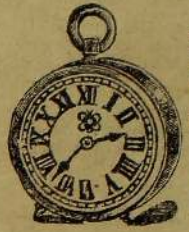

Indian & Foreign News.

ROYAL VISITORS.—Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess Arthur of Connaught, who arrived at Calcutta from Bombay on the 15th inst. have sailed for Rangoon.

TRIPLE ALLIANCE IN THE EAST.—The Japanese Embassy at London denies the story of "Lokal Anzeiger" which asserted that a secret Russo Japanese Chinese Treaty has been formed mainly to protect China from any newly formulated aggressions of either the European countries or America.

INDISPOSITION OF H. M. THE KING.—H. M. the King is suffering from bronchitis due to influenza. Despite a respite his general condition is satisfactory.

TERRIBLE FATE OF EXPLORER.—The whole of America and Europe are anxiously watching the grim struggle against the fits that has fallen on Mr. Lloyd Collins, the well known American explorer who is trapped by fallen rock in a cave, at Louisville. Collins was pinned down by the legs seven days ago, by a fall of rock. He is lying partly under water and is slowly dying, all attempts to rescue him having failed.

CO-OPERATION IN MYSORE.—The report on the working of the co-operative societies in the States during the year 1923-24 which has just been published shows there was general progress in co-operative movement during the year though there was a fall in the number of societies as well as in the membership on account of the winding up of moribund societies.

NEW VICEROY FOR INDIA.—The idea of Prince Arthur of Connaught returning to India as Viceroy has been abandoned and it is understood that Lord Lytton will probably succeed Lord Reading.

IMPERIAL BANK OF INDIA.—An Advisory Committee of the Imperial Bank of India has been established in London with Sir Sydney Sitwell as chairman and Mr. M. C. Norman and Sir Malcolm Hogg as members.

FANATICISM AT THE FRONTIER.—News has been received from Kabul that a semi-official fanaticism has resulted in stoning to death 2 simple Quadian shopkeepers on the 10th inst. in the presence of the Superintendent of Police.

SHOOTING IN TURKISH ASSEMBLY.—The corridor of the Chamber of the National Assembly was a scene of a serious incident yesterday. Following an altercation, Halid Pasha, the Deputy for Ardahan is alleged to have fired several shots at Ali Bay, Deputy for Karablow who was slightly wounded.

GOVERNOR OF KENYA DEAD.—Sir Robert Coryndon died at 11.30 a.m. on the 10th inst. All the country is mourning the loss of a most popular and able Governor.

DETENTION OF MR. VENKATARAM.—Mr. Scott put a further question in the House of Commons on the 17th inst. about the detention of Mr. Venkataram, the Manager of the "Swarnika" by the Ceylon Police.
