EDUCATION AND AGRICULTURE

EDUCATION WAS ONE OF THE subjects of discussion in Parliament this week. One member - Mr. S. A. Pakeman (Nominated) reminded the Ministers that Ceylon is primarily an agricultural country. The aim of education should be to meduce good men and be to produce good men and women of character and good citizens. Mr. Pakeman advo-cated the establishment of cated the establishment of practical schools with a special bias in favour of agriculture as recommended by the Special Commission on education. He also desired the establishment of an Agricultural Training College at dexpressed the hope that there would be soon a large and well-equipped Faculty of Agriculture in the University and a first class agriculturists. as Vice-Chancellor. To all this the Minister for Eduthis the Minister for Edu-cation replied by saying that the question of establishing agricultural schools was a matter for the Minister for Agriculture who had been establishing schools for that purpose. With regard to the question of education in general, the Minister pointed out that the Central Schools provided an all-round edu provided an all-round edu cation to pupils intended to bring out their inhrend atilities" and these pupils would, on leaving school, be able to take to the vocation
