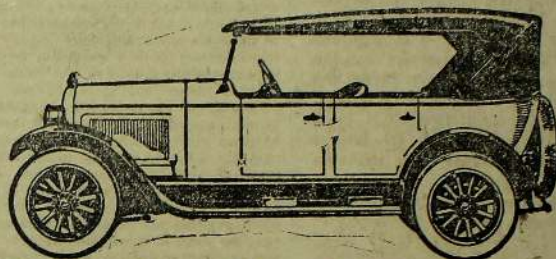

THE BUDDHIST EDUCATIONAL CONVENTION

ONE OF THE MOST NOTABLE EVENTS IN recent times is the awakening of the Hindus and Buddhists to their duties and responsibilities in the matter of the education of their children.

We think the following two resolutions which were passed at the Convention requesting the Government to amend section 11 of the Education Code are not necessary in view of its decision not to apply this section to schools opened by recognized societies.

"This Convention urges upon the Government to delete from clause 11 of the Code for Assisted Vernacular and Anglo-Vernacular Schools, the following word:—But in any case however large the attendance no new school will be aided within a quarter of a mile of an existing registered school of the same class except in towns and in such other places as may in the discretion of the Director justify exceptional treatment."

"That this Convention requests the Government to pay Grants-in-Aid to schools opened in suitable localities from the date of their opening so long as the other Code requirements are satisfied."

This section has a long history behind it. Before the inauguration of the non-Christian Education Movement by the late Sri-Lanka Sri Arumuga Navalar and the late Colonel Olcott in the Tamil and Sinhalese Districts respectively the Missionaries had the monopoly of both English and Vernacular education in Ceylon.

The campaign of these two leaders though it began at slightly different times created a great alarm in the Missionary circles. The Missionaries misrepresented to the Government the intentions of the Hindus and Buddhists.

schools and the one hundred and fifty Hindu schools which exist today are schools which survived the rigours of section 11 as well as of the most stringent rules which preceded it.

To all intents and purposes section 11 is now a dead letter. Perhaps our Buddhist friends are not aware of it. This section is one of the many difficulties which the Hindu Board of Education had to face at the commencement.

This Council recommends to Government that section 11 of the Code for Assisted Vernacular and Anglo-Vernacular Schools and section 11 of the Code for Assisted English Schools be so amended as to enable any new school opened by a recognized society of any religious denomination to become entitled to receive aid from Government within a period not exceeding one year and irrespective of its proximity or otherwise to any existing school.

This motion was not debated as the Government undertook not to apply the provisions of this section to schools opened by recognized societies.

The next question that remained to be solved is the requirement of an average attendance of 30 new children before the application for grant to a new school is considered.

The Government accepted the justice of Mr. Rajaratnam's motion and agreed to insert the following proviso to the above amended section after "counted": "except in such schools as may in the discretion of the Director justify exceptional treatment."

EDITORIAL NOTES

We are surprised to find that Thursday's gazette publishes a supplementary pass list of the October Examination, from the Colombo, Galle and Jaffna centres six more candidates pass the examination—three in the 1st division and

an equal number in the 2nd division. From the Jaffna centre, Umpirai Hindu English School alone secures two more passes, one in the 1st division and the other in the 2nd division.

We publish elsewhere the petition sent by the Police Vidhans working within the Urban Council area requesting the Government to grant them an allowance higher than that given to those residing outside the Urban area.

LOCAL & GENERAL

WEATHER—After a short interval of a bi-week showers are coming down daily from last week throughout Jaffna.

Y. M. H. A. SITHANKERY.—Two lectures were delivered during the course of last fortnight under the auspices of the Sithankery Y. M. H. A. Opportunity was availed of the presence of Mr. S. Durairajasingam, Teacher, Government English School, Ruff, F. M. S. who spoke on "The Ceylon Student in Malaya."

CHRYLONIAN SUCCESS IN INDIA.—Mr. M. Savundram Joseph of Atobuvay, Jaffna, a nephew of Messrs. J. H. Rishah Joseph, Professor of Colombo and M. T. Arunayakam of the Irrigation Department, Talawa, has been successful in the M. A. Examination of the Calcutta University, held in September last year.

ILLICIT DISTILLING OF ARRACK.—At the trial of the case instituted by Excise Inspector Ponnampalam of the Manipay range before the Police Magistrate of Jaffna charging two Nalavahs, Vally and Velan of Anicottai, with illegal distillation of arrack at their village, the first accused pleaded guilty and was fined Rs. 50.

THE EX-DRAWN OF MYSORE.—Sir Albion Banerji, Kt., the ex-Dewan of Mysore, arrived in Colombo on the 11th inst. by the B. L. "Oxfordshire" from Bangalore.

GOVERNMENT AGENCY, KANDY.—The Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersey, Government Agent, Central Province, and Mrs. Kindersey arrived in the Island on the 11th inst. by the same steamer.

NEGOMBO COUNCIL'S CHAIRMAN.—G. M. Madalar A. E. Rajapaksa was unanimously re-elected Chairman of the Negombo Urban District Council.

GENERAL HOSPITAL X RAY DEPARTMENT.—Miss Zita Bevan who returned from England on the 11th inst. takes up duties in the X Ray Department of the Colombo General Hospital as an assistant.

NEW CHIEF JUSTICE SWORN IN.—On Wednesday the 12th inst. Sir Stanley Fisher, the newly appointed Chief Justice of Ceylon, took up his oath of allegiance and the oath of justice at the Chief Appellate Court, Colombo.

PLAGUE IN COLOMBO.—Three fatal cases of plague are reported from Colombo to have occurred within three weeks in different parts of Colombo, viz. Jull Road, Battala; Wolfendhal, Estab and Kotabena.

On the second day Mr. M. S. Rajaratnam, Advocate, presided. The meeting commenced with the singing of the Vairavaram. The Chairman in the course of his long and instructive address emphasized the importance and value of Saiva education and the duties of parents and students in this matter.
