INSPIRING ADDRESSES BY THE PRESIDENT

The following is a summary of the speech delivered by Mr. S. Kastury, President S. C. President, Jaffna Saiva Parigalana Sabha, on the occasion of the grand opening of the New Home of the Saiva Prakasa Press at the "Hindu Organ" on Friday last. The report has been unavoidable without our last issue for want of space.

The Hindu Philosophy.

Having decided to open the new building Mr. Kastury said that it was his duty as the President of the J. L. Saiva Parigalana Sabha to say a few words on the occasion of the formal opening of the New Home of the Paper and the Press belonging to the Sabha. He felt proud of that day, so would be he, he hoped, the Savites in Ceylon, the E. M. S. and the Strait Settlements who belonged to a community whose Philosophy took one in the highest rung of the ladder from which one could see the gateway leading to total absorption into Godhead. "We should especially feel so today," he said, "the day on which the Paper and the Press which stood to expound the said Philosophy goes into the New Home". Continuing he said that the Western Philosophy could not ever dream of reaching to the height the Hindu Philosophy has reached. The Philosophy of the West errors has not even touched the very fringe of the most elementary principles of Vedanta and Siddhanta. So it was the Saiva religion alone, perhaps that of the Buddhists being excepted which is only a sister religion, that could safely take one to the goal. "That being the case would we not, the Savites", he asked, "feel that we were of one brotherhood that stood to elevate humanity to its spiritual height? It was the duty of all Savites to feel as one body and assist the Paper and the Press and the New Home in their work of human spiritual progress.

HISTORY OF THE SABHA.

Then the President went on to give a résumé of the history of the Sabha. The Sabha was started in 1888 at an opportune time to assist the Savites against the Christian aggression which was forging ahead. Its first President was the late Mr. T. Chellappa Pillai, the great Jurist and Retired Chief Justice of Travancore. The Vice-President was the late Mr. S. Nagalingam, Advocate Messrs. V. Caspilla, Retired Crown Proctor, and T. Kalaisapillai, Manager Naval School, who were the respective Secretary and Assistant Secretary are the survivors of those other members who took an active interest in the Sabha then. He regretted that these two gentlemen were unable to be present on that occasion. The late Mr. S. T. M. Pasupathy Chettiar was the Treasurer of the Sabha and if not for him the Hindu College building would not have been built. "Today", he said, "we would not have met in this building (New Home) if not for the strenuous efforts of his son, Mr. Sithambaranarayana Chettiar, and our thanks are greatly due to him".

THE "HINDU ORGAN"

The "Hindu Organ", which was started in September 1889, had as its first Editor, the late Mr. Obsilappa Pillai, who greatly ventilated the grievances of the Tamil community and got redress. On account of his failing health the editorial chair was taken up by the late Messrs. A. Sabapathy, A. Cathiravelu and S. Sivagurunathan. Of these gentlemen, Mr. Sabapathy did the work for many years with great satisfaction. He worked for no pay and so were the other two gentlemen. "We should be thankful to these gentlemen", he said, "who are not in the land of the living".

In conclusion he exhorted those present to feel as one body and bring up that institution to a still better footing. He prayed to Ishwara for His help in the attempt.

"Long Live Lalaji."**PROMOTORS OF HINDU MOSLEM UNITY.**

Mahatma Gandhi writes in a recent issue of "Young India" on the late Lalaji Rao under the above caption:—

Lalaji Rao is dead. Long live Lalaji. Men like Lalaji cannot die so long as the sun shines in the Indian sky. Lalaji means an institution. From his youth he made of his country's service a religion, and his patriotism was so narrow based. He loved his country because he loved the world. His nationalism was international. Hence his hold on the European mind. He claimed a large circle of friends in Europe and America. They loved him because they knew him. It is impossible to think of a single public movement in which Lalaji was not to be found. His love of service was insatiable. He founded educational institutions. He befriended the suppressed classes. Poverty, wherever found, claimed his attention. He surrounded young men with extraordinary affection. No young man appealed to him in vain for help.

In the political field Lalaji was indispensable. He was fearless in the expression of his views. He suffered for it when suffering had not become customary or fashionable. His life was an open book. His extreme frankness often embarrassed his friends if it also confounded his critics, but he was incorrigible. His activities were multifarious. He was an ardent social and religious reformer. To many of us, he became a politician because social and religious reform demanded action in politics. He observed at one stage of his public career that much reform of the type he wanted was not possible until the country was freed from foreign domination. It applied to him to most of us, as a poison coil in every department of life.

"No ENEMY OF ISLAM"

With all deference to my Muslim friends, I assert that he was no enemy of Islam. His desire to strengthen and purify Hinduism must not be confounded with the hatred of Mussulmans or Islam. He was sincerely desirous of promoting and achieving Hindu Moslem unity. He wanted not a Hindu Raj, but he passionately wanted an Indian R. J. He wanted all who called themselves Indians to have absolute equality. I wish that Lalaji's death would teach us to trust one another, and we could easily do this if we could but shed fear. There will be, as there must be, a demand for a national memorial. In my humble opinion, no memorial can be complete without a definite determination to achieve freedom, for which he lived and died so nobly. Let us recall what has after all proved to be his last will. He has bequeathed to the younger generation the task of vindicating India's freedom and honour. Will they prove worthy of the trust he reposed in them? Shall we, the older survivors, men and women, deserve to have Lalaji as a contrymen, by making a fresh and supreme effort to realize the dream of a long line of patriots in which Lalaji was so distinguished a member? Nor may we forget the Servants of the People Society which he founded for the promotion of his many activities, all designed for the advancement of the country. His ambition in respect of the society was very high. He wanted a number of young men all over India to join together in a common cause, and work with one will. The society is an infant not many years old. He had hardly time enough to consolidate this great work of his. It is a national trust requiring the nation's care and attention.
