EDUCATION IN 1926.

FROM THE STATISTICS GIVEN IN THE Report of the Director of Education is 1926 it is evident that Vernacular education made slow but steady progress during the year. There were 3,020 Angle-Vernacular and Vernacular schools thus showing an increase of 57 schools over those of the previous year. The b ye attending schools of the afcresaid type were 261,354 while girls numbered 147, 787, thus showing an increase of 8,746 boys and 7,886 girls over those of the previous year.

It is reported that "except in a few cases the school buildings do not appear to have improved during 1926" The District Inspectors of the various divisions complain that a large number of school buildings are of a temporary character and in some instances "classes and teachers are packed together in one or two rooms where teaching has to be done under very difficult circumstances." In the Northern Division no substantial improvement had been made in the mator two rooms where teaching has to be done under very difficult circumstances." In the Northern Division no substantial improvement had been made in the matter of school buildings. This unsatisfactory state of affairs can be remedied by substantial fivancial help to Managers in the shape of building grants. The payment of a sum of Rs. 30,500 as building grants towards Vernacular schools is hardly sufficient to meet new extensions or additional improvements for 1,850 Assisted schools. It is to be hoped that the Government will hereafter be more generous in their allocation of building grants to Vernacular schools.

In the matter of school furniture and equipment, it is said, that sufficient attent in has not been paid to them by the Managers of many Assisted achools. In this matter it appears that the Northern Division has escaped from blame. The Managers of Assisted schools in this Division have realised the importance of supplying teaching materiais such as maps, pictures and globes and many schools have been well stocked with these articles.

Adequate supply of trained and certi-

Ad-quate supply of trained and certificated teachers is commented upon in the Report. Nothing in our opinion is more important to the progress and efficiency of Vernacular education in this country than the question of trained teachers. Year by year there is an increasing demand for the supply of trained teachers. This demand is created both by the increase of pupils in the old schools and by the establishment of new schools. This demand is not met by the existing training schools, Government and Assisted. The Assisted Training schools are managed by Christian religious bodies where hardly any provision is made for the training of teachers who do not belong to their denominations. It is the Government Training schools which have to supply the trained teachers necessary for the Government as we'l as Assisted schools under non-christian management. This increased armond can only be met by the Government making up its mind to admit moreboys in its Training schools. The Superintendent of the Gopay Training School reports that during this year 15 more students were admitted into the First Year class to meet this increased from the forcease the present paucity of another decade the present p Adequate supply of trained and certificated teachers is commended to the comment of the comment

The work of the Ociental Studies Societies in Colomby and Jaffan finds a place in the Report of this year. We are glad to note that the examinations of these Societies are becoming increasingly popular in the country.
