NAVALAR PANIKAL-- AN ASSESSMENT

(Continued from last issue)

In Navalar Panikal the author has touched on the diverse talents of Navalar. We are made to understand that Navalar was a top-line religious leader-orator writer of text books and translator, a sponsor of Tamil representatives to the Legislative Council and even a pioneer colonist. Though we feel sorry that Navalar's attempt to be a prosperous colonist were not successful we feel indebted to him that he wanted to be a colonist not to earn much but really to help Jaffna in the matter of rice needs. Men of deep learning are rarely successful business men but Navalar had shrewd business sense too for he planned to raise capital for the farming venture from sale of valuable timber which had to be rid of before farming operations could begin.

I think Navalar's sponsorship of Mr. P. Ramathan (late Sir) to the Legislative Council has been touched upon in earlier works on Navalar but a detailed account (in English) interspersed with intelligent observations by the author can be found only in Navalar Panikal. The author of Navalar Panikal has taken great pains to paint beautifully with carefully chosen words that Navalar was the architect behind Mr. P. Ramathan's success. One finds that Navalar was as fine a political strategist as any to be found in any country where the Parliamentary system operates. From other chapters in the book we learn that Navalar was a man of high standing in the community who was consulted by the demi-God of provincial Government service—the Government Agent of the day where social service measures were concerned.

The data in Navalar Panikal is historically

authentic. The author has relied on contemporary newspapers as a main source of his information. Even if this be so the author's originality lies in the choice of matter from the source and intelligent comment on some here and there. Whenever sources have been consulted they have been duly acknowledged in the form of footnotes etc. The opening chapter is bi-lingual (English and Tamil) a condition dictated to by the nature of the matter treated and there is another chapter in English—Navalar chooses a Tamil representative. It so happens that the author (Mr. S. T.) had earlier written a series of erudite articles on Navalar to the Hindu Organ and இந்துசாதனம் (during the latter half of 1968) and has found it worthwhile to include revised versions of some of these in his book. As அக்கனாப்பு (addenda?) there is a chapter in English entitled 'Navalar appeals for state aid'. In this we find Navalar's efforts to make up through state grant what couldn't be done through voluntary aid from fellow citizens, for his educational ventures. On page nine of this addenda the author adds an assessment of Navalar which is a fine summing up estimate of the greatness of Navalar as an educationist and a fine winding up piece to the book is. State aid has ultimately led to full state control today in the sphere of education and we cannot help sympathizing with Navalar when he appealed for state aid without strings attached.

Navalar Panikal rouses the hope that in course of time a detailed authoritative biography of Navalar would appear on the book-market and one cannot help wishing that Mr. S. T. is highly com-

petent in English and Tamil and beside has mastered the principles of historical research. A historical work should not only inform but should also put the record straight. Among other things Mr. S. T. in the course of this year addressed a highly educated audience at the C.I.S.T.R auditorium at Buller's road on Navalar and the manner in which he held the attention of the audience for about two hours without using even a scrap of notes deeply impressed Mr. James T. Ratnam who acknowledged this in an article in the Times week-end months back. Again in biographies of great Englishmen authors do not spare details about human weaknesses in the subject. Englishmen of a later era always accept it as normal that great figures of an earlier era should have frailties for in a sense it reduces the gap between great men of the past and humbler folks of the present. Even Royalty of an earlier vintage is not spared by English biographers in this connection. Coming back to Navalar Panikal we are deeply indebted to Mr. S. T. for the opening chapter in the book which gives us a glimpse of the inquisitive spirit in student prodigy அருமுகவன் who later became Arumuga Navalar. We would like to know more about Navalar's childhood especially as to what distinguished him from other children of his neighbourhood besides intellectual brilliance. Again a good many Victorian aristocrat were highly educated and recognised lay-patrons of poets and artists. They lived aloof from humbler folk. What sort of person was Navalar in his private and social life. Was he one who in high fashion told others what to do or set about to things himself or was he one who was easily accessible to the illiterate humbler folk? Was he intolerant of intellectual mediocrity? Did he lose his temper very often? What books or forces influenced his life at an impressionable age. If instead of spon-

The Swami, who was listening to the song, was completely over-whelmed by the under-lying spiritual meaning. That woman and her meaningful song, had at once reminded him that the same Divinity dwells in the high and the low, the rich and the poor, the good and the bad, throughout the entire creation.

Speaking of this incident sometime later, the Swami had said:-

"That incident removed the scales from my eyes, seeing that all are indeed the manifestations of the One, I could no longer condemn anybody or discriminate between the high and the low or the Saint and the sinner."
