## Public Opinion Will Be Considered

Says. Minister Ponnambalam

Speaking at the Conference of North Ceylon Tamil Teachers held at the Jaffna Town Hall on Saturday, Mr. G. G. Ponnambalam, Minister of Industries advised teachers not to be perturbed by the White Paper proposals. The Government would not commit itself to any new educational policy before it had sensed public opinion.

Mr. Ponnambalam added that he was opposed to managers controlling teachers' salaries. He had in the old State Council advocated direct payment. He could assure them the Government would not be so foolish to adopt the block-grant system.

### Cost of Education

Mr. A. E. Tamber, President of the All-Ceylon Union of Teachers said the cost of education appeared to be troubling politicians. Clear thinking was necessary. If the Government were really keen on providing compulsory and free education, they must not grudge the cost. The education budget did not reveal extravagance unless it be the expenditure in govern
