Leakages of Examination Papers Westphalia

have been made, the following are the only genuine cases to which our attention has been

At the Gevernment Clerica Examination held in April, 1923, questions leaked out and appeared in the daily papers on the morning of the day of the examination. The leakege was traced to the Peinting Press and certain officers of the Press were dismissed.

In 1929, information leaked out about questions set for the Tamileachers' Certificate Examination held at a centre in Jaffna. A departmental officer, who supervised at the centre, was suspected, but there was no definite proof.

In 1932, there was a wholesale leakage of questions of the Sinha-lese Teachers' Certificate Examination. Investigations were made by the C. I. D. but the culprit could not be traced although, according to the information available, leakage had occurred

In 1936, question papers set for the Vernacular Teachers' Certifi-cate Examination became known at certain centres, again in the Gampaha area. The C. I. D. were unable to trace the source.

In 1940, questions in English Language and History of the J. S. C. Examination leaked out. The C. I. D. could not find out how this had happened. But it was thought at the time that it was due to faulty arrangements for printing of papers.

In 1946, the papers of the 'inhalese Teachers' Certificate Examination were out before the

1862, there would appear to have been only 6 genuine cases of leakage, of question papers. In 4 of these cases, the suspicion was that the leakage occurred from Examination Centres. In the other 2 cases, the leakage was apparently due to faulty printing arrangements. It is noteworthy that there has been no case whatever of leakage from the Examinations Branch of the Education between the state of the state of examiners and the setting of papers, the marking of scripts and the assessment of results.

"I can understand or I can conceive the possibility of some rea-soning for young men who thought they were fighting for freedom, when they wanted to get out of autocratic rule.
