## Editorial Notes

We are publishing 'The Miscellany' after a lapse of four years. The articles for 1994 issue were all collected and arrangements for publication were all done. However, disruption of normal life due to sporadic fightings prevented us from publication of the Miscellany. In July 1995 the whole of Valligamam west fled to Jaffna due to operation 'Leap Forward' and every thing came to a standstill for about two weeks. Then again almost the whole of Valligamam was evacuated to Thenmarachchi, Vadamarachchi and Vanni areas and every thing came to a grinding halt till the evacuees started to come back in April 1996.

Most of those fled came back, but with confused minds and shattered hopes. Most of those who came back found to their utter dismay, their broke opened and things looted. In many cases the houses were damaged due to bombing and shelling, and some were completely demolished. The prophecy, "I shall scatter you and make your land desolate; cattle shall sleep in your houses and outsiders shall trample your soil", had come true for most of us. However, God also has promised that God will rebuild the house of Israel. This prophecy should also come true for us.

Therefore, it should be the duty of us, the christian teachers, to base our education on the 'Theology of Hope'. Many christian Theologians emphasize on 'Teaching for Liberation', but there can be no liberation if there is no hope. Dr. Donald Capps, William Harte Felmeth Professor of Pastoral Theology at Princeton Theological Seminary, in his book, 'Agents of Hope: a pastoral Psychology' says, 'The practical belief that the Lord will' make ways out of no way' is not a leap of faith for suffering people but a necessity that evolved out of a history of pain'. This hope is not an empty hope, but a living reality in the lives of many of us who have turned to God'.

We must also take note of the fact that the theme of Church of South India 26th Synod this year was "Turn to God and Rejoice in Hope". In John Bunyan's 'Pilgrim Progress', the name of the person who accompanied Christian was 'HOPE'. Therefore, let the basis of education be 'Theology of Hope'.



This year's 'Miscellany' comes into your hand as "Bishop D. J. Ambalavanar Issue". The Rt. Rev. Dr. D. J. Ambalavanar, the second Bishop in Jaffna of the Church of South India, was the Chairman of Jaffna College Board of Directors for many years. He was instrumental in steering the college through difficult periods, whether it be the time of take over of the Undergraduate Department by the University of Jaffna or period of the disruption to the normal life in Campus due to the never ending ethnic violences. He as the leader, not only braced the situation with calmness but also gave us strength to withstand pressures from all quarters.

We lost in Bishop Ambalavanar, a spirit filled and prophetic person. His loss is irreparable. Yet, we shall run with resolution the race that lies ahead. Our hope is that Bp Ambalavnavar who has gone to be with 'this great cloud of witnesses around us' (Heb. 12:1) will continue to encourage us through the memories of him which he has left to be with us.

We should also mention about Dr. Robert G. Porter, Missionary to the College. Dr. Porter popularly known as 'Bob' came to Jaffna College as UCBWM missionary 17 years ago. A Presbyterian by birth and conviction, joined the Mission Board of United Church of Christ and came to serve as a Missionary at Jaffna College, and Church of South India, a united church of Episcopal, Presbyterian and Congregational traditions. He had been a unifying force between people of different faiths and of all walks. Though a Ph. D. Degree holder who come from an affluent country, he was a 'man of ordinary folks. Bob worked among ordinary folks and children of Levi Spaulding Boys' Home. He did much to improve the English standard. More than all, he had been with us when many fled the land of their birth. We are sad that he had to leave us at the beginning of 1998 due to, retirement. We wish him happy retired life and hope that UCBWM will find another missionary like Bob to work with us.

We will be celebrating the 175th anniversary of the founding of 'Batticota Seminary'. Batticota Seminary was established on July 22nd 1823 and was closed in 1859. But the seed of the Seminary was buried in the soil of Jaffna and sprouted, grew and bloomed in to Jaffna College. This was made possible because of the efforts of Seminary graduates who worked hard towards the establishment of a College for Jaffna. Jaffna College was established on 2 July 1872.

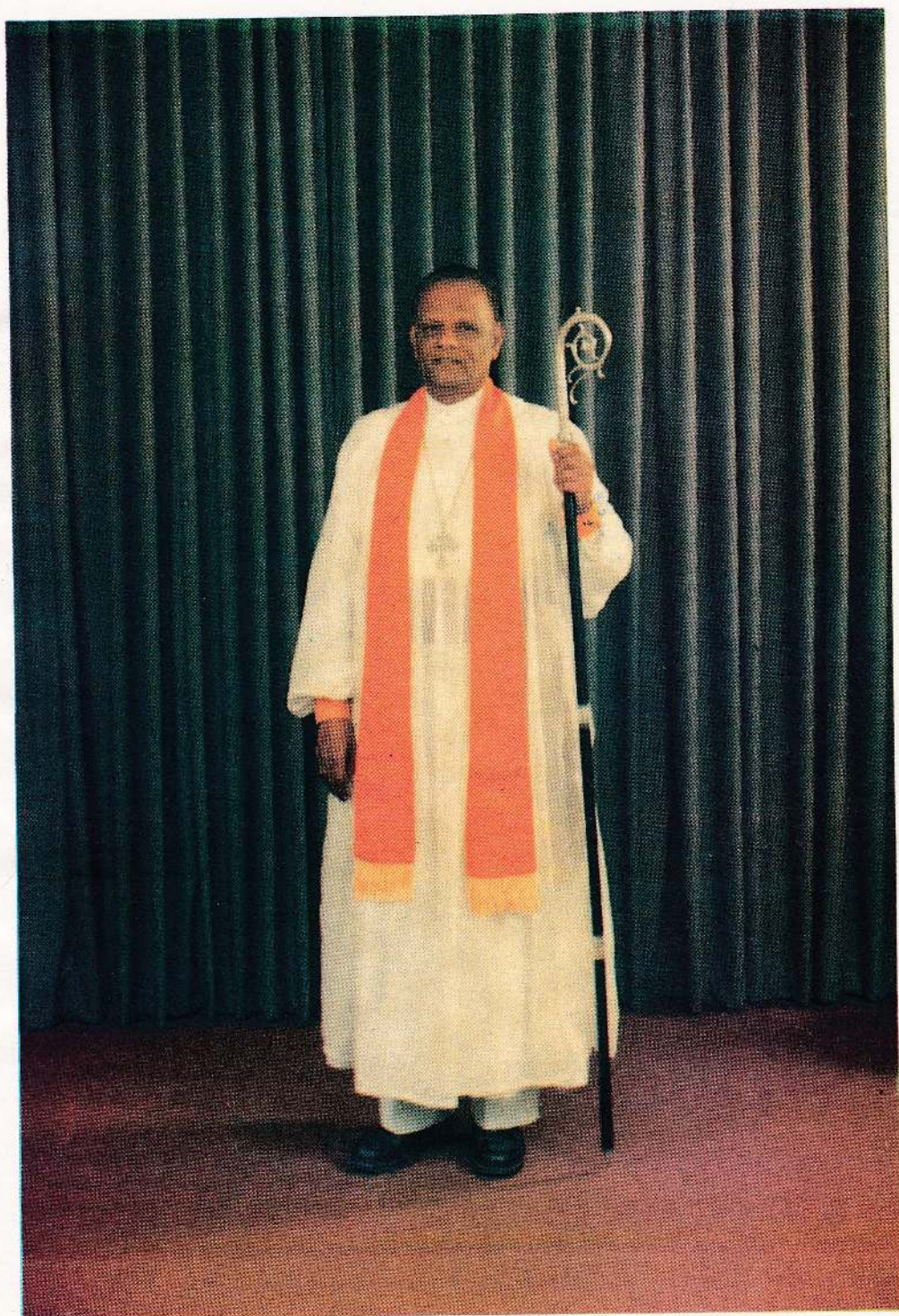

## Rt. Rev. Dr. David Jeyaratnam Ambalavanar

### - a man of God

*Bishop David Ambalavanar, 2nd Bishop of the Jaffna Diocese of the Church of South India died at the age of 69. He was consecrated as Bishop on the June 30, 1971. His mortal remains will be buried in Jaffna on October 15.*

*He was the son of a humble pastor. In addition to the spiritual training at home the children were educated in the two best schools in Jaffna. Jaffna College and St. John's College. Bishop Ambalavanar came under the influence of John Bicknell, Sydney Bunker, Henry Peto and John Arulanantham. Their guidance and skill has moulded him as a student to confront the challenges that he had to face as a leader in the years to come.*

*He was an Arts Graduate of the London University. He had his Theological training at Theological College Serampore and obtained the degree of Bachelor of Divinity. Later M.Th from King's College London. When he retired from his Episcopal ministry the University of Serampore conferred on him an Honourary Doctorate.*

*His Episcopal ministry in Jaffna was during the recent sad experiences of the Tamil community. They were*

*without leaders for a long period. It is during this period that along with the Bishop of the Roman Catholic Church in Jaffna. Bishop Deogupillai they both became the chief spokespersons for their community. They focused the plight of their people in international forums. They were misunderstood by many yet they were Confident of their ministry. Even the non-Christian community in the peninsula was looking to them for leadership and they accepted the stand they had taken. During his Episcopacy churches, day care centres, community halls short term and long-term community development programmes were arranged and implemented.*

*Many educated and elite members of his community including his own clergy left the country in recent times. He identified and discovered new talents and trained them. They were equipped for ministry. After his retirement he could have gone to another country or to a theological college to exercise his academic qualities but he felt he should remain where his presence was required. He always comforted the people with the word of Isaiah 6:11, 12, 13, "then I said, For how long. O Lord? And he answered until the cities lie ruined and without inhabitant until the houses are left deserted and the fields ruined and ravaged until the Lord*

has sent every one far away and the land is utterly forsaken. And thou a tenth remains in the land; it will again be laid waste. But as the terebinth and oak leave stumps when they are cut down so the holy seed will be the stump in the land." He always reminded the people that we are the holy seed and stump. After his retirement he stayed in the Green Memorial Hospital in Manipal with his wife Dr. Mrs. Chandra Ambalawana and continued his ministry.

I was with him in Madras just two weeks ago when I went to attend the golden jubilee celebrations of the Church of South India. When

we wished each other good bye I never expected that this was the last time that we were meeting each other. We had spoken much about peace in Sri Lanka as friends with a common vision for our country.

Psalmist says, "precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His servants." We will miss his guidance, his scholarly conversations and sermons. As a man of God he is devoted to his Master and Maker and is well aware of the teaching of the Holy Scriptures. As a man of God we are proud because he used his spirituality and intellectualism for the edifying of the church.

## The Rt. Rev. Dr. D. J. Ambalavanar

*"He Chose to spend all his time with his People..."*

When the Rt. Rev. Dr. D. J. Ambalavanar died on the tenth October this year everyone who had known him knew that one of the greatest personalities of our generation had passed away. He had been Bishop of the Jaffna Diocese of the Church of South India for twenty two years, and earned a name as a dynamic Bishop. But everyone also knew that that was not the reason why he was looked upon as great.

Jeyam Ambalavanar was a man of deep piety. "Therefore Oh King Agrippah I was not disobedient to the heavenly vision". St. Paul's confession to King Agrippah at the court of governor Festes, sums up the late Bishop's theology and religion. When the Senate of Sarampore invited him to give the convocation address in 1996 he chose this text which had inspired him since his student days at Jaffna College. When this able and intelligent young man decided to offer himself to the work of God many people including his mother tried to dissuade him, but, Bishop Ambalavanar stuck to his decision. After that there was no turning back. I have travelled with Bishop Ambalavanar to many places and shared a room during our travels. Early mornings he would spend atleast one hour with the Bible. Even in his sleep he would say "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus".

Since Bishop Ambalavanar feared God he did not fear anything else. Many things had happened in our

homeland and in our Church during the past twenty five years and especially during the past three years. But he remained calm to the end. Fortitude was his great strength. He would often speak the memorable words of ARNOLD TOYNBEE 'The Empires which survived were not those which cried over spilt milk but those which found new cows and started milking them'. He saw his Lord as the Lord of history and firmly believed that ultimately His will would triumph. People who were disillusioned with the change and decay all around them went to this man of positive thinking for solace and comfort.

The late Bishop was also a man of action. He was a KARMAYOGI in every sense of the word. The words of Jawaharlal Nehru to his daughter Indira influenced him immensely. Nehru had written "it is good to write history but it is far better to make history." Even his unfriendly critics would concede that Ambalavanar made history during his BISHOPRIC. During these perilous times the Jaffna Diocese continued to grow. The church universal and politicians in South Asia had to take note of Bishop Ambalavanar and the Jaffna Diocese of the Church of South India. He was convinced that better conditions produce better people. He therefore worked with great zeal for the betterment of the down trodden, lowly and the lost. Sixteen homes for the poor boys and girls and sixty six Day Care Centres were set up throughout



the island. He would tell the story of the man who tried to save the crabs of the seashore to drive home his point. This man was catching the crabs and throwing them into the sea lest they were eaten by the birds. A person who saw his action pooh-poohed it, remarking, "What difference would it make when millions of crabs are on the shore." The man threw another crab into the sea and said "For this crab it makes a difference" Even though we cannot give opportunities to all the destitute children, we will be able to save atleast some of them was the contention of the late Bishop when he opened up the Children's Homes and Day Care Centres.

The late Bishop identified himself fully with the people of his land. His commitment to Jaffna was total. He not only continued to live and work for the people of Jaffna after retirement, but also influenced his wife and sons to serve the troubled homeland. He and his family experienced much hardship and disappointments during the past three years. But the Bishop did not lose heart. His faith in God and love for people helped him to overcome all the atrocities and losses.

Bishop Ambalavanar was conferred the honorary doctorate by the Senate of Serampore in 1996. But everyone who had known him would accept that he was one of the intellectual

giants of his time. He would have earned his doctorate in any prestigious university with much ease. He was a scholar, writer, preacher and skillful debator. Even though he knew his intellectual capacity, he chose to spend all his time with people. He did not crave for fame and recognition. This I would consider the greatest sacrifice Bishop Ambalavanar made for the Church and his people.

One can therefore say with sincerity that in the death of Bishop Ambalavanar a very admirable personality endowed with great mental strength and high moral fervour has passed from our midst. He had suddenly quit what was the scene of his loving labours for the past forty years. After a funeral service at the Cathedral where thousands had come to pay their last respects his body was borne reverently on the shoulders of his clergy and laity to its last resting place at UDUVIL MISSION grave yard. He was sixty nine years old at the time of his death.

"The text on which Dr. Daniel Poor preached at the funeral of Mrs. Harriet Winslow, founder of UDUVIL comes to my mind, when I think of the sudden death of Bishop Ambalavanar.

Then his disciples came, took the body (of John the Baptist) buried it and went and told Jesus"-Mt. 14:12

We, at Jaffna College extend to you a very hearty welcome to Our Annual Prize Giving, which affords the opportunity of meeting many friends and welwishers. We are encouraged by your presence and filled with renewed strength to forge ahead the task before us. We therefore deeply appreciate your presence and participation.

Dr. N. Ethirveerasingham, you are a happy blend of academic excellence with sports. You have brought fame not only to Sri Lanka but also to the Tamil race. Your educational career started at Jaffna Central College, then you proceeded to University of California at Los Angeles. You obtained your Ph. D at Cornell University, U.S.A. Your record in High Jump marks an important phase in the History of Sri Lankan Sports. The goal that you set before you is an example for every student here. When you set the record of clearing 06 Feet 08 inches, the then Prime Minister of Sri Lanka Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranayake sent you a telegram in which he said that Sri Lanka was proud of your achievement. You being a Tamil have brought fame at a time of Bandaranayake

Chelvanayagam pact. You had the ambition of winning the Gold Medal not only for your self but also for your people and to your country. I can remember your visit to Jaffna after winning the Gold Medal. The Principal of Jaffna Central College Rev. C. A. Smith, the Staff, Students, and the Jaffna Public were at the Railway Station to receive you. You were taken in procession from the Railway Station to Jaffna Central College with Oriental Band and garlands. I can also remember your regular and steady practices at the explanade. Your two brothers the late Mr. N. Pararajasingam who died early in life and your youngest brother Mr. N. Segarajasingam studied here. You have contributed prizes in memory of your late brother, N. Pararajasingam and your mother. We award them annually to those who shine in studies and sports. You have volunteered to come at this crucial time to serve in the Faculty of Agriculture, Kilinochchi. We thank you for your services and the example that you have set for our elite in foreign countries.

Dr. (Mrs) C. Ambalavanar, you embody all the virtues of a Jaffna College student. You had a brilliant



career at Jaffna College and worked in our two hospitals with dedication. As you gracefully distribute the prizes today, we remember how enthusiastically you carried a heavy load of prizes when you were a student here. Both you and your husband Bishop Ambalavanar come from families of dedicated Teachers and Pastors. The Missionary spirit, zeal for service and the sincere concern for the last, lost and the least were inborn in both of you. You have shared our struggle and contributed much to alleviate the sufferings of our people. Our students will always cherish the pleasant memory of receiving prizes from your skilful hands.

Rev. & Mrs. S. S. Karunaraj, we welcome you as the Methodist-Superintendent Minister of the Jaffna Circuit. We thank you for offering the opening prayer at this function.

Ladies and Gentlemen, Lawrence Cremin defines education as "the deliberate, systematic, and sustained effort to transmit, evoke or acquire knowledge, attitudes, values, skills or sensibilities as well as any outcomes of that effort."

Alfred North Whitehead defined it as "Education is the guidance of the individual towards a comprehension of the art of life; and by the art of life I mean the most complete achievement of varied activity expressing the potentialities of that living creature in the face of its actual environment."

According to these two definitions the purpose of Education is to liberate and transform the individual in the

context of their social environment and nurture them for life. Our students do not enjoy their childhood nor adolescence. They strain themselves to pass through the narrow gate of University entrance. Recent statistics show that out of 48,000 students qualified for University Admissions only nine thousand were selected to follow University Courses. Another 1,000 may be selected to the University Colleges. What about the balance 38,000 who qualify but without avenues to continue their studies. Do we regard them as drop outs or pushed outs? To educate oneself is a basic human right. Opportunities, freedom and equal facilities in education must be equally provided. Our students in Jaffna are living in fear and anxiety and burn the Midnight Oil. It is the only hope of competing with students in other districts who enjoy the basic facilities. A National Policy of Education should take into account freedom and creativity in educational activity.

Another question is how does our curriculum help to build the inner potentialities of the individual to express attitudes, values and skills. There is a cry from the different corners of the society that our system of education should have organic links with life needs and aspirations of the society, so efforts must be made to evolve a suitable structure which carries greater relevance and acceptance.

#### IN MEMORIAM:-

We regret to record the death of Mrs. Ruby Ramanathar. Ruby Teacher as she was fondly called died in



India in October 28th at the age of 73. She served Jaffna College as a teacher of english in the Primary School for over twenty seven years.

Mr. R. D. Thanabalasingham popularly known as Boarding Master died on 06th December at the age of 62. He served Jaffna College for a period of 34 years. We thank God for the services rendered by these people.

#### THE STAFF:-

There are 54 members on the Staff. 44 in the Permanent Cadre, 06-employed and 04 Temporary. 08 in the Non Academic Staff. There are 30 Graduates of whom ten holding Postgraduate Qualification, 11 are Trained or Specilist Teachers. 50% of the Staff are Women.

Mr. E. S. Selvarajah completed a Postgraduate Diploma in Education and has resumed work. Miss. G. Thangarajah completed Teacher Training Programme at Koppy and has come back to serve in the Primary School.

Mr. N. V. Jeyakumar is on study leave to follow the Diploma in Education Course. Mr. P. Thevamithiran is following a Teacher Training Programme in Music at Kopay.

#### ON ROLL:-

There are One Thousand One Hundred and Sixty Threc students on roll. The break up being Primary School-361, Junior Secondary School-300, Senior Soeondary School-332 and G. C. E. Advanced Level-170.

#### NEW ADMISSIONS:-

147 students admitted during the course of this year. 97 in the Primary School, 35 in the Junior Secondary School and 15 in the Senior Secondary School.

### The Primary School :

The academic, religious and extra curricular activities of the Primary School were carried out under the efficient Supervision of Miss S. D. Sittampalan. The Primary School Parent's Day Gandhi Day, English Day Sports Meet and the Christmas Programmes were well attended by parents. English is being taught from Year I upwards to enable the students to pick up the Language early in life.

### Primary School Building :

The Ground floor of the Primary School is 75% Complete. The hall is named after the late K. A. Selliah of revered memory and was declared opened by the Rt. Rev. Dr. S. Jebanesan on Friday 24th February.

### RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES :

Students and Teachers have taken active part in the religious activities of the school. The morning Chapel Services and the Staff Prayers are held regularly. Students conduct the Chapel Services on Wednesdays, Singing is on Thursdays and S. C. M. activities are on Tuesdays. Staff Prayers are held on Wednesdays during the Interval Time. Guest Speakers are also invited to speak at this time. Staff retreat was conducted by Bishop Jebanesan

on 03rd January. This was followed by a discussion. Christmas Programme of Carol Singing and Playlets, Easter Programme with Tamil and English singing were conducted efficiently by both Staff and Students. The S. C. M. conducts Bible Quiz Competitions and produce Playlets.

We have bought 80 Tamil Hymn Books from the Diocesan Office for our use in our Worship Services. A repeat performance of "Emmanuel Cantata" was conducted at Vembadi Girl's High School. The English Choir and the Western Musical Instruments such as Trumpet, Trumbone enriched our programmes. The Y. M. C. A. conducted tournaments in Indoor Games and awarded Trophies and Certificates. It also organised a 03 day Seminar on Leadership Programme. 63 students from various schools participated in this programme.

### CULTURAL ACTIVITIES :

The Tamil Mantram organised 'Bharathi Day' festival in the College and in the Undergraduate Department. Debates, Pannel Discussions, Music, Dancing and singing were part of the programme. The 'Tamil Thinam' was organised by the Tamil Department with Drama, Carnatic Music, Singing



Competitions, Essay Competitions, Speech Competitions and Dramas. The Inter House Drama Competitions were conducted and Hastings House became Champions. In the Inter House Quiz Competitions Abraham House became Champions. The Commerce Union organised a programme of 'Kathavarayan Koothu'. Our students participated in the 'Paa Othal' Competitions, Essay Competitions and Speech Competitions organised by the Department of Education at Circuit Level and three students were selected to participate in the district competitions. M. Karthiga won the Gold Medal in the District Competition. Our students also participated in the Science and Mathematics Quiz Competition organised by the Department of Education and the Team was selected to participate in the District Competition.

### ENGLISH DEPARTMENT :

Special English Classes are being conducted outside the school hours to improve the standard of English. Weak students are identified and a teacher is appointed to take charge of 10 students at a time. Reading, writing and speaking skills are practiced here. English Day Programme and Competitions are conducted at Class Level and in age Groups. Students who obtained first three places are sent to participate in the District Competitions. This year 11 students obtained places in the district competitions organised by the Department of Education. They won places in spelling, Dictation, Writing, Picture Composition and Speech Competitions.

The English Department has formed an English Union for those students who are interested in English Programmes. They meet once a fortnight and conduct meetings in English. Recitation of Poems, Competitions in Spelling, Essay writing and Dialogue are some of the Programmes. Mrs. P. Thampoe is incharge of this Union.

The College Band and English Choir are trained by Mrs. S. V. Jebanesan. Western Orchestra of Our College performed at the combined Carol Festival, at Vaddukoddai Church at the Prize Giving Function, and at JDCSI Card service held at Vembadi Girls' High School.

### SPORTS:-

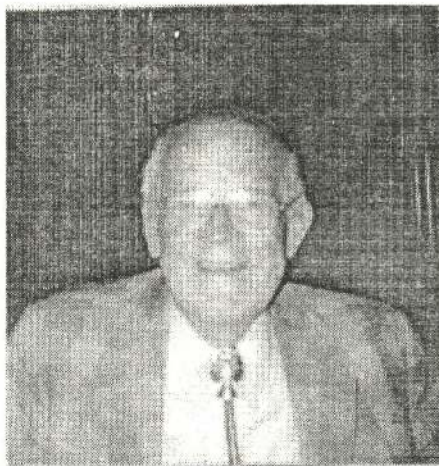

There are forty Girl Guide. The Guides celebrated the Thinking Day on 22nd February 1994. Stationary and rice were collected and distributed to displaced from Illavalai and Mathagal schools. #### HOSTELS:-

We are one of the very few schools in Jaffna running a Boarding house for students. The high cost of provisions and lack of transport facilities have compelled most of the schools to close down the hostels. There are 45 students in the Bunker Hall. Most of these students are given scholarships by the CCF, Jaffna Diocese and by the College. These children come from under privileged homes. Students from Kilinochchi area even stay during the vacation. These students are provided with lighting facilities and Water supply. The boarders take an active part in the religious activities and the school functions. I thank Mr. N. A. Vimalendran and the resident Staff for their supervision in the Hostels.

#### Students Aid :-

200 students are helped by KNH and CCFC to study at Jaffna College. 60 students from Levy Saulding Boys' Home, 45 from Bunker Hall and 95 day students. Students from poor homes are given facilities to study at Jaffna College. I thank the CCFC Field Representative in Sri Lanka Ms Leslie Collins and KNH Representative Mr Jeevajothy for their help.

#### JAFFNA COLLEGE COMPLEX :- UNDERGRADUATE DEPARTMENT:-

The Undergraduate Department in Jaffna is progressing well under the Directorship of Mr. S. Balachandran.

We prepare students for G. A. Q, G. S. Q (Bio), B. A Part I and Part II Peradeniya and Jaffna Examinations. We have also started the Advanced Level repeat classes. This will be conducted during week days. The classes are conducted at the Bishop Kulendran Memorial Hall.

The Branch school at Paranthan is progressing well under the Head-mastership of Mr. K. S. Thisarajah. We have 106 students and five teachers. We also run a Nursary at the College premises. Additional furniture and Minor repairs were done to the buildings. The school conducted ' Oli Vila ' and the Sports Meet. Parents, Public and the Members of the Department of Education were invited.

#### CHRISTIAN INSTITUTE FOR THE STUDY OF RELIGION & SOCIETY & EVELYN RUTNAM INSTITUTE FOR INTER - CULTURAL STUDIES.

Seminars on religious, social and cultural issues were organised by the the CISRS and the Evelyn Rutnam Institute. Mr. A. Kadirgamar, the acting director of the CISRS has been conducting these seminars and diffusing information and knowledge to the people in general. The Evelyn Rutnam Institute is a resource - centre for the students of the University and they



also benefit by the seminars and study circles conducted there. Mr. S. Sivalinga - rajah, Senior Lecturer in Tamil has been appointed as the Director of this Institute. The library at this institute and the archives cater for research, students. I thank Mr. Kadirgamar for organising the seminars at the C I S R S.

#### **JFFNA COLLEGE INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY & INSTITUTE OF AGRICULTURE :-**

Mr. E. M. Jebarajah continues as acting Director. The student in - take has improved since last year. The Open University of Sri Lanka has recognised our Technician Diploma awarded by the Institute for exemption of those seeking admission to the Open University. Sri Lanka Engineering Society has also recognised the Technician Diploma. Lectures and practicals were conducted for all courses with the help of generators.

The Institute of Agriculture has decided to run a two year Agriculture Diploma Course to help the educated youth to widen their knowledge and experience in agriculture science. It is encouraging to note that we have received over two hundred applications for the 1994 / 95 Agriculture Diploma course. Out of this number fifty were selected. Out of forty students admitted in June 1992 thirty - eight appeared for the final examination. Seminars and workshops in collaboration with various other organisations were conducted mainly on topics related to agriculture animal husbandry and other related

fields, with the idea of educating the farmers and cattle owners.

My thanks are due to the acting director of the Institute of Technology Mr. E. M. Jebarajah, the principal of the Institute of Agriculture and the Staff of both the Institutions.

#### **THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION :-**

The Alumni Association of London, Toronto, Sydney, Melbourne, Colombo and Vaddukoddai are functioning well. Whenever Board Members or Principal visit them they rally round and express concern of the College. The Toronto and London Associations have organised and played Battle of the Golds in Cricket. The Alumni Association has sent Rs. 10,000/- to Colombo Alumni Association to conduct the Jubilarian Function.

We regret to record the sudden death of Mr. M. A. Velupillai, the long standing and loyal Alumnus. He was an active member of the Colombo Association. After retirement, he became active in the mother Association. He served in the Board of Directors as an Alumni Representative for five years. He was outspoken and well equipped with Education Departmental affairs. A lot of correspondence with the Education Department for the benefits of the Staff was done by him. We express our sympathy to his wife, children and loved ones.

## Principals Report 1997

We at Jaffna College are privileged to have our buildings and properties safe. As we read the history of Jaffna College and especially the events that took place after 1990, we realize the "Light of Life" has never been put out. There is some divine guidance that has sustained this Institution during the traumatic experiences of our people. The flame that was kindled by the Missionaries has been guiding the destiny of this Institution. We realize the power of God is among us and prompts us to participate in Gods work with renewed strength and hope. "We are hard pressed but never cornered; Bewildered but never at wits end; hunted, but never abandoned to our fate; struck down but never killed. Where ever we go we carry with us in our body the death that Jesus died so that in this body also the life that Jesus lives may be revealed. (2 Cornth 4: 8-10)

### College Activities:

This report covers the period from January 1995 to December 1996. Till October 31st, 1995 we have had all our educational, sports, cultural and religious activities. In 1995 the number on roll was 1247. 147 students were admitted this year. 107 in the Primary School, 35 in the Junior Secondary School and 55 in the Senior Secondary School. After the exodus, we returned to our College home in April 1996 and started school on the 8th May. 75% of the students and 80% of the staff have come back.

### Staff:

There are 54 members of the staff. 44 in the permanent cadre, 06 re employed and 04 temporary. There are 30 graduates of whom 10 hold Post Graduate qualification. Eleven are trained or specialist teachers. Three of our staff members retired in the course of this year Miss S. Sellathurai, Mr. T. Nithiyaratnam and Mrs. N. Balasingam. Miss S. Selvadurai served Jaffna College for over 40 years. She is the Head of the Department of English and organises competitions for the English Day Programme. Mr. T. Nithiyaratnam served for 18 years and was in charge of Sports. He coached our Football and Cricket teams. Mrs. N. Balasingam served for 29 years. She taught mainly Science in the Junior Secondary School and Senior Secondary School classes. We thank all of them for their dedicated services. We regret to record the death of Mr. S. Balachandran, who was a teacher of Physics and Maths for more than 25 years and later functioned as Director of our Undergraduate Department. The Rev. A. A. Paul, our Junior Vice - Principal and Chaplain is following a Masters Programme at Princeton Theological Seminary, U. S. A. He is expected to return in June 1997.

### Academic Achievements:

The year 5 scholarship and G. C. E. O/L examination were not held in 1995 due to military operations. But the G. C. E. O/L examinations were held in August 1995.

#### Primary School:

The activities of the Primary School were carried out under the efficient supervision of Miss S. D. Sittampalam. The Parents Day is one of the programmes that teachers and Parents lookforward to with great expectation. They also conduct Gandhi Day, English Day, Sports Meet and the Christmas Programmes. English is taught from Year I upwards to enable the students to pick up the language early in life.

#### Religious Activities:

The morning chapel service, the Vesper services, Sunday morning Worship services, staff prayers, the SCM activities and Y M C A activites were conducted



enthusiastically. The hostellers took an active part in the choir and in organizing these programmes. We have printed new Tamil hymn books to suit the needs of our students. In the worship services special prayers were offered for peace and harmony in our country. At the beginning of each term staff retreats were conducted by the Rt. Rev. Dr. S. Jebanesan, and the Rt. Rev. Dr. D. J. Ambalavanar. On 23 - 11 - 96 we conducted a combined schools Carol Service at Uduvil Girl's College. Fourteen schools participated in this event. On 24 - 11 - 1996 we conducted the Annual Carol Festival at the Cathedral Church, Vaddukoddai.

#### The English Department :

The standard of English in Sri Lankan schools had gone down tremendously due to the change in the medium of instruction. It is difficult to find teachers who are interested in the study of the language. But the value of English as a universal and communicative language is felt by all of us. We are planning to organize a training programme for English teachers. A special programme for the study of this language has been carried out. Our English Choir practices, Christmas programmes. English Day competitions help to developing this skill. We are looking forward to organise the English language lab with more facilities for developing the communicative skill. We still have our Western Orchestra and College Band with children interested in these programmes. Our students participated in the District competitions organised by the Department of

Education and obtained 22 places. In 1996 we obtained 14 places in the District competitions.

#### Hostels :

We still run our hostels even though the prices of essential food items have gone up. We have 44 students in our hostel. 90% of them are on Scholarship given by the C C F C and the Diocese. These students form the nucleus of our religious activities. Most of these students come from Under Privileged homes. They are given extra tuition in weak subjects.

#### Teachers Day Celebrations

In keeping with the International Day of Teachers the School Council organized a programme to honour, respect and show their gratitude for the services rendered by Jaffna College teachers. This was held on November 6th. A representative of Parents Association, Alumni Association and members of the Board were invited as guest speakers. The teachers were taken in procession by the students council to the Ottley Hall, where the public function was held. The administrators and teachers who had served for more than 25 years were honoured by garlanding and presentation of gifts by the students. Special songs, dances and cultural items were held. The President of the School council Mas. K. Kugaparan, the Alumni Representative and the girl students representative spoke on the service rendered by the teachers.

This function will be held every year to honour the teachers.

### The Alumni Association:

The Battle of the Golds in cricket is played every year. The Toronto Association has contributed Cdn. \$ 500/- for the purchase of cricket matting. The Principal met the London Alumni in 1994 and recalled memories of student days in the Undergraduate department. The Principal also thanked the staff especially the late Dr. W. L. Jeyasingam and Mr. J. H. Ariyaratnam for their dedicated and untiring service rendered to the undergraduate department. It is my expectation that they would continue to support and encourage the activities of the College.

### The Undergraduate Department:

The Undergraduate Department situated in Jaffna is our new site for Post Secondary Education. At the moment we are preparing students for the G S Q examination of the University of Peradeniya. 22 students have enrolled themselves to follow this course. We are conducting theory classes in Botany, Zoology and Chemistry. Practical classes are conducted at Jaffna College Vaddukoddai. Most of the lecturers are visiting lecturers.

The first batch of students sat for their examination in December 1996. We also have classes in basic

English for those students who have enrolled with the Jaffna University. Mr. S. Balachandran was organising these classes as Director of the Department.

### Christian Institute for the Study of Religion and Society (CISRS) & Evelyn Rutnam Institute:

The Evelyn Rutnam Institute is a resource centre for the students of the University. Seminars and Study Circles on issues of vital importance, are discussed here. Mr. S. Sivalingarajah Senior Lecturer in Tamil organises the programmes for the Institute. The Library and archives provide the resource materials for students doing Post graduate studies. The CISRS conducts seminars on religious, social and cultural issues. Recently the first Tamil Novel entitled 'NORUNGUNDA IRUTHAYAM' by Mangalanayagam Thambiah was published by the CISRS. Since Mr. A. Kadirgamar has left the island Dr. Miss C. V. Selliah is organising the work of the Institute.

### Jaffna College Institute of Technology

The aim of the Institute is to provide opportunities in tertiary education for the School leavers. After the training they will become Middle Grade Technicians and Craftsman. We provide the following courses.

1. Technician Diploma in Civil Engineering
2. Diploma in Draftsmanship
3. Computer programming and Data Processing
4. Automobile Technology
5. Craft courses, Machine shop practice

6. Electrical wiring and installation on welding practice
7. Advance Diploma in Computer Programming

We are now operating at the Jaffna College Undergraduate Section Jaffna and at Vaddukoddai.

#### **Institute of Agriculture :**

37 students were enrolled at the beginning for the one year Agriculture Diploma course and 11 of them sat for the final examination in June 1995. 38 students were taken in May 1995 for the 1995 / 97 two year Diploma course and another 28 students were selected for the one year certificate course in May 1995. These students were able to attend classes only upto October 1995. We have taken 30 students in July 1996 for the Junior certificate courses. Also arrangements are being made to take students for the one year and two years Diploma courses.

I am grateful to the Chairman of the Board Rt. Rev. Dr. D. J. Ambalavanar and our Bishop Rt. Rev. Dr. S. Jebanesan for their timely advise and guidance.

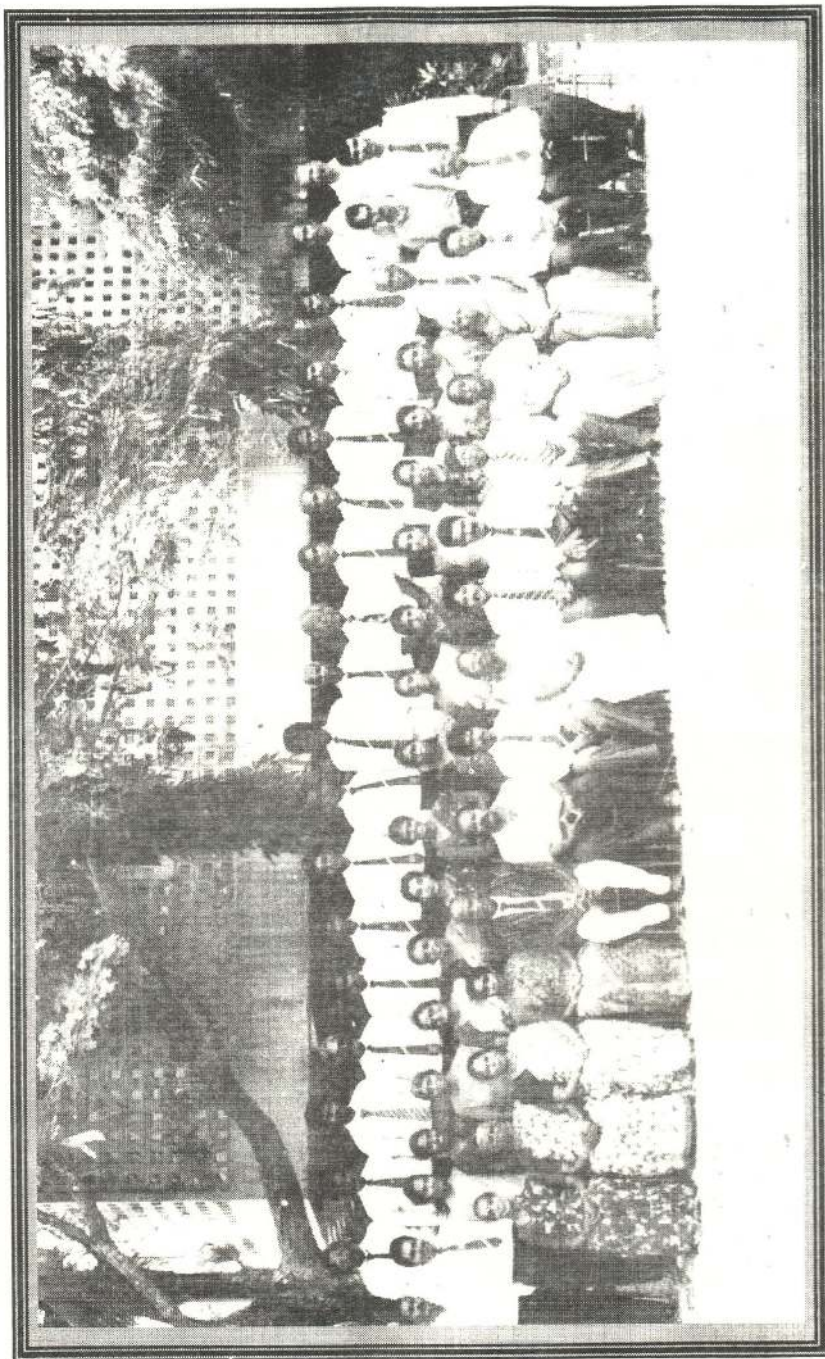

### 1995 - 1997

The appointment of Mr. A. C. Francis, Miss Sashikala Rajasundaram and Miss Sivajothy Narendran are a great asset to us with their outstanding talents. We look forward to their contribution to this department by bringing out the latest aesthetic talents of the young students in our department.

We are happy to welcome Mr. P. Thevamithiran and Mr. S. Rajasegaram back into our midst after successfully completing their course of studies in Carnatic Music and Tamil respectively.

## Dr. Robert Porter

In the year 1816-the first batch of missionaries set their foot on a tiny hamlet called Batticotta-Now called Vaddukoddai, to propagate the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the year 1981, Dr. Robert Porter walked into our midst as a missionary.

Dr. Robert Porter affectionately called Bob, cheerfully walked through the lives of many in this part of the country for almost 17 years. Robert Porter a man for all seasons is a master of languages. He has a Doctrate in English Literature and has also mastered the German and French Languages well. He has served as a teacher of languages in his homeland for many of years and served in Germany and Iran during the hostages crisis.

Dr. Robert Porter was a different type of a missionary. He quickly understood the political climate of this country and the effects of it on the Jaffna populace. During his tenure he had seen hundreds of people die and hundreds more injured and many more homeless and fleeing for safety. A Ministers son himself, Robert Porter had been nurtured on the spiritual principles of Pauls letter to the Corinthians on love. (1 Corinthians: 13.). He did deeply understand the basic concepts of Pauls mind and spirit. Robert Porter being never an exhibit or prententious, seldom displayed his emotions or affections publicly. He kept all his love, compassion and kindness for the young ones, less fortunate, less cared for and the suffering

children of this earth. He longed and enjoyed their company to the last moment. He felt very comfortable with them. He was one of them. Language was no barrier. Once love, laughter and music broke the language barrier communication became very easy. How much he enjoyed the evening meal every Friday at the Boys Hostel. For him it was supper-de-luxe. His hearty laughter was spontaneous and made others cheerful too. He was pregnant with jokes and tales of all types and at all times. He enjoyed to see others happy.

Dr. Robert Porter had helped quite a few people during his tenure here. He gave heartily, volunteerly and quitely. This left hand never knew what his right hand did. Just over a year ago he initiated a large fund raising drive to help an old girl of Jaffna College towards her urgent Medical needs.

Dr. Robert Porters home was opened to all. He shared what ever he had at home with his guests. A student of Jaffna College always received a better seat. He was very popular among all students. He enjoyed when ever little children called him Bob. The barriers man had created in Jaffna was abominable to Bob Porter.

Next to loving, singing and sharing he enjoyed reading the most. An avid reader he regularly gifted valuable books to the library and subscribed for magazines of repute and donated them to the library.

Dr. Robert Porter served the College in many aspects, and was an asset to the church. Since he moved with the masses with a friendly warmth he was respectfully accepted by the community as one of their own.

Dr. Robert Porter's contributions towards the College English Department had been great and highly useful. He taught English, prepared our students for musical and singing programmes and competitions. He coached and directed English plays. He always pressed the need for the study of English particularly, English Literature into the minds of the students. His last effort before leaving our shores was the six months English course for twelve selected teachers and seminarians. Not only has the College benefited by his faithful services but the church too had gained immensely from his endeavours. He was in charge of the English choir and took pains taking efforts to prepare choirists for competitions and during the christmas seasons to present a delightful and excellent carol services. The cathedral

choirists always performed well under his guidance. Dr. Porter's presence was always felt at the morning and evening services.

Dr. Robert Porter was a very difficult person to read and understand. He could be easily misunderstood. He was a typical New Yorker who called a spade. He had no malice in his heart and if he did discipline some one it was with a good purpose. He had no barriers or compartments. He was an open man with a large heart.

The farewell functions held to felicitate him on his departure by Jaffna College proved beyond doubt the extent to which Dr. Robert Porter had made a nonerasable impact on the people of Vaddukoddai. The missionary who had made others laugh and some times allowed others to make a joke of him made tear drops fall from their eyes.

We sincerely pray our Almighty would bountifully bless him always.

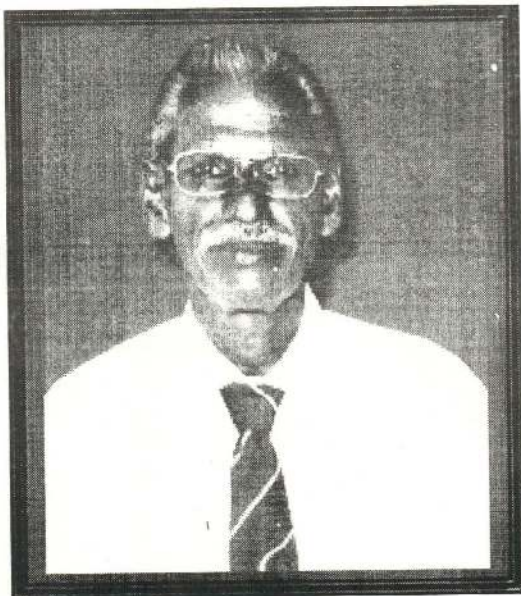
