LOCAL & GENERAL.

ALL-INDIA AYURVEDIC CONFERENCE.—The 13th All India Ayurvedic Conference was held at Ananda College, Colombo, on Friday the 25th ultimo.

FRMS RAILWAY TRAVELLING.—A man, named Spillish, was charged by K Weerapah of the C. G. R. at the Colombo Police Court with having travelled from Jaffna to Maradessa on the 24th ultimo without a ticket.

THE HYDRO ELECTRIC SCHEME.—We understand that a telegram has been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies approving of the construction of the first stage of the Hydro Electric Scheme which is estimated to cost Rs. 1,071,000.

TEST PAPER TRAFF.—The Director of Education has suspended an officer in the Printing Department of the Education Office in connection with the leakage of question papers set for the Government Clerical examination held recently.

A PROFESSOR OF PHYSICS.—The salary of the Professors of the University College, was discussed at a meeting of the Finance Committee held in June last, and it was decided to advertise the post of Professor of Physics in England as well as in India on a salary of 800 pounds by increments of 40 pounds to £1,000 and thereafter by annual increments of 50 pounds to 1,100 pounds.

TALAIMANAR CUSTOMS.—We learn that for reasons of health it has been decided that the period of service to officers on duty at Talaimanar Customs should be reduced to one month and that the expenses of officers transferred should be paid by the Government according to the regulations.

FAREWELL TO A CIVIL SERVANT.—Mr. P. O. Fernando, C. G. S., Office Assistant to the Government Agent Northern Province and Additional Police Magistrate, Jaffna, was entertained to a farewell dinner on the 24th ultimo by his friends at the Kankasanturai Resthouse on the eve of his departure to Puttalam.

SOUTH INDIAN RAILWAY.—We understand that on the report prepared by Messrs Robert Walke and Partners, Consulting Engineers, London, the Agent of the South Indian Railway has submitted proposals and estimates to the Home Board for electrifying the railway from Matras Beach to Chingleput.

PICK-POCKET IN A TRAM CAR.—One Tarin Singh, a habitual criminal, was charged last week in the Colombo Police Court with having picked the pocket of a fellow passenger in the Tram Car from Borella to Fort.

The Y. M. H. A.—Many persons have remarked to me with expressions of regret that the Y. M. H. A. movement is defunct. This is impossible. It may be that there was no tam-taming of our activities, but all the same the spirit has entered the soul of our young men, and it is doing its work.

THE NATIONAL SERVICE LEAGUE.—Some gentlemen who were responsible for ushering this body into existence are taking steps to revive this political association.

THE NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS.—Those who took part in the celebrations not as speakers on the esplanade the day following the New Year, but as members of the procession which on New Year day marched peacefully along some of the streets in Vapornonnal, singing songs in praise of the Great Gandhi would not have failed to note the heart-felt tribute which Hindu and Moslem, the educated and the uneducated were willing to place at the feet of the Master weaver of India's destiny.
