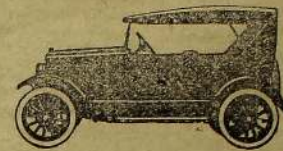

**EFFICIENCY OF THE BARDOLI PROGRAMME.**  
If we could but visualize the growing pauperism of the land and realize that the spinning wheel is the only remedy for the disease, the wheel will leave us little leisure for fighting. I had during the last two years ample time and a mind for hard thinking. It made me a firmer believer than ever in the efficacy of the Bardoli programme and therefore in the unity between the races, the charka, the removal of untouchability and the application of non-violence in thought, word and deed to our methods as indispensable for Swaraj. If we faithfully and fully carry out this programme we need never resort to civil disobedience and I should hope that it will never be necessary. But I must state that my thinking prayerfully and in solitude has not weakened my beliefs in the efficacy and righteousness of civil disobedience. I hold it as ever before to be a means for a nation's right and duty when its vital being is in jeopardy. I am convinced that it is attended with less danger than war and whilst the former, when successful, benefits both the register and the wrong doer, the latter harms both the victor and the vanquished.

**COUNCIL ENTRY QUESTION.**  
You will not expect me to express any opinion on the vexed question of return by Congressmen to the Legislative Council and the Assembly. Though I have not in any way altered my opinion about the boycott of Councils, law courts and Government schools, I have no data for coming to a judgment upon the alterations made at Delhi and I do not propose to express any opinion until I have the opportunity of discussing the question with our illustrious countrymen who have felt called upon in the interests of the country to advise the removal of the boycott of legislative bodies.

**NO QUARREL WITH ANYBODY.**  
In conclusion, may I through you thank all the very numerous senders of congratulatory messages. It is not possible for me personally to acknowledge each message. It has gladdened my heart to see among the messages many from our Moderate friends. I have always thought Non-co-operators can have no quarrel with them. They too are well wishers of their country and serve to the best of their lights. If we consider them to be in the wrong, we can hope to win them over only by friendliness and patient reasoning, never by abusing. Indeed, we want to regard Englishmen too as our friends and not misunderstand them by treating them as our enemies. If we are to-day engaged in a struggle against the British Government it is against the system for which it stands, not against Englishmen who are administering the system. I know that many of them have failed to understand always to bear in mind the distinction and in so far as we have failed, we have harmed our cause.

**MOHAMMED ALI'S APPEAL.**

**NATIONAL THANKSGIVING ON SUNDAY.**  
Bombay, Feb. 7.

Maulana Mohamed Ali has issued the following appeal to the country:—

Since Poona and Bombay were the first to receive news of the release of Mahatma Gandhi, naturally they were the first also in holding meetings to offer thanks to Almighty God for restoring our great Chief to health and liberty. But just as a day was fixed some weeks ago for a common national prayer in which all communities were to join, and think a day should now be fixed for national thanksgiving also. Sunday next (10th instant) will I believe be a suitable day. Our Christian brothers would no doubt give expression to their gratefulness to God on that day in their Churches but in addition to that we should all offer on that day at 6 P. M. (Standard Time). The Nation's thanks to a merciful Providence for this double mercy of our Chief's recovery and his restoration to freedom. The Gandhi month should of course be observed and the Nation should express its deep sense of gratitude to God by preparing for our supreme effort to win the freedom of our motherland as well.

We have been paid the day's wages long before the day's work was done. And in fact before it had been well begun. Is there any reason for failing to do that work today. Should we not work all the harder now that we have been paid so well in advance? Certainly, no one in India has a right to hope for a dasher of our released general as all hope to do at the earliest possible moment, if he is not dressed in the uniform of that General's peaceful army and has not enrolled himself as a peace loving member in the ranks of the Indian National Congress. When our Chief is once more able to move about freely, as we hope he would soon do, I may as well say that, if I am consulted with regard to the preparation of the programme of his tour, I will certainly suggest that priority should be given to those provinces and districts which have distinguished themselves in the use and manufacture of Khaddar, in the enrolment of Congress members and in the collection of the Tilak Swaraj Fund. There is not the least doubt that wherever he goes he would like to cast his eyes on one moving sea of white like Khaddar.

On Sunday next when we meet to offer our thanks to Providence, I hope our appreciation of the Government's action will also be recorded and the Nation will once more declare that it has no quarrel with the British people. There is a war without an enemy and Indians are ever ready for reconciliation as any one else provided they are not asked to surrender the Nation's honour and jeopardise the Nation's freedom. We must continue to place our trust in God and in our humble efforts but nothing should be done to antagonise any one who desires to befriend us.
