Letter to the Editor

Ethnology of the Ceylon Moors

Sir,
Regarding the recent references to the ethnology of Ceylon Moors, the following extract from a paper contributed by Sir Ponnambalam Ramanathan to the Royal Asiatic Society, Ceylon Branch will I think interest your readers.

The Arabs who have had connections not only with Ceylon but India also for over 2000 years, have been referred to by the celebrated German historian and geographer as seafaring people who from time immemorial monopolised the whole carrying trade of the Indian ocean and continued in undisturbed possession till the advent of the Portuguese.

It should also be appreciated that from the 8th century A. D. to about the 16th century A. D. their trading activities spread from the East across the Mediterranean to the Atlantic sea board.

It would also appear to be me that the magnificent contribution of the Arabs and Muslims to Ceylon and other countries in the world for over 2000 years, in the field of commerce and trade has not yet been fully appreciated. They have however been given due credit by the Encyclopedia Britannica (vol. 2 p. 164), which points out "Civilisation appeared among the Himyarites of Southern Arabia early in the first millennium B. C. when the Kings of Saba sent their ships to Africa and Southern India and built up a maritime tradition which has lasted to the present day".

Commerce and trade means as much for the Muslims as cultivation for the Vellala and Goigama villagers. They can aptly be described as businessmen par excellence

The Moors in Ceylon would appear to be descendants of Arabs, who possibly married among

the Tamils in the littoral areas of Ceylon and also of converts.

The extract referred to by me, consists of the summing up by Sir Ponnambalam Ramanathan in his paper and is as follows. "It has been shown that the 185 000 Moors in the Island fall under two classes. "Coastal Moors" and "Ceylon Moors", in almost equal numbers; that the "Coastal Moors" are those Muhammadans, who having arrived from the Comorander coast of inner districts of South India as traders or labourers, continue steadily to maintain relations of amity and inter marriage with their friends in South India; and that such "Coast Moors are Tamils

As regards the nationality of the "Ceylon Moors" numbering about 92,500 out of the 185,000, we have ample reasons for concluding that they too are Tamils, I mean the masses of them; for, of course we meet with a few families here and there, five per cent of the community, or about 5000 of the 92,500 who bear the impress of an Arab or other foreign descent. Even the small coteries of the Ceylon Moors, who claim for themselves and their co-religionists as Arab descent, candidly admit that on the mother's side the Ceylon Moors are exclusively Tamil.....

...Then, considering their social customs, I have pointed out how closely they are a copy of Tamil institutions. I have also touched upon their physical features and called attention to the opinion of some of our leading doctors of medicine and surgery, that the skull of a Moorman cannot be distinguished from that of a Tamil. In complete confirmation of the inference drawn from these arguments is the evidence afforded by language. The vernacular language of the Moor is, as I have

said, Tamil, even in purely Sinhalese districts. What diversities of creed, custom and facial features prevail among the low country Sinhalese and Kandyan Sinhalese, between Tamils of the Brabmin or Vellala castes and of the Paraya caste. And yet do they not pass respectively as Sinhalese and Tamils, for the simple reason that they speak as their mother tongue those languages? Language in Oriental countries is considered the most important part of nationality, outweighing differences of religion; institution and physical characteristics. Otherwise each caste would pass for a race. Dr. Freeman's contention that "Community of language is not only presumptive evidence of the community of blood, but is also proof of something which for practical purpose is the same as community of blood, ought to apply to the case of the Ceylon Moors. But, of course, in their case it is not language only that stamps them as Tamils. Taking (1) the language they speak at home in connection with (2) their history (3) their customs and (4) physical features, the proof cumulatively leads to no other conclusion than that the Moors of Ceylon are ethnologically Tamils"

Sir Ponnambalam Ramanathan has also in a footnote given reference to various authorities who were of the view that the Moors were Tamils. The authorities mentioned are Dutch who ruled in Ceylon for about 140 years. Rev. James Cardiner, Director of Schools, 1798-1805;

Mr. Simon Casie Chetty, a Member of the Legislative Council of Ceylon, Editor of the Ceylon Observer, 10-12-1885, Mr. A. M. Ferguson who has lived and laboured in Ceylon for over fifty years.

Arulnandi Sivachariar

Before we begin to study the great philosophic work of Arulnandi Sivachariar (ie) Sivagnana Siddhiyar, it is better to know something about the life of the author. Age is seldom essential for attaining enlightenment and maturity in the realm of spiritual experience. This fact is borne out by the lives and teachings of many a seer and saint of this land (ie) India. The lives of St. Meikandar and his principal disciple St. Arulnandi Sivachariar vividly illustrate this eternal truth,

The philosopher - Saint Arulnandi Sivachariar was the second in the four Santhanachariars, a holy line of preceptors who laid the solid foundation, as it were for the system of philosophy that goes by the name of Saiva Siddhanta.

Although the tenets of his philosophy may be gleaned from the devotional hymns of Thirugana - Sambandhar and Appar and St. Thirumular, it was Meikandar of 13th century the first Santhanachariar who for the first time attempted at anything like a systematic expression of the philosophy to be followed by others namely, Arulnandi Sivachariar Maraignava Sambandar and Umapathi Sivachariar.

It was an irony that the elder Arulnandi Sivam, the family priest of Achuttakalappalar, Meikandar's father should become a disciple of the boy St. Meikandar himself. As a matter of fact it was Arulnandi Sivachariar then known by his original name Sahalagama pandithar of Thiruthuraiyur who had in a way prophesied the birth of Meikandar.

Meikandar was once engaged in giving a discourse interpreting his celebrated work Sivagnana. botham in Thiruvennai-nallur. More or less simultaneously Arulnandi

Sivam who had just then come to the place was holding his discourse in another part of the town. He was particularly perturbed over the dwindling of his audience day by day. Soon he found out that the cause for the meagre attendance for his discourse was the boy Meikandar who seemed to exercise a magnetic spell over the people as evidenced by their presence in large numbers for the latter's discourse.

Sahalagama Pandithar proceeded to the place of Meikandar's lecture in a palanquin and assumed an indifferent posture as the very embodiment of egoism. While Meikandar began to explain the true nature of Anavamalam (the impurity of egoism), Sahalagama-pandithar intervened and asked Meikandar, "What is the characteristic of Anavamalam?" The young boy silently pointed with his finger at the Pandithar himself standing in front of him as the very personification of egoism. The Pandithar instantly understood his folly and prostrated headlong before the young boy and became the latter's first disciple getting the Dikshanamam Arulnandi Sivam.

The Sivagnana Siddhiyar of Arulnandi Sivachariar the biggest of the fourteen shastras of Saiva Siddhanta elaborates upon (Continued on page 2)

DO IT AND THEN SAY IT

Even if it be a technique well-known in the tactics of politicians on the eve of a General Election, the declaration by Cabinet Ministers that employment of several thousands of unemployed graduates and others will be effected in the course of the year affords a sigh of relief to many. However we are compelled to demand for an explanation from the Authorities for the delay in the appointment of Pupil Teachers for which purpose examinations were held and interviews conducted several months ago. Mere proposals for the solving of the problem of unemployment if not acted upon will be meaningless as empty promises. The Party in Power can ill-afford to be charged with political hypocrisy at the tail-end of its five year term. The continued existence of the problem of unemployment in all its cruel grip is a convenient handle to the Opposition to stir a feeling of hostility towards the Government. Unless immediate steps are taken by the Government to recruit officers for existing vacancies and to make new appointments such as Pupil Teachers and Assistants for Teaching English, the National Government would stand exposed to the scathing criticism that there has been a serious negligence of duty and responsibility and run the risk of being rejected lock, stock and barrel at the General Election.

There is hardly any time for suggesting schemes of relief; relief must be granted and that forthwith. The rising cost of living could not be stemmed by the spectacular increase in the production of paddy. In such difficult circumstances the
