The Arabs who have had connections not only with Ceylon but India also for over 2000 years. have been referred to by the celebrated German historian and geographer as seafaring people who from time immemorial monopolised the whole carrying trade of the Indian ocean and continued in undisturbed possession till the advent of the Pertuguese.

It should also be appreciated that from the 8th century A. D. to about the 16th century A. D. their trading activities spread from the East across the Mediterranean to the Atlantic sea board.


