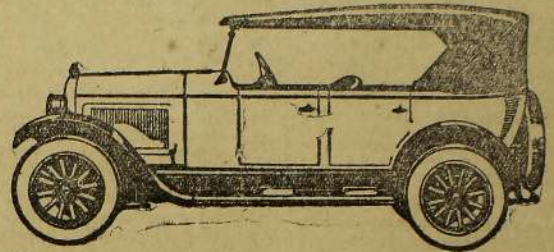

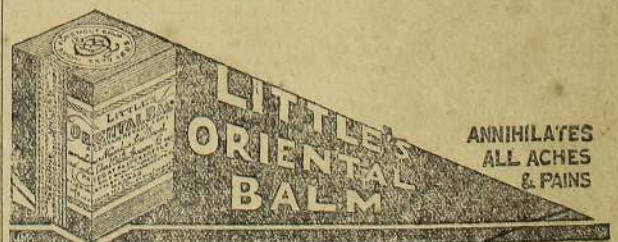

LOCAL & GENERAL

EASTER SPECIAL TRAINS—On account of the Easter Public and Bank Holidays from April 15 to 19, the up night mail, on the 14th instant from Colombo Port to Kankesanural will be duplicated from Madawachchi.

A New Asst. Inspector of Schools—Mr. V. Kadigumarathna, B.A., (London), Lecturer, Jaffna Hindu College, has been appointed an Assistant Inspector of Schools, J.F.S., the appointment to take effect from the 1st proximo.

COLONIAL OFFICERS' CONFERENCE—Mr. E. B. Alexander, the retiring Controller of Revenue who has already left Ceylon for England is expected to represent Ceylon in the Colonial Officers' Conference to be held in London in May next.

CEYLON LAWYERS' ASSOCIATION in F.M.S.—We understand that Mr. V. A. Harischandria, Proctor S. C. Jaffna, who left for F.M.S. a few months back with a view of settling down there in practice, has been admitted a Solicitor and will be practising as such in the F.M.S.

HINDU NEW YEAR.

UPLIFT OF DEPRESSED CLASSES.—It is said that 'Autaj Udhari' of the S. D. Prathidibi Sabha, is doing useful work in the direction of the uplift of the so-called depressed classes. It is stated that as a result of sanitarians' activities in the Bangalore District, 500 Baagirs were given permission to enter temples for Devadarshana and to draw water from public wells.

PROHIBITION IN C.P.—The Nappur Municipal Committee at its general meeting adopted Mr. Baswarial's resolution for total prohibition of liquor shops within the limits of the committee by 12 against 10 votes and requested the Hon'ble Mr. Regavendra Rao, Minister of Excise Department, to give effect to this policy and thus demonstrate his power to the benefit of the people.

BURMESE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE—The Burmese Women's Conference was held at Pegu on the 23rd March, Daw Thant (Mrs. Soe Thoin) was voted to the Chair. TIMELY ACTION BY TAMIL COUNCILLORS.

ELEVENTH HOUR ALTERATION CONDEMNED.

The Hindus in Ceylon would have been subjected to a national insult and humiliation had it not been for the timely intervention of the Hindu Members of the Legislative Council.

The Public and Bank Holidays which was to be observed on account of the Hindu New Year which falls on the 13th inst. had been altered to Thursday, April 14, instead of Wednesday, April 13, by being notified in the Government Gazette of Friday last. When the Hindus in Colombo became aware of the alteration they brought it to the notice of the Hon. Mr. A. Mahadeva and urged on him to protest against the action of the Government.

The Hon. Members took immediate action. A telegram was sent to the Hon. E. G. G. G. Governor who was at Nawara Eliby, requesting him to have the alteration cancelled. In the meantime the Hon. The Colonial Secretary had been acquainted with the situation.

On Saturday evening we received a telegram from the Hon. Mr. W. Dadaswami that the alteration had been cancelled and that Wednesday April 13th would be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday. A Gazette Extraordinary issued on Saturday last cancels the alteration.

The prospects of the Ceylon Police have been much improved and a fine career is open to respectable and intelligent young men.

Recruits, on enlistment, undergo a course of training for two or four months at the Police Training School, Bambalapitiya.

Sergeants and Constables are eligible for the award of the Good Service Medal and grant of Rs. 7.50 per mensem after 25 years' service. The grant of Rs. 7.50 is pensionable.

X. Leave. Six weeks on full pay during the year with free Holiday Railway Warrant.

XI. Medical Attendance and Medicine are provided free to all Members of the Force and their families. Free dental treatment to Members of the Force is provided.

XII. A Policeman's or Pensioner's son or near relation are eligible for admission into the Police Boys' Bungalows which has been formed with a view to training boys from an early age to take their place in the ranks of the Force when 15 years of age.

From the age of 14 to 18 boys may be employed as office clerks and paid salaries ranging from Rs. 8/- to Rs. 15/- per mensem by 4 annual increments.

XIII. Pension is granted according to Government Rules and may amount to two thirds of the last pay drawn for a full period of service. For example, a Merit Class Constable, A Class, can get a pension of Rs. 33/- per month.

XIV. Pensioners' Corps.—Pensioners of good character may join the Police Pensioners' Corps, through which they can secure responsible employment in view of their good record and service in the Police Force, or temporary employment on special guard duties...

XV. There is a Police Saving Association which was started in 1925 with a view to promote thrift amongst the Members of the Force and to provide them with a lump sum of money when they leave the Force, or in the event of their death to provide their families with such lump sum.

Membership is voluntary and monthly subscriptions of Rs. 1/- and Rs. 2/- in the case of Constables, Rs. 3/- in the case of Sergeants, Rs. 5/- in the case of Sub Inspectors and Rs. 20/- in the case of Inspectors may be made.

Interest is paid on the money and a Constable who subscribes Rs. 1/- per month for 25 years receives over Rs. 800/-.

XVI. Compassionate Fund is maintained to which all men subscribe as follows:— Constables Rs. 2 cents per mensem (Rs. 8/- per annum) Other ranks 50 cents per mensem (Rs. 6/- per annum)

The Fund pays to the widow, children or other dependants of the subscriber, at his death, a donation of Rs. 10/- for every year of service in the case of a Constable, and Rs. 20/- for every year of service in the case of other ranks.

XVII. Athletics. Every encouragement is given to athletics. Outdoor and indoor games are provided at all stations.

Intending recruits should write or present themselves to the nearest Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, Superintendent, or Assistant Superintendent of Police, or to the Superintendent of Police, Police Training School, Bambalapitiya Road, Colombo.
