# Age Limit In Schools

# Present Position

As an impression exists, says a Ministry of Education communique, that the age limits fixed last year by the Director of Education with the approval of the Minister have been revoked this stay is issued in explanation of note is issued in explanation of the present position,

It is necessary at the outest to make clear that no order was issued to Assisted Schools at any time with regard to age limits in classes. Certain instructions time with regard to age limits in classes. Certain instructions were sent last year to Govern ment English Schools and copies of this Circular were also transmitted to Heads of Assisted English Schools so that they may follow it, should they be so disposed. This circular has been altered to some extent by a circular sent this year. This too applied only to Government English schools, so that Assisted English schools are still as free as they used to be in the matter of admissions. as they used of admissions.

The important points in respect of which changes have been made are:

Where the numbers in a class tio not exceed 35, Heads of schools are authorised to admit schools are authorised to admit pupils into such a class, provided they are of an age which is not more than 3 years beyond the age limit fixed for it. The total number in each class should not avenued 35.

## 3 Types of School Suggested

Dr. H. W. Howes, Director of Education, outlined his six-year plan of education at a conference of Managers of Schools and rep resentacives of teachers.

The Howes plan envisages three types of schools under the Education Department, and vocational schools such as agricultural and trade schools under other Minis-

The purely literary schools will be (a) Elementary Schools, (b) Junior Secondary Schools, and (c) Senior Secondary Schools.

At the end of the Junior School a second test will be held for the selection of children for the Senior Secondary School- It is estimated that about 60 per cent will be fit to continue up to the S. S. C. examination.

The rest will have to enter vocational schools.

Those who reach a standard at the S. S. C. exami-nation, (expected to be about 25 per cent) will be fit to continue to the University Entrance and the H. S. C. Examinations.

The other 75 per cent who pass

The other 75 per cent who pass the S. S. C. may enter poly-technics and pursue courses in such subject as building construc-tion, accountancy etc. The Howes plan is within the scheme of free education up to the University.

## "Generally Practicable"

The conference considered the plan generally practicable and deferred further consideration after CAPRICORNUS Uttiradam 2, 3, 4. Thiruvonam, Avittam 1, placed under other Ministries.

The next subject discussed was educational finance. The question of 'block grants' was opposed by the Managers and teachers' representatives. It was decided they should meet again, when an alternative proposal for an equitable system of financial aid to schools will be discussed.
