Africans Could . Gain Freedom

By Gandhian Methods

"I believe the Africans could gain their freedom By Gandhian methods. But whether they will do so will depend on the strength of their own faith, discipline and organisation", said Rev. Michael Scott, the South African de'egate to the Pacifists Conference, in an interview with the U.P. I.

Asked about the forthcoming Round Table Conference between India, Pakistan and South Africa, Rev. Scott said: "The results of the forthcoming Round Table Conference will depend upon the motives with which the problems for discussion are approached. While the African problems are not due for discussion at the conference, it is true that racia discrimination affects alf "non-European" peoples in South Africa. It is much to be hoped that the Conference well help to imade I body I avern motives with which the problems for discussion are approached.
