Physics Professor's View

The existence of the Hydro-gen bomb would result in mili-tary weakness rather than strength for the United States Prof. Hans Bethe, Professor of Physics at Cornell University, stated in a report published by the Foreign Policy Association. Policy Association.

The Association is an influen tial private organisation of foreign policy experts.
