Control Commercial Banking
It is absolutely essential therefore that the reserve bank should have the powers and scope to control the commercial banking system directly and thereby control credit in general. It naturally follows that the best way of providing facilities for direct central bank control over the entire banking system is by the Central Bank, by itself or through a subsidiary institution, extensively and actively participating in the performance of commercial banking functions. If the Bank of Ceylon is made the Central Bank, with its profit motive curtailed, or if it is subsidised and made the commercial banking organ of the Central Bank, one can boldly and with certainty predict that before long the country will have an extensive independence and of having only Control Commercial Banking world for Governments to take
