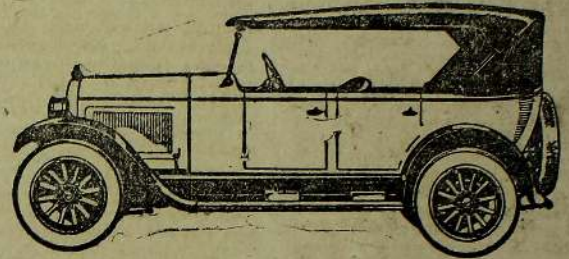

THE UPLIFT OF THE DEPRESSED CLASSES.

THE INAUGURATION OF THE DEPRESSED Classes Association marks a notable departure from the ordinary run of religious activities of the Hindus in Jaffna. Hitherto their work has been confined to the building and renovation of temples and the opening of Hindu schools for the education of Hindu children.

The Jaffna Hindus cannot remain unaffected by the great ideas and aspirations which animate their brethren in the mother country. In Jaffna we now see the beginning of the awakening of the Hindu conscience.

The one class of people is in complete sympathy with the uplift of the depressed classes. They are willing to actively co-operate with any movement which will brighten their lot and elevate their position.

Saiva religion is catholic and universal in its message. The Grace of Saivism knows no boundaries of caste or race. In the Bhakti Markam there is no caste.

The message of Saint Thyumanavar is that the realisation of Sivandam is open to all and he invites the world to come to the feast of this Sivandam.

Facilities of education should be provided for them as much as possible. The uplift of the depressed classes is one of the main objects of the Hindu Board of Education.

The next important matter is the making of some provision for their worship. In many villages the depressed classes have their own temples to worship.

JAFFNA U D O LICENCES.—The Jaffna Urban District Council has imposed for the year 1927 taxes in respect of certain vehicles paying for private use and admissa payable on or before the 25th February, 1927.

E S L O SUPPLEMENTARY PASS LIST.—Among the successful candidates in the English School Leaving Certificate Examination, October, 1926, published in the same Gazette as a supplementary pass list, Master P. Thilakampalam and C. Subramaniam of the Ursupral Hindu English Mixed School secure places in the First and Second Divisions respectively.

NEGOMBO HINDU PROCESSION.—It is understood that a batch of 100 Police have been sent to Negombo from Colombo, in connection with the Hindu procession on the 19th instant.

NEW ENGLISH NOTARIES.—Messrs S. Patarjil and R. Muttu Ramalingam, Proctors S. C. have been appointed Notaries Public to practice in the English language throughout the judicial divisions of Jaffna and Kurunegala respectively.

MEDICAL.—Dr. Gnanaratnam Cooke, M.D., son-in-law of Dr. S. C. Paul of Colombo, who had been a lecturer in Anatomy at the Ceylon Medical College, has been appointed Fifth Physician, General Hospital, Colombo.

—Dr. I. T. Kurnaratnam, who recently returned from England after securing British qualifications has been appointed to act for Dr. E. Coomaraswamy, Assistant Port Surgeon, (Immigration Branch) Colombo.

—Mrs (Dr.) P. Doray, Medical Officer, Seremban, has been, we understand, transferred to Johore, where her husband Dr. Doray is attached to the Medical Department.

GOVERNMENT CLERICAL SERVICE MEMORIAL.—A meeting of the Government Clerical Service Union for the purpose of considering the draft of a memorial on salaries, which the Union is to submit to the Salaries' Commission, was held on Saturday last at the Central Y.M.C.A. Mr. J. F. Pereira, the President of the Union, occupied the chair, and the meeting was well-attended.

MR. S. VAIDESHWARAN.

We deeply regret to record the untimely death of Mr. S. Vaideshwaran, Assistant Master, Jaffna Hindu College, on the night of the 17th inst. at his residence in Vannarponnai East. The deceased gentleman, who was about 26 years of age passed away peacefully after an illness of about four months in spite of the best available medical treatment and careful nursing.

The late Mr. Vaideshwaran, was the son of the late Mr. N. Sinnathambay, Clerk D. R. C., Jaffna and a grand nephew of Gate Mudaliyar M. S. Ramalingam, Chief Interpreter, Jaffna Kachcheri.

Christian Mission Charged.

The following account appears in the Amrita Bazar Patrika, Calcutta, of the 9th inst.:

The District Hindu Sabha of Secchi has recently brought a civil suit against the local Christian Mission to get back the three Hindu orphans who were carried away by a European Missionary. The third hearing of the case has been fixed for the 15th inst.

The local Hindu Sabha is leaving no stone unturned to fight out the case to the end. There has hardly been a case of this nature in this province. This is the first instance where the Hindus could exhibit their courage against such odds.

OFFICIAL.—Mr. W. J. Thornhill, the Acting Deputy, D. P. W., has been gazetted to act as Director of Public Works, with effect from December 27, 1926, until further orders, vice Hon. Mr. J. Strachan, who has been appointed General Manager, F. M. S. Railways.

U. P. M. POINT PEDRO.—Mr. S. Subramaniam J.P., the leading Proctor of Point Pedro, has been appointed an Unofficial Police Magistrate for the judicial division of Point Pedro.

KEYS YOUNG MEN'S UNION, COLOMBO.—The First Annual General Meeting of the Keys Young Men's Union, Colombo will be held at the St. Sebastian's School Hall, Silver Smith Street, Colombo, on Saturday the 29th instant at 5 p.m. The agenda for the day's meeting will be the reading and adoption of the annual report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 31.12.26.

STEAMER SERVICE AGREEMENT.—Last Friday's Gazette publishes the Memorandum of Agreement concluded between the Ceylon Government and the Ceylon Steam Navigation Co. Ltd., whose agents are Messrs. Walker, Son & Co. Ltd., Colombo, for a steamer service round the Island for a term of one year from the 1st of January, 1927.

CHETTY WINS SUIT AGAINST PLANTER.—Judgment was delivered after a long interval in the case in which Mr. B. A. Thornhill, of Denawaka Estate, Pelmadulla, was sued by S. P. A. Annamallam Chetty, of Ratanpura for the recovery of a sum of Rs. 55,000, being value of cash and rice orders supplied to Denawaka Estate, on the orders of the Superintendent of the estate. The plaintiff was awarded judgment with costs and interest as prayed for, and a sum of Rs. 5,000, awarded to defendant on his claim in re-conversion of damages suffered by him as a result of the event filed by the plaintiff.

"All men are born free" said Rousseau. This is mere fiction. "All men are born equal," added he. This is no more true. Far truer is the common Tamil saying that no two fingers are formed alike.

Many a time and oft the hollowness of Rousseau's dicta has been exposed. All the same Western missionaries believe in them and suppose them to form the basis principles of modern democracy.

But a society founded on mythical notions and exploded dogmas is like a house built upon sand. It must come toppling down some day or other. That is just the fate that has overtaken Western nations.

Takes that wonderful episode in the life of Appar—Vagias rightly called—such a matchless master of words is he. An apostate King, presuming upon the unbreakable loyalty of the saint—himself apostate till recently—and desirous of weaning him away from his infinitely more tenacious loyalty to his conscience, despatches messengers to him commanding him to return to his court (which he has suddenly left) and to give an explanation of his strangely altered conduct.

"Go, tell the King that we are serfs of none, We fear not death nor dread the woes of hell; We're free from guile, dare all beneath the sun We know not pain, to none our souls we sell. For ever happy, ever void of care We're vassals always only to that King To whom none else is king and Who doth wear Around each ear a flawless flower ring."

Here is the voice of true democracy and it is unmistakable. Plea riches upon riches on one side and cover them with Kings' smiles and Queens' favours; keep on the other side but a particle of true faith, vitally it tenderly glowing; the heart of real democracy will know which to choose, while that of modern democracy will fall in the choice and break. Listen to what Appar says in another context:—

"Nor beams of gold nor banks of pearl nor away Supreme o'er heaven and earth deem we as sought For they and eke their dooms shall decay Except where artless faith prevents this lot, But meek oblation we will pay to those Who, though they feed on carcases of kins And reek of odours which stink in the nose Are nonetheless kept pure by Love Divine."

Such is the discriminating heart of true democracy—a heart which makes it eternally victorious, absolutely fearless and genuinely anxious for the welfare of humanity. Our hearts must approach it, assimilate it and be impelled to action like it, for that is the way to bliss. The task may not be easy; dangers and difficulties may cross our path; but let us beware that as the German poet says,

"The future hides in it Gladness and sorrow; And we press still through, Naught that abides in it Dazzling us, onward."—"The Courier."

Gujerat National University.

SEVEN YEARS OF STEADY WORK. The seventh Convocation of the National University, founded by Mahatma Gandhi during the non-co operation days, was held at Ahmedabad on January 11, in the buildings of the University near Satyagrahshram.

OBJECT OF THE UNIVERSITY. The object of the University was the training of workers for the movement for the attainment of Swaraj. They were imparted cultural and industrial education. A beginning was made with instruction in hand-weaving and carpentry.

27 students were certified last year, of whom one was a girl. There were 31 students in the National College. Owing to introduction of industrial education, students and professors of the National College found less time for academic studies but with the attainment of proficiency in industries it was hoped that more time would be found.

After the conferment of degrees, Mahatma Gandhi exhorted the students to strive for the deliverance of the country from her miseries. The object of their education was deliverance. They should return their degrees if they found them to be deficient. They should add to what they had acquired.

GRADUATES' CONFERENCE. Presiding over the Third Conference of graduates of the National University, Mr. Kishorlal Bhavsrao, ex-Registrar of the University, advised them not to commit the mistake which they did before of supposing that after Swaraj was won within a year they would be appointed as collectors and judges under the national Government. They should always be ready to flock round the standard of Mahatma Gandhi or Mr. Vallabhai Patel whenever they were called. Meanwhile, they should devote themselves to constructive work till the fight was waged. According to the new ideal of the National University national graduates should be up.

PENNY POST IMPOSSIBLE.—Lord Wolmer, in a speech in Hampshire, said it was impossible at present to reintroduce penny postage because it would involve an initial loss of £ 6,000,000.

MEETING UNEMPLOYMENT PROBLEM.—With a view to relieving unemployment among the middle classes in Bengal a scheme is under preparation by the Local Government for establishing a vocational institution in the outskirts of Calcutta for young men to be trained in practical agriculture, dairy farming and pisciculture.

DRABIC LAW AGAINST MOTORISTS.—According to a new law in Spain a motorist knocking down a pedestrian will be immediately arrested. He is liable to imprisonment for a minimum of 12 years if the injured pedestrian dies.
