words for reflection are provided. Religious observances are held regularly and all help is given to develop the spirituality of our pupils.

In 1993, 475 students of our school paticipated in the liturgical Competitions organised by the Liturgy Centre of the Jaffna Diocese. 131 of them obtained over 80 marks each and were awarded merit certificates. 495 students sat the religious knowledge Examination conducted by the Catechetical Centre Jaffna and six of them secured the first three places, 61 students who obtained over 75 marks were awarded certificates

The Catholic Students' Union strives to foster the spiritual life of the A/L Students. First Friiday Mass is offered in the School Chapel for A/L pupils, and seminars are organised on psychological topics.

Rev. Fr. Jeeva Paul OMI conducted two Seminars—one on "Personality Development" and another on "Relationships". They dealt with problems related to adolescence.

Hinduism is taught in all classes. Many obtained merit passes in Examinations conducted by the Saiva Paripalana Sabai, Religious observances and carols commemorated Christmas. Mass for the Holy Souls is an annual feature in November. Hindus offer Saraswathy Pooja at the Temple.

#### TAMIL

Tamil is given pride of place as the Mother tongue. Students participated at School, cluster and divisional level Tamil Day contests and won awards. Certificates were also won by those who took part in the 'Annai Poopathy' and 'Dileepan Day' contests

Tamil Day 1993 was celebrated with Prof. A. Shanmugathas as Chief Guest while Rev. Dr. N. Maria Xavier graced Tamil Day 1994 as Chief Guest.

Students participated in the Examination conducted by the Ariyadravida Bashabivrithi Sangam for A/L students.

Noteworthy mention must be made of a manuscript magazine brought out by each class to encourage Tamil journalistic talent.

#### ENGLISH

As always English holds a place of its own in our school and no effort is spared to improve and encourage its learning. We are heartened to note that our pupils fared very well at the English Day Contests. At the Divisional level in 1993 we won 8 first places and six second places in the speech contests. We also won 5 first places in reading and spelling respectivly. English day 1993 was celebrated with Rev. Fr. Francis Joseph Rector Emeritus St. Patrick's College, as Chief Guest. The presentation of a scene from Shakespeare's 'Midsummer Night's Dream' was well received. The English Union functions as Intermediate senior and post senior divisions. It organises monthly Literary Meetings. This year Mr. and Mrs. K. Kadirgamar of the English Language Teaching Centre, University of Jaffna, were the Chief Guests at English Day.

The highlight of the Programme was "Thumbelina" an Opera which won enthusiastic applause. This year too we won noteworthy success at the English Divisional level contests. Our students won 26 first places and 24 second places.

#### SCIENCE & MATHS:

The Science Union functions as Middle School and senior Divisions. The former has to be congratulated on inaugurating 'Science Day' last year. It was celebrated under the distinguished patronage of Mrs. P. S. Skandarajah. (former C. E.O. Science) and featured many novel items including a lively interschool quiz. The Union also had a Science Exhibition where exhibits were judged and given prizes. A School Maths exhibition was held in 1993. It was declared open by Mr. S. Velayutham, Deputy Director of Education. Associated with him were Mrs. Vethanayagam (C. E. O. Maths) and Mrs. P. S. Skantharajah (Former Science C. E. O.). The exhibition drew many students from other Schools. The special attraction were the novel visual aids on display. Weekly meetings are held and inter-class competitions and quizes are conducted by the A. L. Science Union.

An interesting activity is the labelling of trees and plants in the school premises by their botanical names and the putting up of notices on topics dealing with the environment.

To draw pupils' interest and attention, questions and answers on science are displayed on notice boards. The Union also organised an ecological excursion with Mr. S. Kugathas as their guide. Navatkuli, Chavakacheri, Manalkadu and Nagarkovil were among the places visited. Plant specimens collected on the trip were displayed for the benefit of other students in school.

Our students also displayed exhibits at the Jaffina Central College Science exhibition held earlier this year and won prizes.

Among other activities was the renovation of the school botanical tank, and participation in the Science and Maths competition held by Jaffna Science Association this year at which B. Premalatha (Advanced level 1994 Science) won third place,

#### AESTHETICS:

Music, Art & Dance attract many followers. Considerable talent is unearthed at competitions held by the Department and associated bodies.

Noteworthy achievements were as follows:

#### ART:

Rajani Vincent won first place in the Art competition held by the Diocesan Catechetical Centre. Shobana Jesuthasan won first place in the intermediate competition held to commemorate Women's Day. We also won 2nd and 3rd places in the Poster Competition held by the Y.M.C.A.

#### MUSIC:

We won first place in the Inter-School Pannisal Competition. (Intermediate Division). Many of our pupils from Grade 1—5 obtained distinction passes in Examinations conducted by the North Ceylon Oriental Society of Fine Arts.

Our group was placed second at the district level vocal music competition held for original compositions.

#### DANCE:

This year our group won first place at Circuit, zone and District level with the folk dance presented by pupils from year 6—8. Items which were much commended were the Swan Dance at the Sports day Interval programme, the rhythmic Musical Dance on Tamil Day, the Drama "The woman from Samaria" on College Day, and the 'Peacock Dance' on Prize-giving Day.

#### COMMERCE:

Commerce continues to have a prestigious place in our School, as is shown by the A/L Results. The Commerce Union has many and varied activities to its credit the best known being the publication of its Magazine "Vannihathalir", the

4th Edition of which was released this year, at a function presided over by Mr. M. Nadarajasunderam. Head of the Department of Management studies, University of Jaffna.

A commendable feature is the award of gold and Silver Medals by the Union to its University entrants, as an incentive to success. The Union also organises field trips to places such as banks to gain first hand knowledge in addition to inviting guest speakers and organising regular contests and quizes.

We take this opportunity to congratulate the Moderator Mrs. L. Pararajasingam on her promotion as Senior Tutor, Distance Education.

#### TECHNICAL SUBJECTS:

Home Science, Needle work and Life Skill are popular subjects. We are glad that Home Science gives practical training in home making and helps many to prepare for their future roles as wives and mothers. Life Skill too is learnt enthusiastically and gives practical help in easing the rough edges of daily life. It teaches the economical use of raw materials and recycling of waste. Articles produced by pupils were exhibited in school and sold at a nominal price.

#### SPORTS:

Though we have no qualified P. T. I. successful Sportsmeets were held last year and early this year. In 1993 Mr. S. Velautham was Chief Guest while this year Mr. Pulandran honoured us with his presence. We are deeply grateful to St. Patrick's College for allowing us the use of their sports grounds. Athletic events (track and field) and a Musical Drill Display marked the occasions. We won several first and second places in the Cluster, Divisional and Zone Level contests. In 1993-Miss Nija Kanagasingam emerged the under 13 champion, win ning three first places at Circuit Level in Track and field events. She kept it up this year too by becoming the under 15 champion at District Level, Mithila Kanagasingam was

under 19 Champion this year, at the Zone Level contest. Our congratulations to all the winners.

#### EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES :

#### COLLEGE DAY :

A day commemorating the life and ideals of Bienvenu Noailles the founder of the Holy Family Association is celebrated annually. Holy Mass, and a programme of entertainment mark the occasion. Last year the theme centered round the "Bible" and depicted scenes from the Gospel in drama form. This year the chosen theme was 'love' as it could be practised in the present day situation.

#### GUIDES :

The Guides Movement contributes much to the formation of our pupils. The Guides did immense social work in 1993 rehabilitating refugees, providing them with food, clothing and other essentials of life. They are also enthusiastic shramadhana workers at school and their helpful presence is felt at all school functions. Baden Powell Day was celebrated at school and our guides partook in celebrations in other schools. We welcome Mrs. P. V. Richards who joined us as a guider.

#### The Inter-act Club:

The, ever-active Inter-act Club was busy as usual in 1993 with a host of activities. Projects out of school included the cleaning of wards and premises of the General Hospital, distribution of clothing to the orphans at "Anpaham", and voluntary blood donation to the Hospital Blood Bank.

The main fund-raising project was the musical programme "Innisai Malai" which brought in Rs. 32, 000/-. Our thanks are due again to the Rector of St. Patrick's College for allowing us the use of the Chilege Hall for this performance, and to the Inter-act Club of St. Patrick's College for their generous help. Another project was the screening of a Tamil Film show as a fund raising project.

#### St. John's Ambulance Association:

The First Aid Division of the St. John's Ambulance Association and Brigade was revived after many years. It was reinaugurated on 8.10.93. by the Regional Area Surgeon Dr. S. P. R. Seermaran. Dr. Anushanthan Sivapragasam and Mr. Eric Jesuthas conducted classes in First Aid and all trainees were successful in the written and practical examinations. Our students won merit certificates in the fund collecting, First Aid, and March Past Contests organised by the brigade. They were placed first and won the Cup in the Quiz Competition, and came second in the March Past Competition. Our girls render valuable service at school and public functions.

#### Co-operative Society:

We organised a school Co-operative society as a practical approach to the learning of Co-operative studies as a subject. In 1991 it was registered by the Commissioner of Co-operatives and started functioning from 10.12.1991. Our society provides our students with stationary, and refreshments. Students participated in the speech and essay competitions organised by the Jaffna District Co-operative society in commemoration of the International Co-operative day in 1994 and our school won the highest number of prizes.

#### The A/L Union:

The Union holds monthly meetings and conducts quiz competitions and debates. The Annual A/L Union Lunch for 1993 was held in the school hall. The Chief Guests were Mr. P. Balasunderampiliai, Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Mrs. Balasunderampillai.

## School Development Society:

The S. D. S. had its Annual general meeting on. The election of new members took place. Among the activities for the period the S. D. S. donated P. T. Squad uniforms, subsidised sports expenses repaired school furniture, windows, and stage curtain

equipment. A new cupboard was made. It also helped to print sports-day programme sheets and certificates.

#### The O.G.A.:

The O.G.A. is gaining strength and forging ahead with its activities. On the 8th of April many past pupils gathered together at the Convent Chapel to celebrate the diamond Jubilee of Rev. Mother Visitation at a thanksgiving Mass. It was followed by a get-together at which tributes were paid and memories of the Jubilarian revived by some of her earliest pupils.

This year the O.G.A. met again to celebrate Past Pupil's Day. The days programme included the Annual general Meeting, a get-together lunch, and tea. A positive step was taken to reinforce the finances of the O.G.A. by contacting Past Pupils abroad. We are thankful to the branch associations, particularly those in Canada and U.K. who responded generously to to our call. Their contributions helped us to purchase a generator to supply electricity for night study at school.

#### TEACHERS' GUILD :

As I come to the end of my report I would like to share some ideas that pertain to the formation of youth. It seems as if we have lost our hold on a value system which we can give our young people. I refer to a system which upholds the dignity of Man as being with a spirit created on the image of his make. Today we see Man being ted as a mere unit of society, without any rights or dignity of his own - a play-thing of the powerful. We see this in all the people who are marginalised. Disrespect for human life strips Man of his dignity. So does injustice and violence. We can hope for a better world only when we begin to rOspect our fellow-beings as individuals unique and irreplaceable, distinctively different from each other. This is the challenge, we educators face today. How could we parents and teachers meet it?

First by ceasing to think of our children as human computers and examinees to be fed with academic knowledge, producing expected results. It is far more important that our children are taught respect and reverence, love, gentleness and consideration for others at home, at school wherever they encounter their fellow-beings.

Again if we believe in the sacredness of the individual, we cannot expect our children to confirm to our expectations for them, but allow them to grow and realize their own potentialities. We cannot force them into a mould we have made for them. This would be a travesty of the dignity of Man. Equality is a basic right to be respected, but not at the cost of violating one's individuality.

In conclusion I wish to express my gratitude to all who have helped me. My thanks to the officials of the department the members of the School Development Society, the O.G.A., to all the parents, teachers, well wishers & prize donors who hearten me in all my end-avours. I must make mention of the gratitude our school owes to the Government Agent Jaffna Mr. K. Manikavasagar who facilitated and expedited the purchase and shipment of a generator and valuable school equipment I take pleasure in extending my thanks once again to the Rector of our brother school St. Patrick's College, and to all the Principals and teachers of other schools who take part in our school events by honouring our invitations.
