The report of the committee points out that in 1948 four lads under sixteen years of age and as many as 1760 young persons of ages varying from 16 to 20 were admitted from 16 to 20 were admitted to adult prisons while only 16 were sent for Borstal treat-ment; the Children and Young Persons Ordinance which was placed on the statute book in 1939 is expected to come in 1939 is expected to come into operation on a date to be appointed hereafter; there are no Juvenile Courts, Remand Homes or Certified Schools in the Island to divert the young offender to decent ways of life; there is only one Approved School at Maggona established long before the Ordinance was passed; and there is accommodation and there is accommodation for only 136 lads at the Training School at Wathupitiwels where two more halls have been built to house 130 more
